The new pavement has a 24 -foot traffic lane with eight feet of paved shoulder on either side, making a total of 40 feet of surfacing. Within the limits of Rising Star, however, this is inween the approach and the vicinity of the High school. The grade of the new highway over the approach is slightly more than the 1.9 percent accomplished on other out-of-city construction. The presence of residential structures along the route limited the depth acheive a flatter acheive a flatter grade, Mr. Fox explained. The Sabanno and Yellow Branch streams about six miles north of Rising Satr presented the most difficult problem in grade reduction. hazardous also the most hazardous segment of sharply peaked hills and rapid descent to the water courses approached four or five percent in grade, and shortened vision combined with the narrowness of the pavement was responsible for many traffic accidents, no
them fatal.
Reduction was ac complished by cutting down the elevations into fills at lower levels. By lifting the new road farther

moved, the engineers said. Of significance is the fact that during the twoyear period of reconstruction no accidents of a major character occurred, so effective was the handling of emergency and temporary traffic routing.
Two bridges were rebuilt in the process
of carrying the renewof carrying the renew-
ed highway through the Sabanno basin, each of them of the width of the roadway and much wider than the hazardous struc tures they replaced.
The old highway, which was built half a century or so agowhen rock for the base was hauled in by team and wagon and broken up on the site with 18 feet of broken roadway and a doubtful six feet of gravel shoulder In contrast to those In contrast to those primitive techniques of Abilene Paving Co. employed behemoths of motorized steel that cut through impacted rock and dirt with determined ease.
Construction details of the new road called for ten inches of flex base with a two-corse
surface treatment of asphalt mix. The pavement is one of the most substantial types employed.

The completed project, measuring 9.115 miles, fills a gap between the rebuilt section south of Cisco, srossing the Leon River, and the Brown County reconstruction. With the exception of a small segment south of

all its excellence and all its excellence and happy uses, can sud-

Fox told Eastland County Newspapers that no traffic count has yet been made to compare present traffic with former volume, but that he was sure there had been an increase in the number of vehicles rebuilding.
