Record-holding marathon runner shows no sign of slowing

With 428 total marathons completed and the record for most marathons in a calendar year while still having the time to be a full time CPA, Angela Tortorice, is definitely not living life at a slow pace.

Tortorice completed 129 marathons on Saturday August 31, 2013 in Pocatello, Idaho.

It seems she has never done anything slower than at the speed of light.

After growing up with the class of 1986 in the Rockwall school district, she sped things up a bit in high school and graduated with the class of 1985.

Today, holding the Guinness World Record for the most marathons in a 365 day period on top of using the degree in accounting she received at the University of North Texas as a CPA, slowing down is still not an option.

Setting the record, however, was not originally a goal of hers.

"I had read and been told that exercise and diet play a factor in helping prevent disease. With this reality hitting home, I decided to control what aspects of disease prevention that I could in my life so I started running a mile, quarter mile walk, run a quarter mile, walk a quarter and run a quarter. I felt so great as I did this five days a week. I eventually worked up to running the mile and then slowly with some walking worked up to running three miles daily five days per week," Tortorice said. "This would have been the perfect place to stop and is a great goal for anyone to work toward achieving. It was life changing for me. I had more energy, confidence and just felt great!"

The feeling was so great apparently that she couldn't get enough.

"I realized I was just over 100 in 365. I contacted Guinness to see if they would approve my record in a 365 day period and not a calendar year and they confirmed this so I got busy," Tortorice said.

In 2011, she tackled the task of running a 50-mile race.

"This is a bit of a rocky and rooty run, but far, far, far from the most difficult run I have done. What was hard is mentally preparing for 50 miles," Tortorice said. "I was so happy when a girlfriend from Houston popped in with only 8 miles to go and kept my mind off things! You know girlfriends always have a way of helping talk about things thank goodness."

If the mere number of marathons she has completed is not enough, she has, in the process, run a marathon in every state. Twice. And is currently only a few states shy of completing the round a third time.

In addition, she also does triathalons, ultra running and ultra cycling.

Ultra running and ultra cycling are defined as long-distance sports.

The shortest distance that is considered ultra is 31.07 miles, or 50 km. Other standard distances are 50 miles, 100 miles and 100 km.

There are also 6 hour, 12 hour, 24 hour, 48 hour and 6 day long events.

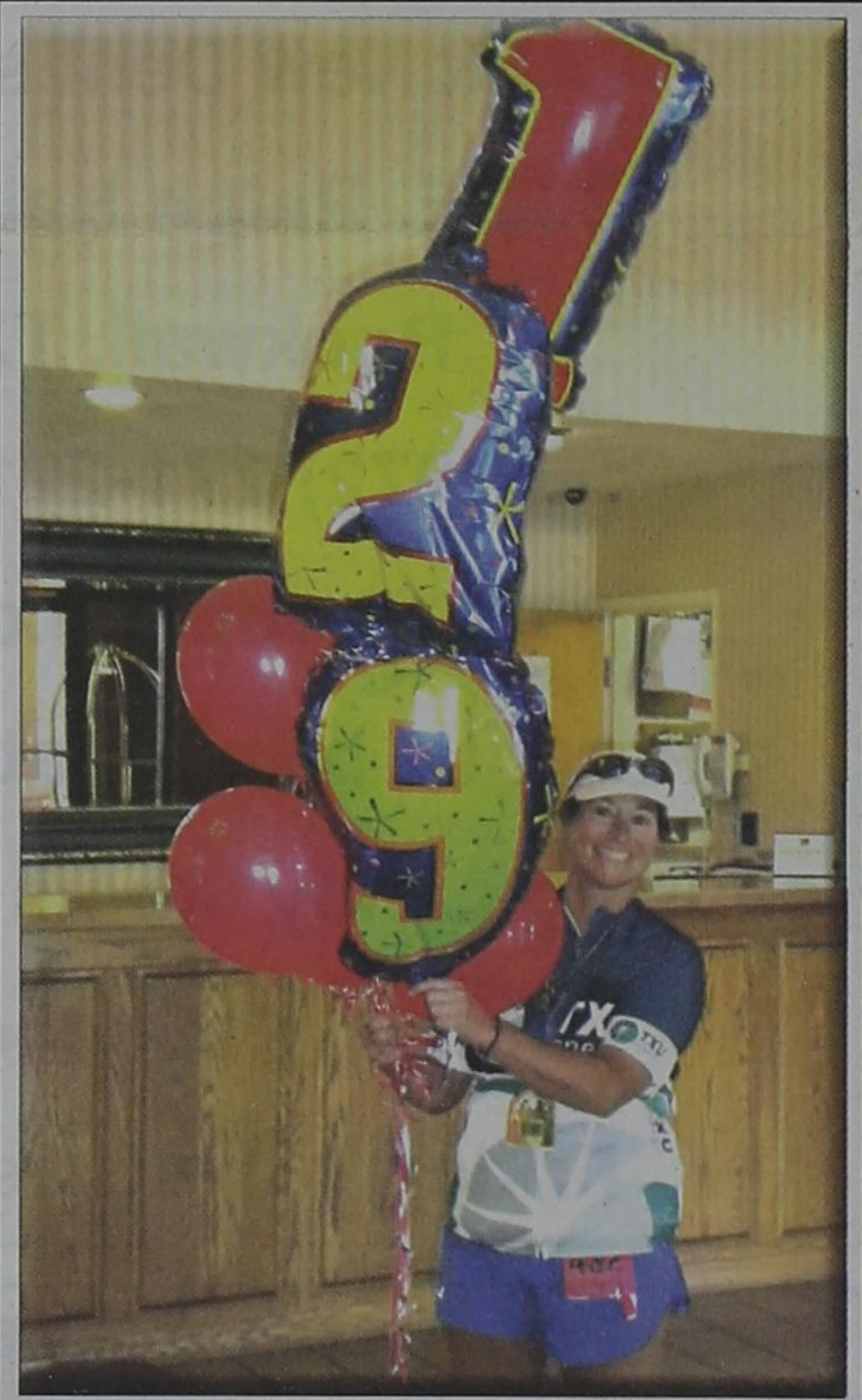
"I do work full time and basically travel on the weekends so there is not much time for sleep from Friday night until I return Sunday. Some days we run a Friday marathon and that requires a vacation day," Tortorice said.

This past weekend, Tortorice was scheduled to enter in marathons in Connecticut and Vermont.

This weekend, she is scheduled to run in Illinois and Michigan.

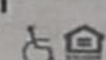

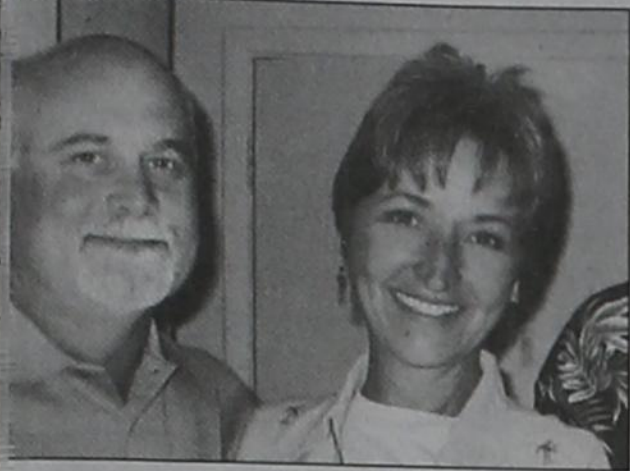

City Manager Ed Thatcher explained to council that after receiving bids for the repair work on Country Club Road, the cost, at more than \$240,000, would be more than was allotted in the current budget for road repairs for the year.

According to Thatcher, the staff's suggestion was to include the project into the city's Capital Improvement Plan.

The repairs would be on Country Club Road between FM 740 and Rachael Drive. Another area of concern would be at the entrance on Horizon Road.

A single bid came in at \$124,000, while the city's estimates were only \$50,000 to \$100,000.

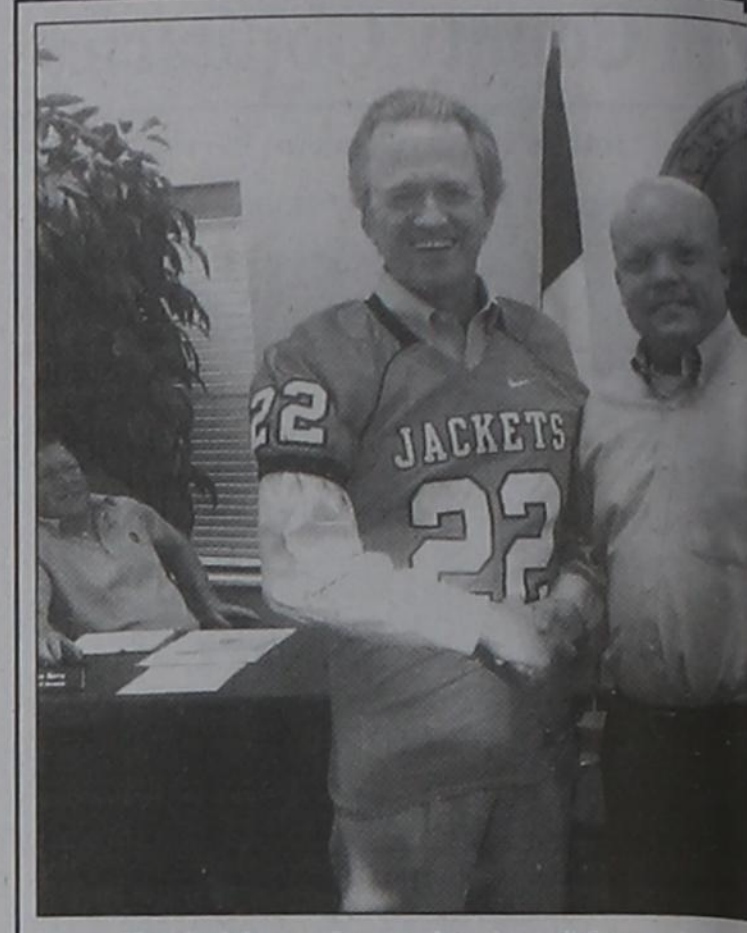
The project will be reopened for bidding.

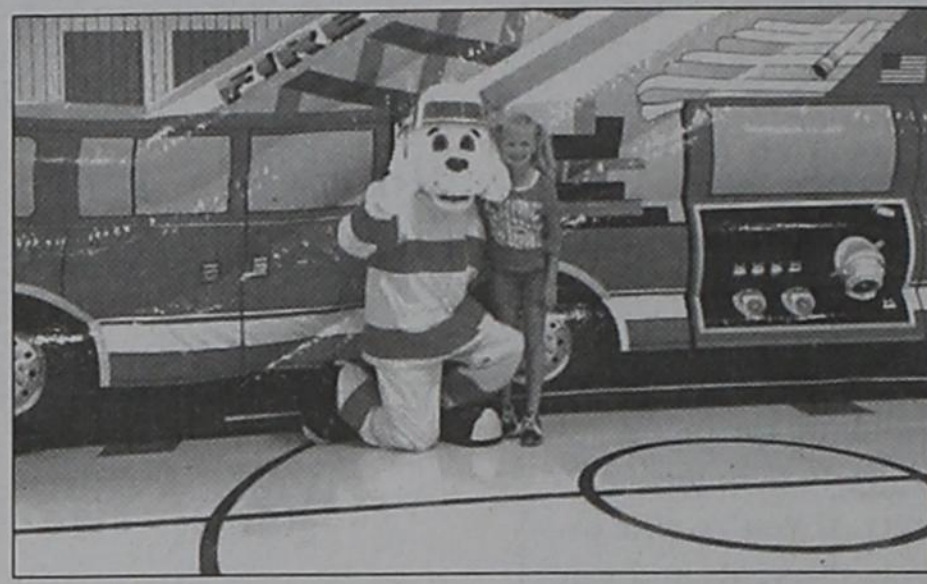

Fulton scores 103, but loses in 3rd-highest-scoring game

A couple of additional touchdowns and perhaps a few more successful conversions could have really made history Friday night.

As it was, Oakwood's 120-103 victory over The Fulton School at Cain Middle School was the third-highest-scoring game in the history of six-man football.

"We left 18 or 20 points on the field off PATs that we missed," said Fulton head coach Josh Johnson.

The two higher-scoring games than the 223 totaled by the Panthers and Falcons occurred 3 weeks apart in 2011. San Antonio The Winston edged San Antonio Town East 122-120 (242 total) on Sept. 2 of that year. On Sept. 23, Fort Davis downed Midland Trinity 124-108 (232).

"I didn't see that coming," Johnson said. "I looked up and 4 minutes had gone by, and already the score was like 21-17. It was like a basketball shootout," Johnson said. "It was exciting, electrifying. There was a lot, a lot of offense."

Generating much of that offense were what Johnson called "two of the better athletes in the state." Damiyne Durham scored seven touchdowns for Oakwood (2-4), a 6-Man I public school. Todd Treadway accounted for 563 yards - 223 rushing, 245 passing and 94 on two kickoff-return touchdowns - for Fulton (5-2 as a TAPPS 6-Man II participant).

Durham ran for 201 yards and four scores, had 84 yards and another touchdown receiving, returned a kickoff 50 yards for a TD and also returned an interception for 6 more points.

Johnson said, "Oakwood was the best 1-4 team probably in the state. Their spread back (Durham) only has played about half their games. He wasn't going to play at all because of basketball."

A shooting guard, Durham has committed to play NCAA Division I basketball at Baylor.

His Oakwood teammate, Jacquez Anderson, also scored seven touchdowns - four receiving, three rushing. The Panthers maintained a lead for most of the game. They led 56-41 at halftime.

Johnson said he was encouraged when the Falcons stopped an Oakwood possession on downs early in the fourth quarter, then scored a touchdown to pull within 10 points at 91-81.

"We got momentum there, but then we didn't get another," Johnson said.

The Panthers returned two interceptions for touchdowns. Johnson said, "They were plus-2 in turnovers. From our perspective, we want to be plus-2. If we do that, we're winning."

Fulton's Treadway completed 10 of 17 passes, with three touchdowns

and one interception. Max Mitchell completed 12 of 15 for four TDs. Hayden Leverett had eight receptions for 191 touchdowns; Carson Newman ran for two scores.

Johnson said, "Our kids never quit. They kept picking the other team I've had would have been 45ed. These kids were but they got the big picture. It isn't likely that Saturday's result will be the same as the nearly 80 years of six-man football, only three games have such offense.

Rockwall faces strong North Mesquite defense in 42-10

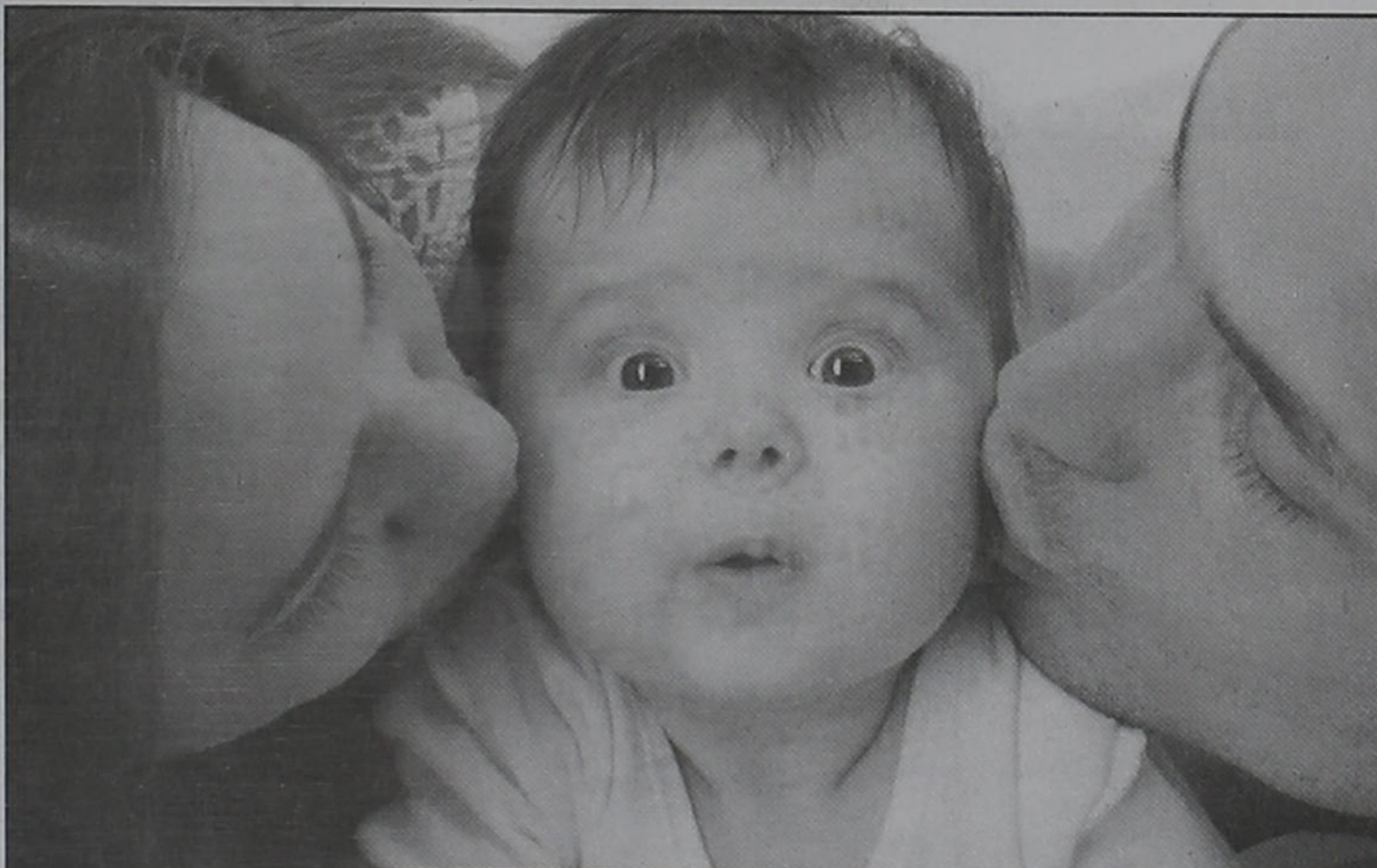
The Rockwall Yellowjackets returned from Hanby Stadium last Friday October 11, with a 42-10 loss to North Mesquite.
