Two Local Young Men Named Peanut Overmarketing **Penalities Reduced** for unintentional **County** Committees

of the U.S. Department Agriculture's of Agriculture Stabilization and Conservation Service (ASCS) have been authorized to reduce the penalty for unintentionally overmarketing peanuts by 92 percent for the 1978 crop and by 84 percent for the 1979 crop, according to ASCS Administrator Ray Fit-

Fitzgerald said the current 25.2 cents per pound penalty for peanuts unintentionally overmarketed may be reduced to 2.1 cents per pound for the 1978 crop and to 4.2 cents per pound for the 1979 crop. The 25.2 cents per pound penalty will continue to be assessed producers who the county committees cirdetermine cumvented peanut market quotas, he said.



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

WHILE WE WAIT



WHAT SAITH THE SCRIPTURES? QUESTION: What is repentance? ANSWER:

"Repentance", as it is used in the scriptures, is defined by Joseph Thayer in THE GREEK-ENGLISH LEXICON OF THE NEW TESTAMENT as, "The change of mind of those who have begun to abhor their errors and misdeeds, and have determined to enter upon a better course of life, so that it embraces both a recognition of sin and sorrow for it and hear-

turning to God produced by consciousness of and sorrow for sins.

John the Baptist commanded men, "repent ye, and believe in the gospel"(Mark 1:15). This repentance demanded a changed life for he also commanded "Bring forth therefore fruits worthy of repentance ... "(Luke 3:8).

True repentance which leads to salvation includes more than simply feeling sorrow for having done wrong. "For godly sorrow worketh repentance unto salvation, a repentance which bringeth not regret: but the sorrow of the world worketh death"(2 Cor. 7:10). Obviously the sorrow of the world goes no farther than grief. Godly sorrow for sins, however, produces true repentance, which in turn leads unto salvation. This true repentance that leads unto salvation is always joined with obedience to God. When men were pricked in their hearts


with grief, Peter commanded them, "Repent ye, and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of your sins" (Acts 2:38). He also said, "Repent ye therefore and turn again, that your sins may be blotted out"(Acts 3:19). Paul preached that men should, "Repent and turn to God, doing works worthy of repentance"(Acts 26:20).



Pursuant to Section 102(2) (C) of the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969; the Council on Environmental Quality Guidelines (40 CFR Part 1500-1508); and the Soil Conservation Service Guidelines (7 CFR Part 650); the Soil Conservation Service, U.S. Department of Agriculture, gives notice that an environmental impact statement (EIS) is not being prepared for the Lake Leon Critical Area Treatment Measure Plan in Eastland County, Texas.

The environmental evaluation of this federally-assisted action indicates that the proposed project treatment will not cause significant adverse local, regional, or national impacts on the environment. As a result of these finding, Mr. George C. Marks, State Conservationist, has determined that the preparation and review of an EIS is not needed for this project.

The measure concerns a plan to stablize three (3) acres of critically eroding areas below Lake Leon Dam. The planned works of improvement include excavation of the existing river slope (bank) to a stable slope

and vegetation to a permanent grass cover; construction of a grass waterway above the riverbank to intercept and convey upland runoff to a safe outlet; and construction of a fence around the treated area for vegetative establishment and protection

purposes The Findings of No Significant Impact (FNSI) has been forwarded to the Environmental Protection Agency. The basic data developed during the environmental evaluation and the environmental assessment are on
