## Water Injection Bill <br> Passes In State Legislation

Generally, if you have income, with no tax withheld, of more than $\$ 500$ and you expect to owe at least $\$ 300$ on this year's return, you are liable for filing a declaration of estimated tax and for making payments. Just like withholding by employers, the IRS says, estimated taxes are paid in advance of the actual tax return, Form 1040, due for the year. Estimated taxes are normally paid in four installments. For 1983, the four estimated tax installment dates are: April 15, 1983; June 15, 1983; September 15, 1983 ;
