Those celebrating birthdays in November are Rada King and myself, Rilla Richburg.



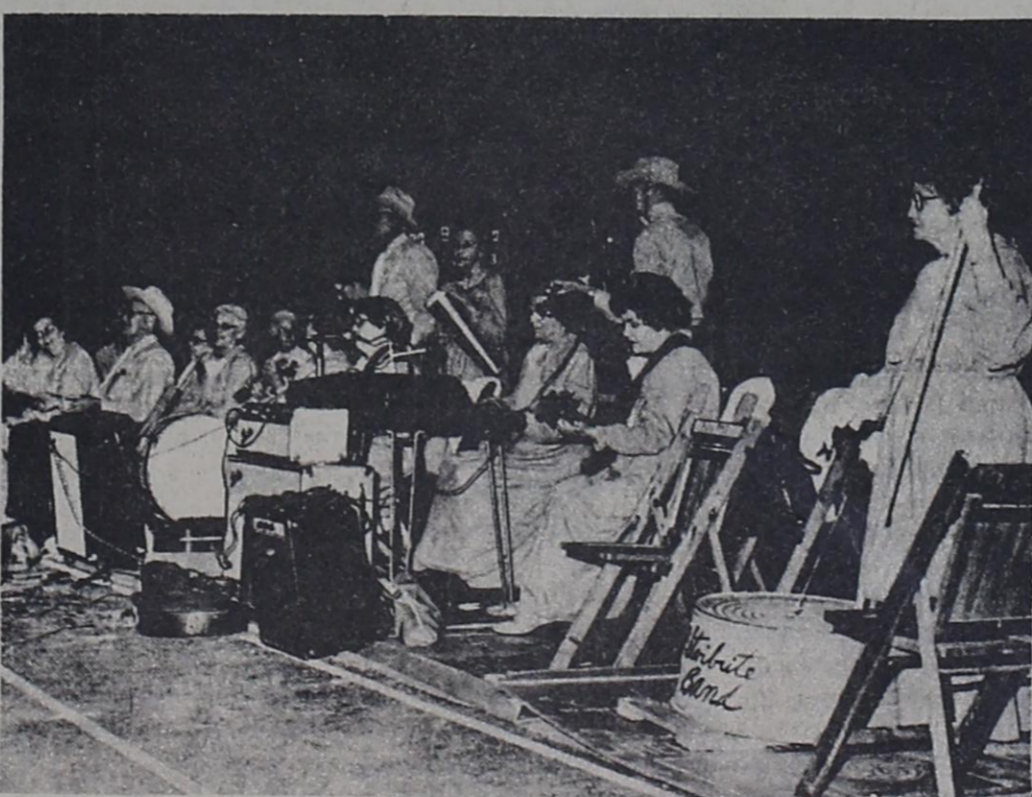

### Holiday Tips On Mail Order Buying

1. Examine the offer carefully. If it sounds too good to be true, it often is. Beware of exaggerated claims on products or price. If the claims relate to your health or physical appearance, your family doctor may be a good source of advice as to the likely value of the product. Be particularly wary of claims by unknown sellers that they have achieved a "scientific discovery" that somehow eluded the big companies or established professionals. Read advertising claims for what they actually say rather than what you might hope they offer.
2. Do not rely solely on a picture of the item. Note the description, size, weight, color, and contents. Be sure to completely describe the article or service you are purchasing in the order.
3. Give explicit instructions.

4. When ordering holiday gifts by mail be sure to do so well in advance to avoid heavy seasonal mail volume. If the company offers such a service, be sure to specify whether or not the gift should be sent directly to the recipient. Clearly indicate recipient's name and address and how the gift card should be signed.
5. Look for a company policy on returns. If the policy is not stated, ask for it.
6. If a substitute is acceptable, indicate it.
7. Be sure to enclose shipping, handling, or tax charges with the order.
8. Do not send cash with the order. Pay only by check, money order, or, if acceptable, credit card.
9. Keep a record of the order, including the name and address of the company with which you are dealing.
10. If there are any doubts about a company, check it before placing an order. You might be guided on a company's reliability by inquiries to the Better Business Bureau and Chamber of Commerce in the area of the company, or you can consult your state or local consumer protection office. Because a product is advertised in a responsible newspaper or magazine, do not assume the claims have necessarily been verified by the publishers. In most cases, the publishers have no choice but to assume the advertiser is honest. Similarly,

the fact that a product is offered for sale by mail does not mean the Postal Service has verified the advertiser's claims.

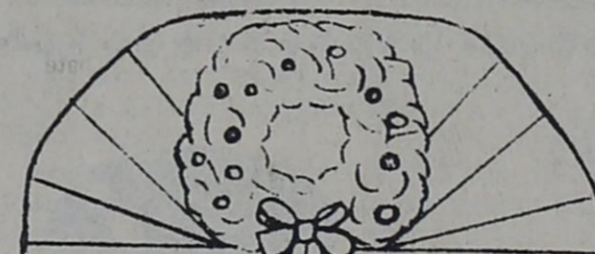

## MIDDLE CHILDREN

Middle children learn early to become diplomats, the specialist continues.

They learn to compete for attention from both parents and other siblings, thus developing extraordinary skills in handling others.

The major drawback in being a middle child is that he may never be adequately recognized nor rewarded for personal or family accomplishments.

## YOUNGEST

The youngest child is seldom expected to become the achiever, so the family loves him just for himself, she explains.

He is never threatened by other children displacing him as the "darling" in the family.

Therefore, the youngest child is usually the happy, fun-lover of the children.

## PARENTAL TREATMENT

Because of the uniqueness of each child, parents treat each child in special ways that are appropriate for that individual, Miss Taylor advises.

No one birth order position seems to be better or worse than any other.

It's not whether a child is born first or last, rather it's what the child and parents do to highlight the advantages and lessen the disadvantages of the child's family position that affect his life successes, she adds.

They are usually joyously welcomed and have undivided attention of parents.

Firstborn are also the group that is expected to become the achievers in the family—a goal some may or may not be able to fulfill.

Consequently, firstborn children are the group that seek psychological help most often because of pressures to succeed.

Only children are usually achievement-oriented but do not lose their center-stage position with parents to other children in the family.

Thus, the need to shine is not as consuming as with firstborns.

# Wood - Burning

In scores of American households this winter, the snug atmosphere around the family's wood-burning stove will be broken by a thundering roar, a shaking, red-hot stove pipe and immediate danger to family and belongings.

A chimney fire! It usually results from the build up of a sooty substance called creosote inside the chimney. "When a chimney fire occurs, three actions are crucial," advised Donald Mann, fire safety engineer for Aetna Life & Casualty. "Call the fire department. Close all air inlets and dampers. And don't throw water on a hot stove. That could crack the stove and cause a second fire."

Chimney fires, according to Mann, are only one of the risks of using or installing a wood-burning stove improperly. "There are a lot of mistakes the inexperienced stove owner can make," Mann said. "Like disposing of ashes in paper bags, or other combustible containers, putting your stove on an unprotected wood floor, using a stove pipe that's too small or cheaply constructed — those things might not cause a fire right away, but they probably will eventually. The risk is serious."

According to the National Fire Data Center, heating systems burning solid fuel (wood or coal), are associated with about 49,000 home fires each year, involving about 250 fatalities, 290 serious injuries and more than \$110 million in direct property losses each year.

If you have a wood-burning stove — or are thinking about buying one — it's essential to consider proper installation. Check with local building authorities before putting in your stove, even if this is not required in your town. You will probably get cost-and time-saving advice on materials, space requirements, suppliers and workmanship. And arrange for an inspection after your stove is installed.

Mann emphasized that stove owners should follow installation instructions to the letter. "Above all, don't try to short-cut the manufacturer's directions, don't skimp on clearances from walls and floors, and don't count on word of mouth advice from other stove owners." Covering a wall with aluminum foil, for example, does not make it non-combustible.

Making the Stove Pipe a Good Connection

Stove owners should follow detailed instructions, available from the manufacturer or retailer, to be sure that stove pipe dimensions and materials are adequate. Ordinarily, Mann explained, the pipe should not pass through a wall or ceiling. "If you must go through a combustible wall, you'll have to allow an 18 inch clearance all around the pipe. Or, you can use a section of approved factory-built chimney."

As for hooking the stove pipe to masonry chimney, you'll need to extend the connector through the masonry wall of the chimney to the inner face of the flue liner (not beyond), and cement it to the masonry. It's important to use high-temperature cement.

Remember that every stove needs a damper or draft regulator to help control combustion. If yours is automatic, be sure it's installed according to the manufacturer's instructions.

## The Chimney

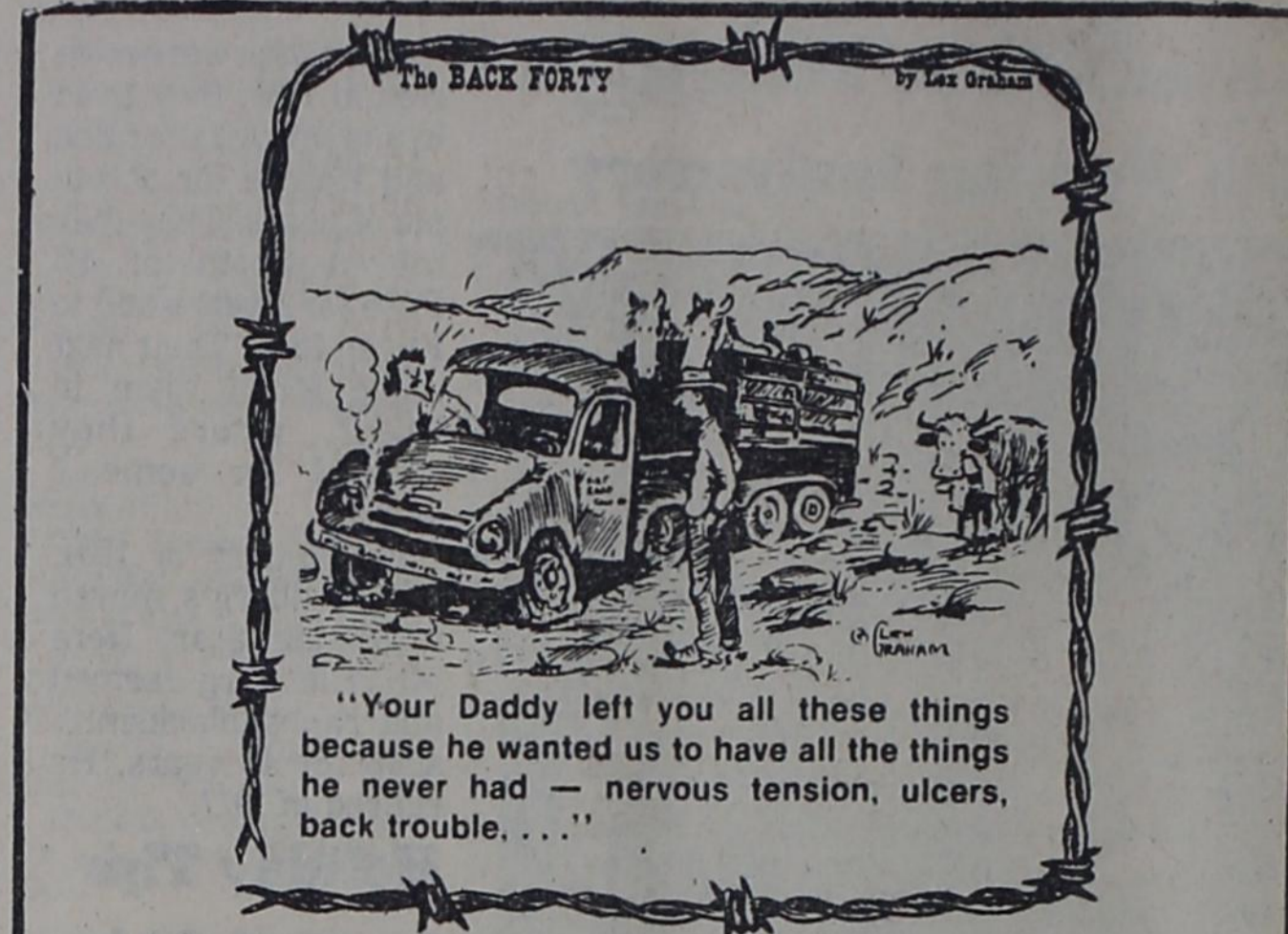
Your chimney should be inspected before installing your stove and annually thereafter. If you are buying a factory-built chimney, be sure it has recognized testing laboratory approval. If you are connecting to an existing fireplace chimney, you must seal off the chimney below the stove pipe's point of entry to prevent toxic gases from coming into the room. Mann added that it's dangerous to connect more than one heating device to a single flue.

As for chimney maintenance, remember that creosote residue accumulates on a relatively cool chimney lining and, when ignited, causes an extremely dangerous fire. To prevent creosote build-up, maintain a moderate fire — hot enough to prevent a cool flue liner, but no so hot that it ignites creosote already formed.

Burn only dry, well-seasoned hardwood. (Green wood produces large amounts of creosote and is especially dangerous in an "air-tight" stove; trash is highly flammable and will produce a sudden, hot fire.)

Above all, never start a fire with gasoline, kerosene or other flammable liquids. And don't use artificial logs in your stove. The gases generated could cause an explosion.

To melt small amounts of creosote on your flue lining, burn your stove hot once a day, for about 30 minutes. Don't make this your first fire of the day — the sudden

heat could crack your stove or ignite the creosote residue.

However conscientious you are in day-to-day habits, it's still necessary to have your chimney inspected each fall for creosote.

Inspections should be more frequent — as often as once a month — if you have been burning green wood or suspect a creosote build-up.

## Safe — And Sensible

Although the precaution may seem obvious, Fuller said many people fail to keep clothing, log noops and other combustible materials at least three feet away from the stove. Parents should also remember that a wood-burning stove does not look "hot" to a small child. Mark off an area surrounding the stove which is "off limits" to small fry.

"A wood-burning stove is an excellent way to save on your fuel bills," Mann concluded. "My family has one and we get a lot of pleasure out of it. But we realize it's not a toy — it has to be treated with respect."

## Buy A Texas Grown Christmas Tree

Don't just buy any Christmas tree this year —

buy a Texas grown Christmas tree.

"While the supply of Texas Christmas trees is still short, more and more of them are coming on the market," points out James W. Chandler of Overton, area forester with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, Texas A&M University System. "Some 30,000 should be ready for market this year," he predicts.

"There are some 225 Christmas tree growers in Texas at present with about 1,350 acres in production. At 900 to 1,000 trees per acre, that's more than a million trees," he says.

Most trees are being grown in East Texas and are Virginia pines, notes Chandler. A few tree farms are also being established in central and western areas with the variety Pinus edularica which is more tempered to drought conditions.

According to the forester, many trees were lost to drought this past summer, even where intensive management was carried out.

"Christmas tree plantations need plenty of care and management," emphasizes Chandler. "Trees usually reach market size in three to five years and may be sold wholesale to civic groups and other retail outlets or on a choose-and-cut basis."

Texas-grown Christmas trees offer a lot of advantages over those shipped in from the Great Lake States and the Pacific Northwest, says the forester. These advantages are mainly freshness, fragrance and novelty. Most trees shipped to Texas have to be cut about two months earlier while

Texas trees can be cut only a short time before being offered for sale.

"Some 5 million Christmas trees are sold in Texas each year," says Chandler. "This represents more than \$50 million in sales. As Texas production increases, Texas-grown trees will take a larger portion of these sales."

**1981 To Be Good Year For Livestock Producers**

While 1980 will go down in the record books as a tough year for most agricultural producers, 1981 offers hope, especially for those in the livestock industry.

"Livestock prices show solid increases next year due to lower total meat production and improved con-

sumer demand," believes Dr. Ed Uvacek, livestock marketing economist with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, Texas A&M University System.

Cash receipts from livestock and livestock products totaled \$69 billion last year in the U.S., 52 percent of all farm and ranch in-

come, notes Uvacek. In Texas 1979 cash receipts from livestock and livestock products surpassed \$4.3 billion, or more than 55 percent of all agricultural income in the state.

Livestock cash receipts for 1980 will be down some from the 1979 level due primarily to reduced cattle feedlot activity.

"Retail demand for all meat products should be much improved in 1981," contends Uvacek. "Economic recovery in the business segment should help considerably. Somewhat reduced inflation will also be helpful although that may focus attention on the inevitable higher meat

prices. That, in itself, could stimulate consumer resistance or, even worse, might lead to government price controls."

While the new year should be a boon for some segments of the livestock industry, not all will share equally in the prosperity. Cow-calf operators should fare well in 1981, but

meat packers, stocker operators and feedlots may find the going a little tough, predicts the economist.

## Re-appraisal Of Property Is Mandatory

Pursuant to Senate Bill 621 enacted by the last regular session of the Texas Legislature, it is mandatory for all Taxing entities within the state to do a re-appraisal of the properties in each county by 1982 and Senate Bill 621 requires a review of the values in each entity in each county within the state every 5 years thereafter. Additionally, the law requires the Agricultural Value on agricultural lands be reviewed each and every year and the possibility exists that the agricultural value on farm and ranch lands could change yearly. The law also requires two values on all agricultural lands, the market value and the productivity value.

In view of the rising cost to do re-appraisals, due to the demand for experienced firms and the inflation factors relative to cost, the Board of Directors of the Eastland County Re-appraisal District decided it would be a wise move and a savings to the taxpayer to proceed with the re-appraisal as required by Senate Bill 621, where the program would be implemented in early 1982. McMorries and Company has been employed and awarded a contract to do the re-appraisal of all of the properties in Eastland County for the tax year 1982. This company is also employed to do Foard County, King County, Dickens County, Crosby County, Briscoe County, Hall County, Floyd County, Lynn County, Cochran County, Hutchinson County, Cottle County, Castro County, Coke County, and Hockley County, and for 22 years has done from 85% to 90% of the re-appraisal work done in the West Texas area.

Mr. McMorries has assured us the values will be reasonable, that equity will be obtained in this re-appraisal program, and that the program will meet all of the requirements of the State.

The contract price is a turn-key total not a percentage of the value or a commission; in other words, McMorries and Company will be paid only the contract price and the company will provide all labor and materials to complete the job.

There will be many questions asked throughout the program: What is the company supposed to do in this re-appraisal program?

The company will inspect each and every parcel of property in the county, each improvement of value will be measured and graded, consideration being given for the type of construction, age, condition, location etc., all

rural lands will be inspected and graded by the use of an 8 grade classing system of the type used by the Soil Conservation Service, cultivated and pasture lands will be noted on soil maps on each tract of land, and irrigation will be a consideration in the final value.

Will the appraisers see all owners? The appraisers will attempt to talk to all owners, the appraisers will definitely inspect every parcel of property, however, "in our 22 years in the business, we find it impossible to see every owner when enumerating the properties," McMorries stated.

In case the appraiser does not get to talk to the owner when he comes by to measure and classify the property, what can the owner do to insure he is getting fair and equitable consideration? When the appraiser calls at home or business, he will have a business card showing the company name and the appraiser's name, the appraiser will present the business card to the person answering the door, this is for identification purposes, the appraiser will state his name and business, ask some questions about the improvements, land or irrigation, then ask permission to measure and inspect the improvements and property. In the event the owner is not at home, a card will be left in the door. In the event the owner wishes to talk to the appraiser, he may call the Tax Office, leaving his name and phone number, the appraiser will within a few days return the call; and if the owner desires, will make an appointment to come back and talk to the owner. "We recognize that this program belongs to the taxpayers," McMorries stated, "and we want to be as accurate as possible. We definitely will work with the property owners to insure equal and uniform values, and attempt to answer all questions."

Will a property owner have an opportunity to see his values before they become final? Yes. A letter will be mailed to each owner in about April 1982, stating a time and place where an owner can meet with the appraiser. At this time, he can review the values put on his property and also review the values placed on other properties. Then if an owner feels his property is not valued equitably and desires, he can ask for a recheck of the property. If the appraiser finds that an error has been made, he will correct the values; if the appraiser feels the value is equal to other comparable properties, he will tell the

owner. Then if the owner desires he may meet later with the local Board of Equalization comprised of local property owners.

Will taxes be increased as a result of re-appraisal? No, not necessarily. In fact, some properties may reduce in value. All will depend upon the facts found relative to value in the jurisdictions. The intent of the re-appraisal program is not to raise taxes, only to equalize taxes. McMorries stated, the Constitution and laws of the State require an equal and uniform tax base. It is unlawful and morally wrong to tax a property worth only \$10,000.00 the same as a property worth \$30,000.00. The only thing the re-appraisal program will do is to provide the jurisdiction with an equal and uniform tax base and the total results will not be known until about October, 1981.

Will properties be valued at its cost when purchased or when built? No, the law requires that all properties be valued equal and uniform in accordance with the current market value of the property as of January 1st of the year. In this case, January 1, 1982. As an example: a home built in 1935 with 1000 square feet of living area cost \$3,500.00 when built in 1935; however, today it would sell on the market for the sum of \$12,000.00. Therefore, the property cannot be legally valued at its original cost. Take a home built today that cost \$30,000.00. It would be valued to value this home at more than \$30,000.00 when it would only sell for \$30,000.00; and leave the home built in 1935 at the \$3,500.00, when it would sell for \$12,000.00 on the open market in Eastland County. The same percent of market value must be built into the schedules of value to be used in the re-appraisal program to insure equal and uniform values as required by law.

Will 100% values be used as the tax base? Yes, the 100% appraised value will be used as the tax base. The new law requires all jurisdictions to use 100% assessment ratio by the year 1981.

Will the appraisers be qualified? Yes, no appraiser will work on this job that has not evidenced at least 5 years of experience in the mass appraisal business and will be no less than 30 years of age.

Will all property owners be given the same considerations? McMorries stated that it did not make him any difference who the property owner was, how much money he had or how much property he owned. Every owner will be given the same considerations. That is, be-

ing fair and reasonable in all considerations to obtain just and equal values regardless of the circumstance or pressures. "We have no axes to grind. Every taxpayer looks the same to us and no property owner will be given special consideration. We must take this position to insure that equity is the end result of the program."

The appraisers will begin the field work in early December 1980. When the appraiser calls at your home or business, he will ask some questions but unless the owner desires he will not need to enter the home. If the appraiser feels that there is a need to make an inside inspection of a home, he will then ask permission to look at the inside of the improvement. He will not need to go into every room of the residence; the living area and the kitchen will tell the appraiser what he needs to know about the residence, under no circumstance will the appraiser enter a home unless an adult male is at home and permission is granted.

Will there be a permanent record card provided on every parcel of property? Yes, there will be a permanent record card provided the entities on each and every parcel of real estate in the district. The card will show a scaled drawing of all improvements that has any value and the dimensions of each building; it will show the type of construction, concrete foundation, brick exterior, etc.; it will provide the square footage of each building and the schedule cost and depreciation. The schedules will be prepared based on local information. The land values will be shown by either a front door or per acre value. These records are public records and each owner may see his appraisal card and also his neighbor's appraisal card.

The appraiser will not know what value will be finally placed on the property when he is making the inspection. The appraiser is only gathering information classifying the land, measuring the building and classifying them for use in calculating the final value of the property.

McMorries stated that he and his employees welcome any and all information and suggestions from the owner and "our people will be cooperative and open minded at all times."
