Suspect sought in police impersonation cases

The Rockwall Police Department is seeking the public's assistance in identifying a suspect who has impersonated a police officer in Texarkana and is a person of interest in a similar offense reported Sunday, Aug. 30, in Rockwall, according to a police news release.

The suspect is described as an African-American male in his mid-30s, approximately 5'9" to 6' tall, 200-240 pounds with possible facial hair. According to the news release, the suspect's method of operation in the Texarkana offense was to approach an unsuspecting individual, identify himself as a peace officer before demanding money from the victim in lieu of an arrest.

Police responded to the local incident at about 8 a.m. Aug. 30 at the Auto Center at I-30 and South Goliad Street. According to reports, two individuals were approached by the man, who was described as being well-spoken. He told both individuals he was with a special task force working narcotic interdiction and needed search of their vehicles. The first individual was nowhere near his vehicle and refused the man's request; the impersonator left when the man advised he was calling police.

The suspect went to the truck of the second victim, who was asleep. The impersonator, according to reports, displayed a badge and demanded the victim to move to the passenger seat to accommodate his try to enter the victim's vehicle. While in the truck, the suspect grabbed the victim's wallet and pushed the victim against the passenger door. The suspect fled in a gold or tan Nissan, possibly a Sentra.

According to reports, similar incidents have been reported in recent years in Rockwall and Sulphur Springs. In both the Texarkana and local offenses, the suspect was wearing khaki pants, a dark-colored shirt and a baseball cap with "POLICE" in white lettering.

The suspect also is a person of interest in similar offenses in multiple other Texas cities, according to the release.

Rep. John Ratcliffe speaks in Roysse City

U.S. Representative John Ratcliffe representing the 4th Congressional District in Texas began his upbeat presentation by speaking to the Roysse City Rotary Club and visitors.

"I am very optimistic that with the right leadership (in the White House), that the derogation of values as the world's super county, can be replaced," Ratcliffe said.

Ratcliffe mentioned the nation's veterans – 63,000 just in District 4 – and the senior citizens several times saying that "our country has always stood up for those who cannot stand up for themselves and that it is our government's duty to protect our interest at home and abroad."

He touched on Medicare briefly.

"We need to get back to the core values that made this country great," he said.

In the last seven years, he said, the national debt had doubled, going from \$9 trillion to more than \$18 trillion.

"The federal government is working for you, not the other way around," Ratcliffe said.

"I just don't think this president (Obama) believes in America. We need the government standing behind us, not in front or beside us. The rest of the world is ready for America to lead again."

Ratcliffe reminded everyone that he is a conservative Republican. He spoke about the "unborn issues" and of human parts being sold for profit (as related to the unborn babies and abortion).

"I won't be voting for funding, of any kind, to Planned Parenthood," he said.

"There is something that hasn't changed yet in this country and that is that people want to make sure their kids and grandkids in the country will have a good life," he said. "We live in the greatest state in the greatest country in the world and it is only going to stay that way if we fight for it."

A question-and-answer session followed Ratcliffe's presentation.

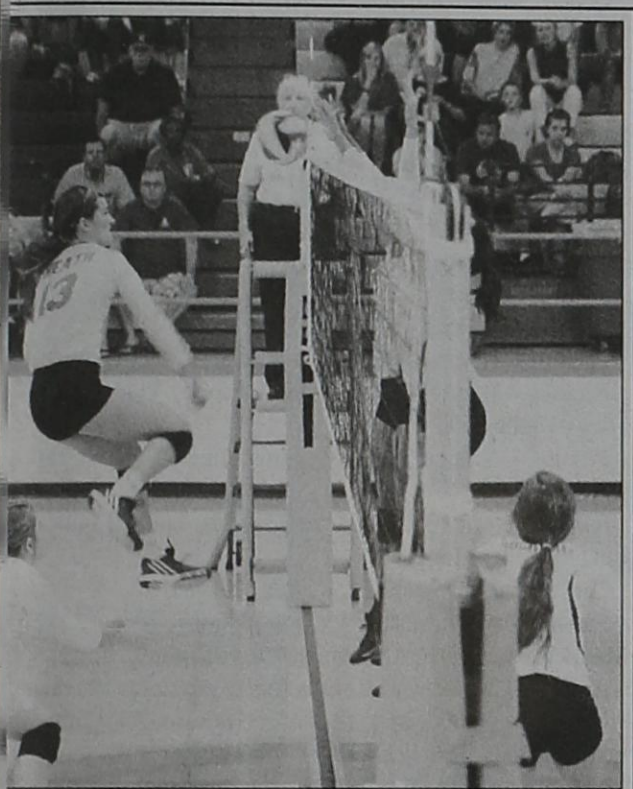

Rockwall HS falls to Denton Ryan, explores offense combinations

Starting their 2015-2016 season with a 14-31 loss against Denton Ryan, Fri. night Aug. 29, at Wilkerson-Sanders Stadium, the Rockwall Yellowjackets maintained high energy and good poise thru the game. Fans watched on as the team cycled through different combinations of players on the offense. "We're trying lots of combinations offensively, to find the most productive personnel groupings," explained Head Coach Rodney Webb.

During the first two quarters, Quarterback Will Reed connected with receivers Sam Crawford, Cole Talley and Running Back Alex Strange.

Not long after the start of a scoreless 1st quarter, Denton was down after two 1st down drives as Luke Termin stopped Denton's and shifty Quarterback Spencer Sanders, forcing a punt.

The third quarter started with a combination of passes to Crawford, Talley and Strange. with explosive ball carrying by Caleb Broach. Rockwall added points when Crawford caught Reed's pass in the right side of the end zone and ran in for the touchdown making it 7-10 (Denton).

Toward the backside of the third quarter, a spark fired up with combined offensive forces of Reed, Running Backs A.J. Blackall, Luke Termin, Dustin McNeely, Tamba Juanah, Broach, and Crawford. The third quarter ended with Juanah diving over the middle into the end zone making the score 14-31.

Also highlighting the game was the punting of Jake Viquez at 189 yards. The stats do not tell the story of his control over the ball arches and spins for good air time and rolling distance.

Coach Webb said that Viquez is a very good punter, and he worked very hard over the off season to hone his skills.

On Fri. Sept. 4, the Jackets will travel to Painesville-Trinity. Trinity is one of the top high school teams in the country. We have to play a physical, mistake-free game in order to have a chance to win off the upset," explained Webb.

Violation of Texas speed limits is not a punishable offense

Transportation Code Section 545.351 Maximum Speed Requirement, and Section 545.352 Prima Facie Speed Limits, do not include language that designates the violation of a posted speed limit to be a prosecutable criminal offense punishable by fine.
The Texas Legislature recognized the right of the people to travel freely on the roads and highways of Texas.
Lacking a punishable offense, signage may be designed as a courtesy for the people.
