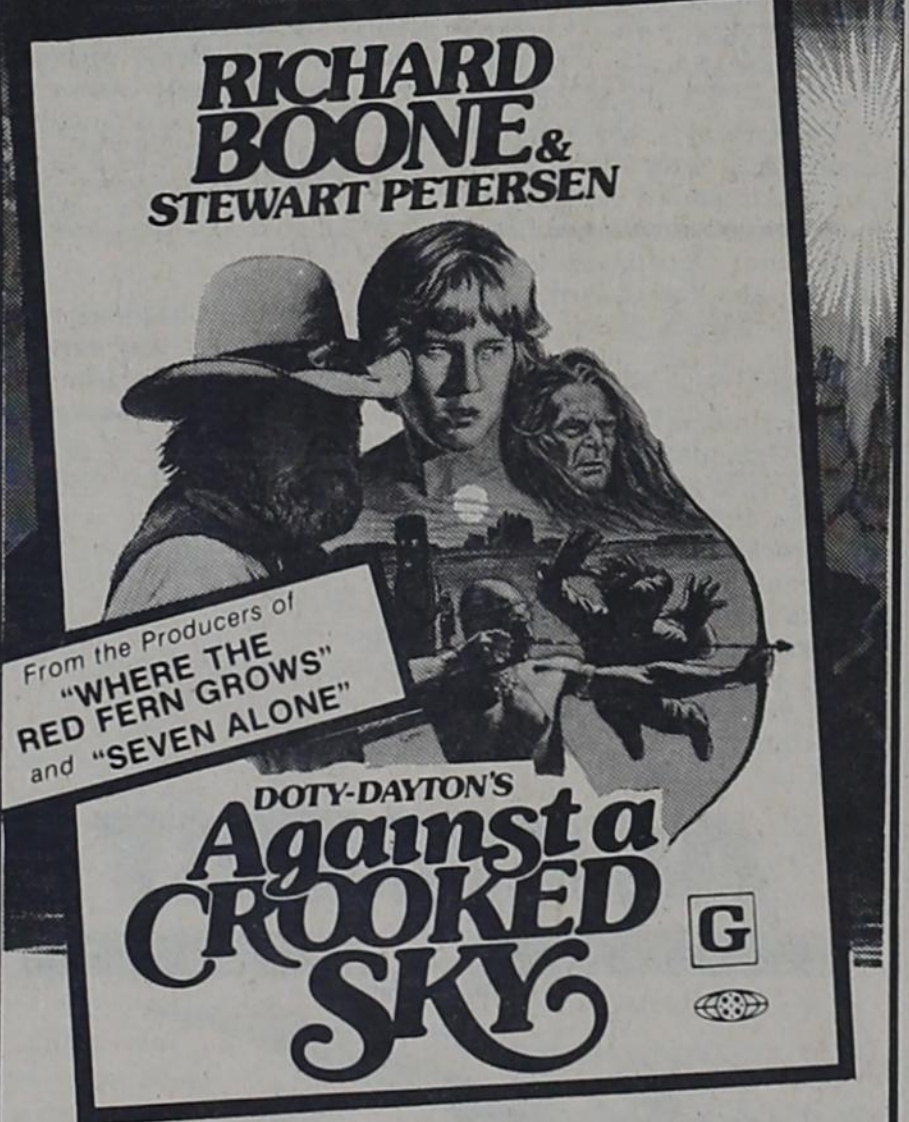
**May 4-H'ers Place In District Food Show**

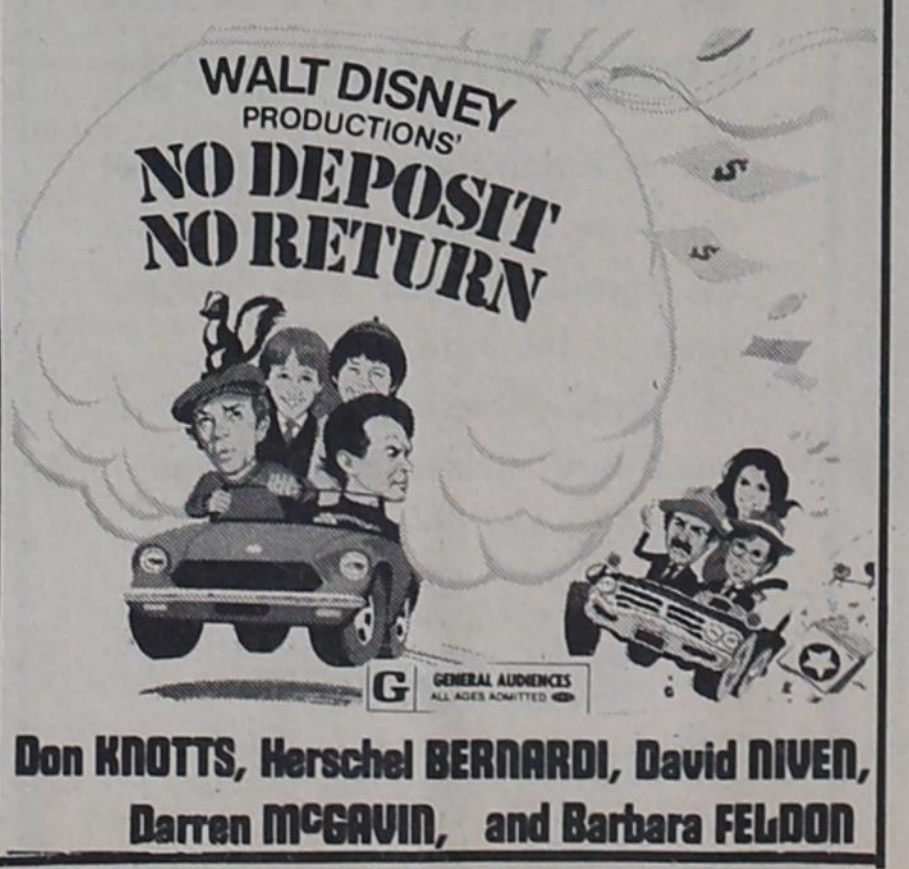
