

TSCRA Supports **New Game Law**

Ed Small, attorney in Austin for the Texas and Southwestern Cattle Raisers Association, appeared before a recent meeting in San Angelo of the board of directors of TSCRA. Small reported that under new laws the penalty for criminal trespass has been increased to a Class B misdemeanor with a maximum fine of \$1,000 and up to one year in jail, or both.

If the trespasser carries a deadly weapon, the offense will be a Class A misdemeanor, punishable by a fine up to \$2,000 with the same fine, or both.

A fence obviously designed to contain livestock would serve notice that entry was forbidden.

Another law would allow county courts in addition to justice courts to hear game law violations.

Landowners were advised to report trespassers to the local game warden or sheriff.



Homemaking Hints **By Janet Thomas**

Everyone loves a pretty landscape with colorful plants and flowers. Of course, one of the favorites is the Texas bluebonnet. As you will remember, this spring the bluebonnets were breath taking.

If you're planning a cover of Texas bluebonnets for the home landscape next spring, seed should be planted as soon as possible.

Late summer planting is essential because bluebonnets are actually winter annuals. They germinate in late summer, and exist as a small rosette of leaves throughout the winter while developing a good root system. They then grow rapidly during the spring rainy season to produce sheets of blue flowers.

Many seeds are wasted each year due to improper planting. Just tossing the seed into a grassy area along the road or in the corner of the yard does little else than provide expensive food for birds.

Germination is a also a problem. Poor germination usually unless occurs something is done to soften the hard seed coat to allow moisture to penetrate.

The often recom-

mended practice of puncturing the seed with a needle or ice pick will work, but is rather time consuming as well as hard on your hands. Scratching the seed coat between layers of sandpaper on a hard surface will help break the outer surface. Seed may also be soaked in water for

planting. Since the Bluebonnet is a legume, there is some indication that better results are obtained if the seed is inoculated with a proper nitrifying bacteria. Some of the seed companies have the inoculating material available with the instructions as to how to

several days prior to

use it. In large scale plantings, it would probably be advantageous to use these agents. After treating, broadcast the seed on tilled soil, cover with 1/4 to 1/2 inch of soil, firm the soil, and water. Keep the soil moist until seedlings appear -usually in a week to ten

Once established, bluebonnets seed themselves year after year, provided the seed has been allowed to mature, grass or weeds haven't become too thick and there has been sufficient rain in July and August to

soften the seed coat. With a late drought, it would be advisable to soak the bluebonnet bed several times to assure good germina-





WHITE GRUBS IN **TURFGRASS**

One of the most common problems of Turfgrass in Texas is damage caused by the feeding of White Grubs. White Grubs are larval stages of June Beetles. They feed agricultrual crops such as Corn, Sorghum and Sugar Cane.

It is the White Grub stage which causes lawn damage during the Summer and Fall by feeding on the roots. Feeding of large numbers of Grubs causes lawns to turn yellow in the affected areas. Positive identification of the damage is possible when the yellowed grass can be lifted easily from the ground.

The Grubs become dormant through the Winter months living on fat reserves. In the Spring the Grub resumes feeding on organic matter. The Grub pupates (rests) for three weeks and then emerges as an

adult ready to mate. Major adult flights occur at different times of the year depending on the geographic location of the State. This is important, as it determines the critical treatment period. The flight period, in which adults are active, lasts

It is important to treat for White Grubs while they are in an early stage of development, the critical treatment period. Larger Grubs are difficult to control because of their size and the difficulty of getting enough insecticide down through the lawn. The critical treatment period is about four to six weeks after egg lay. In this area it arrives during late July or early August. Lawns suspected of being infested with White Grubs should be inspected during the critical treatment period. Lawns can be checked by cutting and digging a 1-square-foot sections of sod and examining the roots and soil to a depth of four inches. Sod and soil should be replaced and watered in. Take several samples at dif-

Treatment is usually recommended when more than four 1/4 to ½-inch Grubs per square foot are found. Insecticides recommended for Grub control are much less effective against eggs and large Grubs than against small Grubs. The toxicity of these insecticides is greatly reduced two to four weeks after application. Thus, insecticides applied too early may not be effective in the soil after the eggs



Producer Believes Tax Increase A Mistake

Mid-Continent Oi! & Gas Association said Tuesday that it would be a mistake for Texas to increase severance taxes on crude oil and natural gas as proposed by Texas Attorney General Mark White.

Dallas independent producer Edwin L. Cox disagreed sharply with White's contention that raising oil and gas production taxes was "the only response" to the U.S. Supreme Court's recent

The president of Texas decision upholding Montana's 30-percent severance tax on coal.

> 'Because of the deregulation of crude oil prices and the gradual decontrol of natural gas prices, we have seen a spirited upsurge in drilling in Texas," Cox said. "This activity has created jobs in all sectors of the state's economy, located new reserves of secure oil and gas, and increased tax collections for all levels of government. We should concentrate on continuing the


favorable climate for finding and producing energy in the state, not becoming involved in a severance tax war with other mineral producing states," Cox said.

Texas consumers - both industrial and residential would bear the brunt of an increase in the gas severance tax. Texans consume two-thirds of the state's natural gas produc-

Cox said that any increase in the oil severance tax would have to be borne by Texas producers and royalty owners. It could not be passed along to consumers in others states as White apparently envisions, Cox add-

"This is because the price of crude oil is determined in the world market. Texas producers are price takers. not price setters in this market," Cox said.


Cox pointed out that Texas petroleum producers have been responsible taxpayers and currently are providing about one-quarter of the state's tax revenues. In Fiscal Year 1980, for example, crude oil and natural gas production taxes alone amounted to more than \$1.5 billion, representing 24-percent of the state's net tax collections, he noted.





THE PARTY OF THE P THE SIGNS OF HIS COMING: The best authority on Jesus' return is, of course, Jesus Himself. As He was answering three great questions by His apostles (When would Temple destroyed? What would be the sign of His coming? What would be the sign of the end of the age?). He gave His reply in a parable and historical allegory (Matthew 24:32-44). From these we can deduce when He will return to catch up the Church. The parable involved a fig tree sprouting its first leaves, Jesus said that as new fig leaves indicate the nearness of summer in Israel, the accumulation of certain signs on the earth and in the skies would signal the arrival of God's judgements upon the generation which saw all the signs begin to appear. He said no one would know the exact day or hour of His coming, but we could know which generation would see Him. The Sign of Noah; To illustrate this, Jesus gave a historical allegory about the great Flood of Noah's day. He said the people were going about their business as usual--eating, drinking, and marrying-but paying no attention to Noah's warning about God's impending judgement. They had no idea God's prophetic time of judgement had come until the flood destroyed them all. Jesus said His coming would be exactly like that. Butwhich coming? His secret coming for the Church, or His coming and glory at the end of the Tribulation? The

focus when we understand what the Flood symbolizes. The Flood was a judgement on everyone who rejected God's prophetic warning and offer of forgiveness. In Jesus' allegory, the Flood symbolizes a judgement which is coming upon the unbelieving world, and it must therefore. Jesus pointed out that first there was a prophetic warning, the God removed His people to safety, and then judgement fell. THE SIGN OF SODOM, We're also told that Jesus' coming will have similarities to the destruction of Sodom. Two angels told Lot that God was going to punish the wicked residents of the city, and then they escorted Lot and his family to safety. As the people of Sodom went about their daily routines,

answer comes into

pattern! First a prophetic warning, then God removes His people, and judgement falls on unbelievers. If Jesus's historical illustrations refer to His coming for His people at the end of the Tribulation, as some teach, then believers as well as unbelievers would pass through its incredible horrors while doing their business as usual-eating, drinking, marrying, building, buying, planting, and selling. But no one can live a normal life in the chaos of the Tribulation, as we'll see in the following chapters of Revelation.

Severance Tax on Crude Oil and Gas Discussed

DALLAS--The president of Texas Mid-Continent Oil & Gas Association said Tuesday that it would be a mistake for Texas to increase severance taxes on crude oil and natural gas as proposed by Texas Attorney General Mark White.

Dallas independent producer Edwin L.Cox disagreed sharply with White's contention that raising oil and gas production taxes was "the only response" to the U.S. Supreme Court's recent desicion upholding Montana's 30 percent severance tax on coal.

"Because of the

deregulation of crude oil prices and the gradual decontrol of natural gas prices, we have seen a spirited upsurge in drilling in Texas," Cox said. "This activity has created jobs in all sectors of the state's economy, located new reserves of secure oil and gas, and increased tax collections for all levels of government. We should concentrate on continuing the Attendance Pins favorable climate for finding and producing energy in the state, not becoming involved in a severance tax war with other mineral producing states," Cox

Texas consumers-both industrial and residential--would bear the brunt of an increase in the gas severance tax. Texans consume two-thirds of the state's natural gas

production.

Cox said that any increase in the oil severance tax would have to be borne by Texas producers and royalty owners. It could not be passed along to consumers in other states as White apparently envisions,

Cox added. "This is because the price of crude oil is determined in the world market. Texas producers are price takers, not price setters in this market," Cox said.

Cox pointed out that Texas petroleum producers have been responsible taxpayers and currently are providing about onequarter of the state's tax revenues. In Fiscal Year 1980, for example, crude oil and natural gas production taxes alone amounted to more than \$1.5 billion, representing 24 percent of the state's net tax collections, he

Some Books on Social Security Are Inaccurate

social security information are useful, but there are others that inaccurate. misleading, overpriced, and deceptively advertised, Glyn Hammons, social security district manager in Abilene, said recently.

The Social Security Administration doesn't discourage the sale of commercial publications, Hammons said. At the same time, we don't endorse any nongovernment publication. People can get free, accurate, up-todate publications and other information about social security at any social security of-

Social Security information is organized and illustrated in a different way in some commercial books. Some of them are well done, but the information in them isn't "secret" or "inside". If advertising suggests it is, the advertising is

Some advertising

Some books sold as hints that a publisher has an official connection with the Social Security Administration and has access to people's social security records, Hammons said. This is never true. No advertiser has assess to other people's social security records. These records are confidential under the law.

Dramatic claims for can books misleading, Hammons said. For example: an advertisement says readers will learn "how to collect \$300 a month from social security at age 30 while you are working full time." The book tells you what any social security office will tell you without charge: if a young father and mother are both working under social security and one dies, their children may get monthly social security payments.

People can call, write, or visit any social security office for information about retirement, disability, survivors, Medicare, and supplemental security income programs.
