





### New Law Will Affect Allotment **Of Eastland Farms**

The County Committee of the ASC office in Eastland announced this week that there is a new law governing the cotton and peanut history on allotment farms.

This new law is a complicated procedure and producers who do not plan to plant at least 75 per cent of the cotton or peanut allotment should contact the county office at once so that plans can be made to maintain the allotment history for the farm.

This is an entirely new procedure and demands the attention of every producer.

The committee also announced that it will again offer cotton pre-measurement service to cotton growers. Producers may make application for this service from Feb. 15 to March 15.

There is no pre-measurement service offered to peanut growers. However, as in the past, both cotton and peanut producers may come to the county office and get aid in making an estimate from the aerial photographs of the acreage to be planted.

The County office is now accepting released acreage on cotton and peanuts. If farmers do not intend to plant the allotment, they should go to the county office and discuss releasing the acreage. The allotment could be seriously affected in 1961 by not releasing the allotment in 1960. April 4 is the final date for releasing date for releasing cotton.


## Lamb Grading to Be Continued, **TS&GRA** Informed






