Counselor Encourages Unemployed

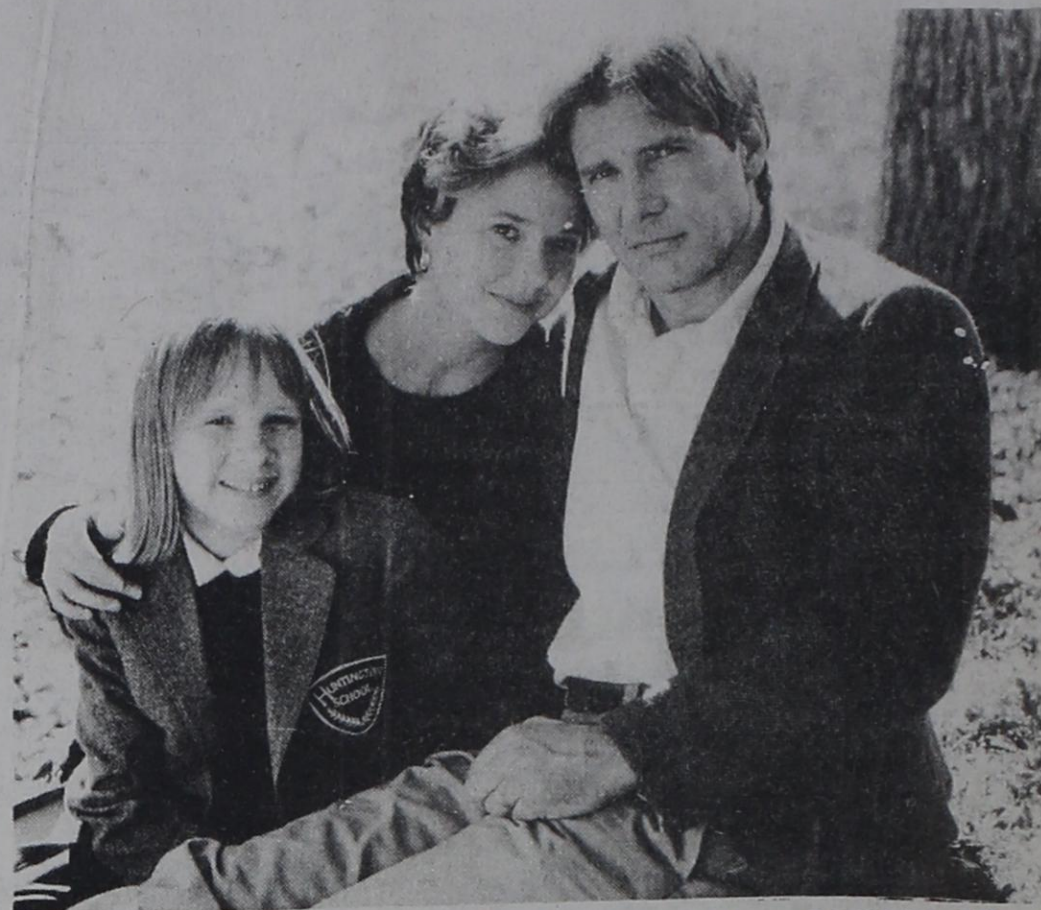
While a soft economy has left thousands of Texans standing in the unemployment line, many of those looking for a job don't go about it correctly, explained a Texas Christian University career counselor.

"Searching for employment gets down to using smart jobseeking skills, and most people don't use them," said Career Planning and Placement Director Carolyn Ulrickson.

The 17-year veteran of career counseling noted that smart actions include writing a cover letter, which reinforces strong points in a resume, and targeting resumes to potential employers for whom you are truly qualified to work. Ulrickson also said to tell friends and acquaintances of the job search, especially ones who come in contact with a lot of people.

Those who lose a job experience the stages of grief, according to Ulrickson. "They get into that anger phase where they are saying 'I'm going to show them - I'm going to get a better job than I've ever had.' Oftentimes that may not be possible, she said.

Laid-off workers may look for a carbon copy of their old job with a competitor, she explained. However, the competitor may be having trouble as well. Ulrickson suggested looking at those skills that would be useful to a variety of employers.

Pharmacy Topics

Sufferers of Gaucher's disease improved greatly when given doses of the enzyme lacking in those with the genetic disease, say researchers at the National Institutes of Health, in Bethesda, Maryland. The Food and Drug Administration is expected to approve the treatment soon.

Young women who do not ovulate with each period may be at increased risk of osteoporosis, the New England Journal of Medicine reports. Stress and too much exercise may be the cause; progesterone supplements may be the cure.

Very-low-fat diets that included lots of lean red meats were effective in lowering cholesterol - especially the "bad" LDLs - in research at Deakin University in Geelong, Australia.

Vitamin deficiency may leave a person at risk of emphysema and bronchitis. A Johns Hopkins University study found that a lack of vitamin A seems to affect the growth and development of oxygen pathways to the lungs, much as smoking does.

First aid for a knocked-out tooth calls for careful handling. Pick it up by the crown, not the root, then keep it in a cup of milk until you get to the dentist.

In the summer of 1991 Dale Stewart was commissioned by Dr. Robert Spence to sculpt Bill Irwin, the 55 year old blind man who was hiking the 2,100 Apalachian Trail. He began in March and ended the hike in November.

Dr. Spence sent photographs and a video of Irwin hiking the trail. From this information Dale Stewart was able to sculpt the hiker and his seeing-eye dog Orient.

The bronze was presented to Bill Irwin as he completed the trail about Thanksgiving of 1990. Bronze artist Dale Stewart was not present at the time so Bill Irwin requested to meet him.

A reception was arranged by Dr. Spence in Waco on August 27, 1991. Bill Irwin and his dog Orient were in their best form greeting various doctors of the area and artist Dale Stewart, his wife Ruth and Mr. and Mrs. Wade Cowan, owners of the Hoka Hey Foundry in Dublin.

Stewart's sculpture 'Blind Courage' and a painting of oil on canvas entitled 'Journey of Faith' by Bruce Greene were on display during the reception.

After the reception Dr. Robert Spence took the Stewarts and the Cowans to the Medical Heritage Art Gallery housed in the W.R.S. Group building in Waco.

Several other sculptures by Dale Stewart were visible: 'Fetchin' the Doc', a little boy and a country doctor on a fast horse; 'Danny's Sore Throat', a boy having his throat checked; 'Snake Bite', a cowboy first aid cure; 'Go for It', a cerebral palsied boy with a helmet about to descend on a slide; and a bronze plaque

entitled 'The Manual Reduction of a Dislocated Shoulder', an operation performed in the Middle Ages.

There were many other art forms relating to the medical profession in the gallery.

The Stewarts especially enjoyed meeting Bill Irwin and his well-trained dog Orient. Mr. Irwin is a counselor with a gentle and caring expression.

Mailing Lists Made From A Multitude Of Sources

While junk mail comes from a multitude of sources, contacting one organization can reduce the volume of mail received, explained a Texas Christian University marketing professor.

"It's staggering how much information is available on you," said Mr. Shannon Shipp. He noted one mailing list vendor that sells lists providing great detail on the solicited person.

"The company has lists which you just couldn't imagine — lists of all the people that live in the Northeast that have incomes of over \$50,000 and who have purchased a major appliance within the last two years," Shipp outlined.

The data are collected from a variety of sources including such public records as state driver's license and motor vehicle registration.

Making automobile and drivers' license data public record has the consequence of making it available to direct marketers, Shipp said. "If people don't want that information to be available, they're going

to have to work through their legislators to make that information not a matter of public record," he said.

Shipp suggested a more immediate way to reduce the tide of solicitations is by writing to the Direct Marketing Association. This voluntary association of direct marketers registers requests to be removed from mailing lists.

Before a DMA member makes a solicitation, it compares its list with the one of those who have been asked to be removed. Names appearing on the DMA list are removed from member's list.

Shipp stressed that DMA membership is voluntary and not all solicitations will cease. He said, however, that writing to the DMA can reduce the flow of direct mail.

Former Speaker Wright To Give 15 Lectures At TCU

After 17 terms in the U.S. House, former Speaker Jim Wright is adding the title of professor to his resume with a class he's teaching this fall at Texas Christian University.

Wright will present 15 lectures for a political science class called "Congress and the Presidents." More than 120 students have enrolled.

"I was wondering at the beginning if I would have enough material to last a full semester's course," Wright said during a news conference before the first class. But I began to put lecture notes together and

decided that wasn't going to be the problem. The problem is that I'm not going to have enough time

Wright plans to discuss his experiences as a congressman serving with every U.S. president since Dwight D. Eisenhower. His lecture topics will range from the budget process to confrontations between the Congress and the president.

Wright noted that he wants students to be comfortable with a world of ideas in which other people may be right. "If I could encourage them to develop a habit of think-

ing for themselves, then would feel I have done something worthwhile," Wright commented.

Another priority on Wright's list for the class is encouraging students to read. In addition to the two class texts, he listed 25 books in the course bibliography as background reading for the class.

"I worry that we're not reading enough these days," Wright said, lamenting that television is becoming a substitute for reading. "The written word is the only means by which one generation can communicate with other generations."

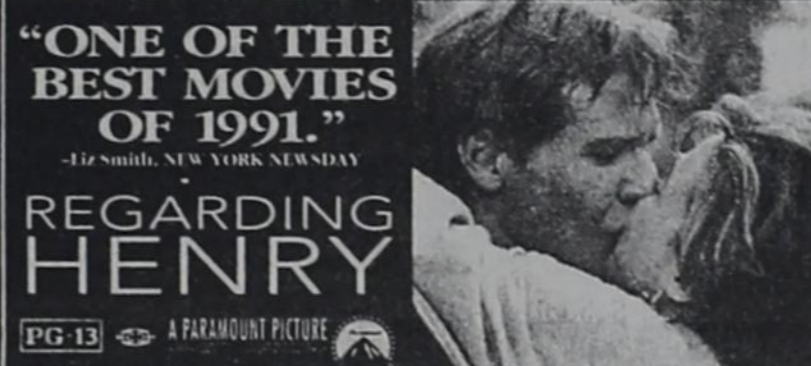

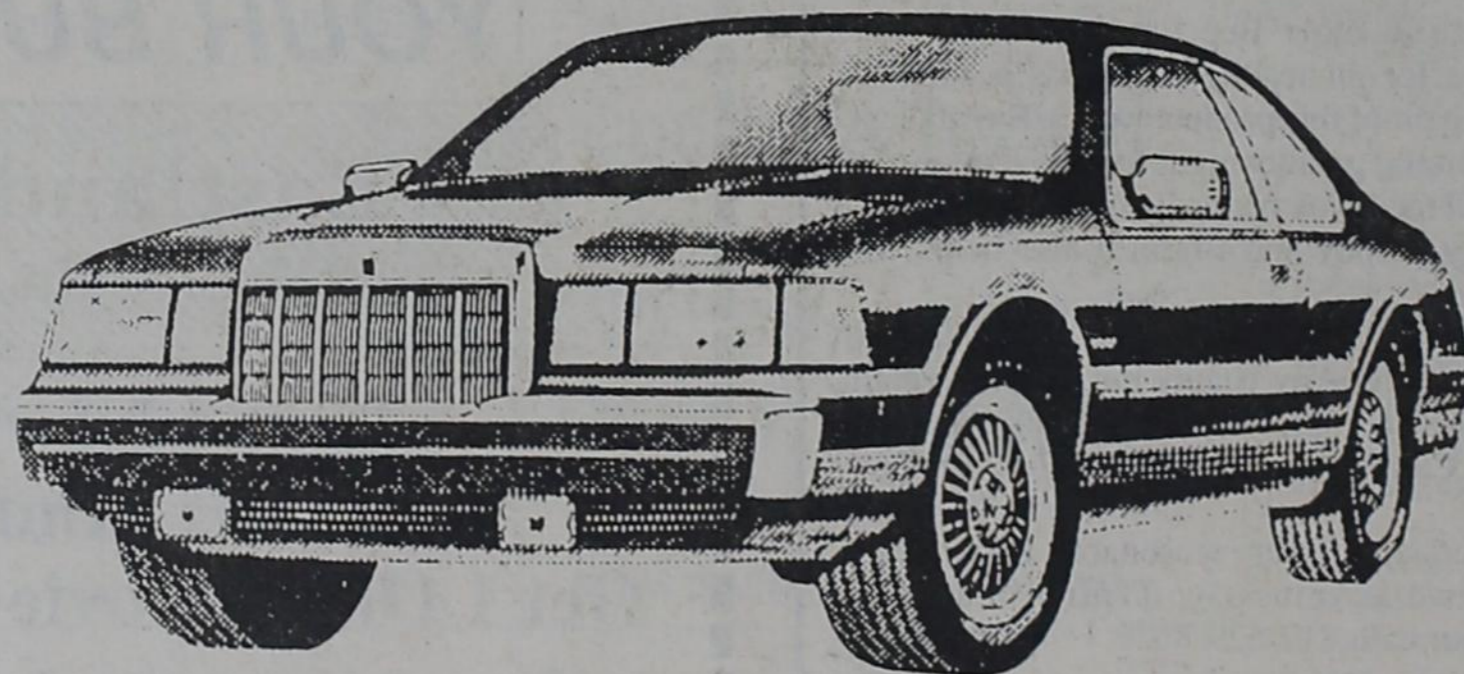
