Eastland County Sale of Crude Oil and Gas Set At \$48.8 Million

THE SALE OF CRUDE OIL AND NATURAL GAS from Eastland County wells in 1980 boosted the county economy and accounted for \$48.8 million of the \$31.2 billion value placed on Texas production last year.

In a report on the economic impact of oil and gas industry operations in the top producing counties of Texas, Dallas-based Texas Mid-Continent Oil & Gas Association said the county ranked 123rd among Texas' 254 counties on the basis of the value of its marketed petroleum production. This includes condensate and casinghead gas.

The county's wells produced 1.2 million barrels of crude oil, valued at \$26.4 million, and 15.1 million Mcfs of natural gas, valued at \$22.4 million. Owners of royalty in the county received \$6.1 million as their share of the output, the

Association said.

duction in Texas declined slightly last year from 1979 levels, we in the industry are encouraged by the fact that drilling starts in 1980 were up 16 percent over the previous year," said the Association's chairman, Avery Rush Jr., of Amarillo. "Since petroleum remains the cornerstone of our state's economy and its tax base, Texas must continue to encourage the development of its energy resources," Rush add-

In addition to paying local, county, and state property taxes, producers in the county

also supported state government through production tax payments estimated at \$2.9 million, according to the Association. Crude oil taxes amounted to \$1.2 million while natural gas levies totalled \$1.7 million.

Based on Texas **Employment Commis**sion figures, some 553 oil and gas industry employees in the county received wages of about \$6.6 million in

In search for new petroleum reserves in the county, oil and gas operators spent a reported \$37 million in the drilling of 377 wells including 36 wildcat, or exploratory wells. This effort resulted in the completion of 199 oil wells and 40 gas wells, although some \$2.9 million was lost in the drilling of 138 dry holes. As of March 1, 1981, there were 1292 producing in the county; 948 oil and 344 gas.

Petroleum processing also contributed to the county economy, with six natural gasoline plants, having a total capacity of 30.8 million cubic feet of natural gas in operation.

Deen settled at Sipe Springs and in 1879 moved to Rising Star. They came from Alabama.

In 1875 a party of six families came and settled here: W.W.Smith, Isaac Agnew, Dave McKinely, Allie Smith, Fletcher Fields and Andy Agnew.

In 1879 the Methodist Church was organized. Mr. and Mrs. James Irby and Dennis Bonds being the only Charter members. They met in an old log school house located on the Penn Smith place east of town. This log house was just one room, 10 x 12 feet with one, two foot square window on the north side with just a plank shutter. In the west end was a big rock fire place and a door in the south. It had a dirt floor. They had school in it in the three summer months. The teacher would barefoot come sometimes and had classes outside part of the time. The seats in the building where made of split logs call-

ed "punchin seats." A little later a plank school house was built just east of the cemetery and church was held there. There was a circuit rider preacher by the name of Lewis Chamberlain who preached a few times in 1877. Then in 1878, a Rev. Cooper preached a few times. He was also a circuit rider. Then in 1879 Lewis Chamberlain came as their first regular pastor (salary unknown).

A.K.Miller was the first presiding elder. We were in the N. W. Texas Conference and the Pecan District.

In 1880, the W.W.Anderson family arrived and opened a store. By this time, there were a number of families located here. It seems that after the Anderson's came, the church rapidly grew.

The W.P.Bucy family arrived in 1884 and settled south of town in a log house.

The first plank house was built in the early 80's by John Cooper.

It seems that the nationality of all these either Scotch, Irish, English or Dutch or a mixture of all of these.

Homemaking Hints By Janet Thomas

How do you care for the beautiful potted plants which are such popular gifts during the holiday season? We wish they would last for months and are usually unhappy when they become unattractive in only a few weeks.

These lovely flowering plants which provide so much enjoyment usually are not suited as permanent house plants. They are grown under ideal conditions in a humid greenhouse and do not take kindly to the hot, dry conditions in our homes. It is best to consider them as longlasting, cut flowers. Enjoy their beauty as long as possible, then discard them when they become unattrac-

With proper care of these flowering plants you can do much to prolong the life of their effectiveness. Try to maintain temperature of 70° F. during the day and 50-60° at night. Since our homes are often kept warmer than this, the flowers soon lose color and plants drop their foliage under these conditions and must be discarded.

tive.

A humid atmosphere is best for all house plants. You can help your plants by setting the pots on crushed stone or gravel in a pan of water. As the water evaporates it increases the humidity of the air around plants. Do not allow the water level to reach the bottom of the container or the soil will remain too wet.

Flowering plants require high light intensities. They should receive as much sun

light as possible during the day provided there isn't an excessive build-up of heat as may occur in a hot southwest window. Never locate your plants on the TV. Most TV sets will generate considerable heat and the top of your TV is often the warmest spot in the room.

Water your gift regularly as they are used to receiving adequate moisture in the greenhouse. Don't keep the soil soaked with water but do apply enough to keep it

Keep your house plants out of drafts, especially from opening doors or from heating and cooling vents. This is especially true of poinsettias. If they are located in a draft the leaves are likely to drop.

Cineraria cyclamen plants usually have a rather short blooming period. They are extremely difficult to bring into flower again unless one has excellent greenhouse facilities. It is usually best to discard these once they finish blooming as it is chaper and less frustrating to buy new plants when need-

Check with your florist or nurseryman as to whether the variety in question is suitable for outdoor planting. In general, the results are seldom satisfactory. It is usually better to purchase adapted varieties at the proper

The poinsettia is hardy only in the southern portion of Texas. Although a perennial, it can be brought back into bloom the next year only if you have appropriate facilities. They require a dormant or rest period, then cut back and allow growth throughout the summer. In early September they must be subjected to a rigid schedule of 9 hours of light followed by 15 hours of complete darkness in order to initiate flowers. Again the process is seldom worth the effort unless you are an avid gardener with greenhouse facilities. It is usually better to buy new plants each holiday season.



City Sales Tax

AUSTIN, TEXAS-State Comptroller Bob Bullock Monday sent checks totaling \$41.4 million to 802 cities as their share of the onepercent city sales tax for December.

This final payment for 1981 brought to \$656 million the total collected and returned to Texas cities during 1981. Bullock said this total is more than 17 percent over last year's \$560 million.

The December monthly payment is \$7.9 million more than the cities received during a comparable period in

The optional onepercent city sales tax is collected along with the state four-percent sales tax by merchants and businesses and is rebated each month by the Comptroller to cities where it is levied.

The City of Rising Star received \$894.09 bringing the yearly total to \$17,822.02. Last year at this time, payment was \$645.73 and total 1980 payments of \$17,822.02 for a 8.43 percent loss.

Planning Vital For '82 Peanut Crop

College Station--Peanut farmers must give careful attention to production costs, marketing and financing as they look to the 1982 crop.

Dr. Ashley Lovell, an agricultural economist, suggests a "post game" evaluation of previous peanut crops to help growers mold a successful game plan for next season.

"Look at your operation field by field or use some other measure, such as dryland versus irrigated, in your post game analysis," suggests Lovell, who is with the Texas A & M University system. "Determine which fields or systems are profitable eliminate those that are losers year in and year out."

When projecting production costs, remember that lower than average yeilds or significant increases in input prices will raise the breakeven price, adds the economist.

"If the peanut market is depressed in 1982, plan on growing peanuts in the short run as long as the price covers variable costs and no better alternative is available for the resources devoted to peanuts," Lovell advises growers.

Variable costs include expenses for items such as seed, fertilizer, insecticides, herbicides, machinery and labor.

Fixed costs are influenced by annual usage of tractors and equipment. This depends on the total acres of cropland over which the machinery is spread. Land rental economist says.

As far as financing is concerned, lenders will look closely at the peanut section of the final legislation under which the 1982 peanut crop is produced, notes Lovell.

Assuming an increase in market price risk and continuous high production costs and interest rates, producers may want to share risks with landlords, he adds. This would reduce the operating capital requirement, interest expenses and price and yield risks.

Of course, what the peanut market outlook is should be a major factor in deciding whether or not to grow peanuts in 1982, says Lovell. Again, a lot hinges on the final provisions of the anticipated new farm bill

However, marketing strategies might include forward contracting a portion of the crop to cover variable costs, studying crop reports and other supply and demand indicators, maintaining close contact with the market and what local buyers are willing to offer, and using farm

or association storage for more orderly marketing.

With careful planning in developing a sound "game plan"

peanut growers can take considerable uncertainty out of their '82 crop, believes the economist.







COLLEGE STATION--If "itemize" (use the "long form") on your tax return, 1981 is a "good" year for deductions, recommends Nancy Granovsky, a family resource management specialist.

The Economic Recovery Act of 1981 will lower tax rates for 1982, so it behooves taxpayers to take deductions before January 1, 1982, she advises.

Granovsky is on the home economics staff of Texas A & M University system.

For example, if you planned to contribute money to a favorite charity, church or educational institution anyway, do it now during 1981--IF YOU ITEMIZE, she says.

If you wait until 1982. your tax benefit on the itemized "long form" will be lower than it is this year.

That's because tax rates will drop 10 percent from 1980 ratesstarting January 1,

you file the "short form," there's reason to wait until 1982. That's when you'll be

tion will be the same as for people who file the "long form." 1982 marks the first time people who file the "short form" will

donations are tax deductible, Granovsky reminds taxpayers. Some groups, such as lobbying groups, do not fit the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) definition "charities" though the groups themselves may have

"tax-exempt" status. When you donate money to these groups, the donations are not tax deductions for you.

If in doubt about the tax status of any group-or a donation's "tax deductibility" check with the IRS, the specialist says.

Because the IRS will expect proof of your contributions, you should pay by check or get a receipt whenever possible, she adds.




