## BULLETIN OF SELECTION BOARD

(Crowded out last week)

1. Special Induction Call No. 1203 has been received, in which required this county to entrain two white, limited or special service registrants on the 4th instant for Camp Bowie, Fort Worth, Texas. The draftees under this call were William Melvine Montgomery, postoffice Montgomery, Texas, and John Lafayette Jones, San Saba, temporary post office Needville, Texas. An extra draftee, Daphne Earlycot Winslett, post office Mercury, was inducted under this call, according to the provision whereby as many as two additional registrants may be drafted under any special or general movement of men. The first two draftees mentioned were members of the Class of 1917; the last mentioned was a member of the Class of June 5, 1918. Montgomery was transferred to the Local Board at Conroe, Texas for entrainment; Winslett was entrained at this place. Jones will be entrained at San Saba on the 11th instant, as a result of his failure, through no fault of his own, to receive his induction notice promptly.

2. The following were the draftees under General Induction Call No. 1239, these men being entrained on the 6th instant for Camp Travis, San Antonio, Texas: Joe Creed Hart, Almos Lenard Brown, and Byron Walker, post office San Saba, all members of the Class of 1917. Jacob Sherman Taff, Ernest Armstrong Smithhart, Walter Stevenson, Dewey William Berry, Thomas James Maultsby, Ernest Taylor Myers, Harry Carver Timberlake, Fred Lynn Wallace, John Stephenson Yarborough, Samuel Monroe Walker, Luther Rector Eller, William Alexander Huffstetler, and Thomas Clark, post office San Saba; James Raymond Lewis, Dow Austin Williams, Hal McKinley Chiles, Pete Campbell Miller, George Washington Brown, Howard Otto Garrett, Thomas Byron Grimes, and James Alfred Newby, post office Richland Springs; Albert Wesley Smith, post office Ratler; Valerie Schneider, and R. T. Daniel Edmondson, post office Locker; Roy Douglas Lucas, Cortenas Edgar Sidney Gibson, William Herschel Byrd, and Alexander Lee Chambers, post office Bend; Elbert Estell Harris, post office Chadwick; Elbert Wallace, post office Goldthwaite; Emmett Smith, and Julian Martin, post office Bowser; Ora McFarland, post office Fredonia; Joe Franklin Kendrick, post office Lometa; Walter Lange, post office Field Creek; John Warren Matlock, post office Holt; William Thomas Peacock, post office Cherokee; and James Madison Smith, post office Regency; all of the Class of June 5, 1918. Almos Lenard Brown was placed in charge of the party, and Hart, Huffstetler, Peacock and Yarborough were appointed his assistants. Alvin Behrens, post office San Saba, was transferred to this Board from the Local Board at Van Horn, Texas, for entrainment under this call and he was entrained with the draftees named above. Two draftees of this Board under this call, Earnest Calvin Watkins, post office San Saba, temporary post office Van Alstyne, Texas, and Earl Robinson, post office Hall, both of the Class of June 5, 1918, were transferred to other boards for entrainment; the former to the Local Board at Sherman, Texas; the latter to Local Board No. 2, Hill County, Itasca, Texas. The forty-one draftees of this

jurisdiction listed above plus these two transferred draftees total 43 men, the number furnished by this Board under this call in question. The quota for this county under such call was 58 men. The deficit of 15 men will be owed by this Board until it has enough available Class I, Group A, men to make up such deficit, the 43 men furnished exhausting the available uninducted Class I, Group A, men of this jurisdiction. This deficit was caused by one Class I, Group A, registrant being reclassified and placed in a deferred class and by fourteen Class I, Group A, men being members of the local cavalry troop and their being federalized before the day of entrainment under the call in question, which action called for their being reclassified and placed in Class V as men in the military service of the United States.

3. All arrangements have been made for the registration on Thursday the 12th instant. If the citizens of the county are assisting and co-operating with this Board to the extent that we are expecting them to (which we believe is the case) in giving wide publicity to the information regarding the registration contained in our bul-

class, to file with the local board having jurisdiction over him his new address in detail immediately upon changing his address. This is every registrant's first duty and it is only by fulfilling same that registrants can protect themselves from involuntarily becoming delinquents by failure to receive mailed notices calling upon them to perform certain acts and their consequent failure to perform such acts.

6. Special Induction Call No. 1296 has been received. The quota for this county under such call is two white, Class I, Group A, men; the draftees to be sent to Camp Mabry, Austin, Texas, for a course of instruction in auto mechanics. The date of entrainment is the 18th instant. The draftees are: Joe Lee Neeper, Miami, Arizona, of the Class of 1917, who will be entrained by the Local Board at Globe, Arizona; and Lonnie Roy Taylor, post office San Saba, of the Class of August 24, 1918.

7. This Board has received numerous requests for information in regard to the Students' Army Training Corps, the date upon which enlistment in the navy and the marine corps will be reopened, and how soon the first call for Class I, Group A, registrants of the Class of September 12, 1918, will be received. This office has so far received no official instructions as to any of these three matters.
