Hale, identified as the suspected shooter, fled the scene following the shooting, according to the release.

On God's Word by Timothy W. Burnett Speaking in tongues ... comparison between Acts 2:4 and Acts 19:5-6

Let's take this time to compare the account in Acts 19:5-6, with that of Acts 2:4.

As a review, where the word "receive" is used in the context of the Holy Ghost, it is always translated from the ancient Greek word "Lambano," which meant to lay hold of, or seize unto something, with a sense of permanent ownership.

When Paul came to Ephesus, and found disciples, he asked an important question, "Have you received the Holy Ghost since you believed?"

Paul would not have asked this question unless he knew that believing was a pre-requisite to receiving.

After he expounded unto them the way more perfectly, they were baptized in the name of Jesus Christ, and they started speaking in tongues.

The people of Acts 2:4 were already believing that God raised Jesus from the dead. Thus, when the spirit was poured out, they were immediately filled with holy spirit (made righteous). Next, they received holy spirit when they started speaking in tongues.

The same was true for the people in Acts 19:5-6. They were filled with holy spirit, after hearing the truth, and started speaking in tongues. The account in Acts 2:4 was only the beginning.





This year's rollback tax rate is the highest tax rate the taxing unit can set before taxpayers can start tax rollback procedures. In each case these rates are found by dividing the total amount of taxes by the tax base (the total value of taxable property) with adjustments as required by state law. The rates are given per \$100 of property value.
