Even up to the time the deputy's car let me out at the gate and I stared through the fence at those cold brick walls. I kept thinking "What is it really like in there?"

I had heard so many stories, were they true?

The people who told me the stories probably told the truth but I sure had a lot of serious misconceptions.

Yo say I was terrified would have been putting it mildly.

I was quite prepared to meet the most brutal, cold blooded human beings God had ever blown breath into. And that was just the

guards, they were the good guys. Naturally prisoners they rode herd over had to be

worse still. It took a few days of being afraid to breathe to realize that if I kept

my mouth shut and did as I was told no great harm would befall me. Slowly the realization came that prison is only a building.

Of course it has a few more locks than what I was used to but that was understandable. A large number of mem lived in a very small area. But I had seen much the same thing when I was in the Army. As a matter of fact, prison bears many similarities to the Army. And I was in a manner of speaking drafted into prison. I sure didn't volunteer to come here.

The most shocking fact that I finally realized about prison came through getting acquainted with the people there.

POSTMASTERS BACK TO '76

CHRISTMAS AND THE POSTAL SERVICE

By Laura Lou Trammell The busy times of Christmas, the hustle and bustle of our Postal Service at this time of the year, inspires us to reflect and reminiscence on the history of Eastland Postal Service.

The records of the Department do not go back further than Oct. 16, 1913. Therefore it is impossible to give the location of the first post office building. However research indicate the first post office building in Eastland could have been located on Lamar Street, back of the corner building which is located on the corner of Main and Lamar Streets, formerly occupied by Walters Grocery. A notation on a picture taken at this location indicates the picture was taken in about the year

Mr. Jake Sparr and Mr. Henry Van Geem, who are decendents of former Postmasters, researched with us, comparing pictures and dates. We reached the conclusion that the Lamar Street building could have been the first building. Mr. Sparr recalls his father telling of hiding the mail under his mattress or under the bed to protect it from outlaws and Indians. This indicates prior to the Lamar Street location the Postal Service could have been housed in the Postmasters residence.

The records show the Postal Service was established in 1874 at McGough Springs and Berry M. Burks was appointed Postmaster. The second Postmaster, Thomas C. McGough was appointed Aug. 12, 1874. The name was changed to Eastland post office Jan. 31, 1876.

The records indicate the Eastland Post Office receoved special service from a neighboring post office when it was first established. The records do not indicate the mode of transportation of the

A star route was established from Comanche to McGough Springs (Eastland) 50 miles and back once a week from Oct. 1, 1875 through June 30, 1878. The mode of transportation was not specified.

Modern equipment and facilities were installed at the same time, and the office now (1922) has a force of ten clerks, two city carriers and two rural carriers, and about 1,00 postoffice boxes.

The postal inspector has given Eastland the highest rating in his district in point of equipment, efficiency of clerks, carriers and assistants, and in everthing pertaining to first class postal service.

From Oct. 16, 1913 to Oct. 25, 1920 the post office quarters was located on the east side of the square in a building owned by Earl and Ava Conner, the building now occupied by the Chamber of Commerce. From Oct. 26, 1920 to early 1938 the post office was located at 314 Main Street, presently Bruce Pipkin Motor Co. Bldg. From 1938 to the present time, the post office has been located across the street at 411 W. Main.

Outstanding complishments of the Eastland Postal Service was the window mural Postmaster Marene Johnson Johnson created, giving her time, money and dedication in creating this piece of art. Through her efforts and EASTLAND, talents, TEXAS, U.S.A., became more than a small name on a map. Her efforts and dedication will remain for many years a patriotic gift to all of us. The flower flag on the post office grounds was another outstanding product of her efforts.

We owe a whole bunch of THANKS to our Eastland Postal Employees who down through the years have done so many little personal services for us. Services that did not break postal regulations and yet was not requirement of their job.






HISTORY OF TEXAS by Capt. B.B. Paddock has this to say of one of Eastland's early postmasters and the office here. The book was published in 1922:

Henry Van Geem. The town of Eastland was laid out and established in 1875. The following year, centennial year, a newcomer in the community was Henry Van Geem. Mr. Van Geem has lived there ever since and is one of Eastland's oldest and most honored citizens. He has enacted a sustaining role in citizenship through all these years, and for fourteen years has been connected with Eastland's postoffice and is now in his second term as postmaster. The pastrons of the city postal system have bestowed unstinted praise on the efficiency and splendid service Mr. Van Geem has developed in his capacity as postmaster. He was born at Buffalo,

New York, in 1853, and represents one of th old Holland Dutch families of that state. He acquired a common school education and as a boy showed a faculty for self-reliance, evidenced when he left home early in 1870, a youth of seventeen, and started out to see the world on his own account. He traveled by stages through Michigan, Indiana, central Illinois, and Missouri, and finally reached Harrison County in east Texas. He lived at Marshall for several years and while there worked at a mechanical trade. He continued his work as a general mechanic at Eastland for a number of years.
