years of age or older may be years of age or older may be
deferred or abated if they deferred or abated if they
satisfy therequirements of the satisfy therequirements of the
State Property Tax Code. The property owner must occupy the residence homestead on which the tax is being
levied or on which a suit has been filed for collection of delinquent taxes.
To obtain a deferral, the in-
dividual must file with the dividual must file with the
Chief Appraiser for the Apraisal District in which the property is located an affidavit; stating that they are sixty-
ive (65) years of age or older five (65) years of age or older and that they do own and
reside in the house that the tax is being levied on. If a suit has already been
filed by a tax unit, the indifiled by a lax unit, the indi-
vidual must file with the court in which the suit was filed the same type of affidavit. By filing the affidavit with the property authority, the payment of taxes or forced collections through suit is postponed until the person filing the affidavit no longer owns and occupies the property as aresidence homestead.
Although the tax is deAlthough the tax is de-
ferred; it is not cancelled. A tax lien remains on the propeax lien remains on the propalties and interest continue to accrue during the period that the collect of taxes is deferred.
