CEDAR BRAKES ON FIRE Lawmakers Sit in Tense, Respectful Silence While President Outlines Next Move Forward---Efforts Being Made to Force Extra Session May Bring on Embarrassing Situation

Washington, Feb. 26. President Wilson today took estimated in full. Five cars the inevitable step and asked congress for authority to use the forces of the United States to protect American shipes and lives against the German submarine menace; to put the nation in a state of armed neutrality. The immediate response was the introduction in the house of a bill, approved in advance by the president, empowering him to furnish guns and gunners to American merchantmen; "to employ such other instrumentalities and meth... ods" as may become necessary, and providing for a \$100,-000,000 bond issue to be used, in his discretion, for war insurance to encourage American commerce to brave the submarine peril. The bill may be brought up in the Alexander brake and during house tomrrrow with special rules for its immediate consideration. A similar bill will be considered tomorrow by the senate foreign relations committee.




