Touch Calling Is Coming To RS

Touch Calling Service will soon be available for Rising Star customers of Continental Telephone, reports Alan Armstrong, Customer Services Manager for the firm. Touch Calling lets the user tap out telephone numbers on pushbutton phones instead of turning the usual dial. Electronic call pro-


