

FmHA Housing Loans

Agriculture will resume making housing loans and grants, Alex Mercure, assistant secretary of agriculture for rural Development, said

Farmers Home Administration, the credit arm USDA, had suspended certain new housing loans and grants because legilative authority had expired Dec. 1.

New authorization became effective after Congress passed the Housing and Community Development Act and President Carter signed it into law Dec. 21. Programs affected were

The U.S. Department of the section 502 low to moderate income home ownerhsip, section 515 rural rental housing and the section 523 technical assistance grants and self help site loans. These programs represent most of FmHA's rural housing lending authority.

> Previously, Congress had appropriated \$4.9 billion for all FmHA housing programs for fiscal year 1980. That represents a slight increase over the FY 1979 budget.

FmHA invested nearly \$14.7 billion in rural areas programs in FY 1979.

Christmas is gonna be a little different for me this year. In all my 29 years, I've never spent Christmas away from home. I'm only going to this year because I have no other choice. I'm in prison.

Its a rough time of year for a convict. Our burdens especially heavy now.

We miss home, our loved ones, and all the normal festivities associated Christmas.

But we endure as we know we must. For a new year is just around the corner. With luck the new year will bring Parole or discharge, the chance to once again join the fierce world.

There is no Santa Claus in prison. But we do have a few special treats for this time of year ..

The JayCee's sponsored a double feature movie and gave two hundred lucky inmates who happened to be in the winning seats free popcorn and soda. That was nice.

The Inmate Welfare Club is going to give us a goodie bag. It will contain fruit, candy, and a calendar to count the days in the forthcoming year.

We have a Christmas tree in the middle of the yard, decorated primarily homemade trinkets, made by various inmates.

Of course Christmas day we will have a feast. The food we get is good but it seldom varies, except on special occasions, then we do it up right. Turkey with all the trimmings, ham, fruit salad, and cake. And nobody goes back to his cell hungry on Christmas.

There is no gift giving at Christmas in prison. To give another inmate something is Traffic and Trade grounds for a case.

Of course I've heard rumors that close friends may exchange packs of smokes or some other insignificant item. Of course it's the thought not the gift that counts.

Last but not least there is the serious side of Christmas here. We have special programs in our chapel throughout the Holiday season. Giving the convict the chance to sing praises to God and Jesus and to be reminded Christmas is in celebration of the birth of The Christ Child.

All in all it takes very little to be special to a convict. We expect little and receive less. But of course we are here for punishment not for parties.

I think it is best sum-

med up what I've heard many say throughout the prison system, "I'll be glad when Christmas is over so I won't be so homesick."


