People relocating to Fate at record pace

During the Feb. 18 Fate City Council Meeting, Fate resident Nathan J. Derr spoke to the council regarding the maintenance of two open spaces in the Riding Club Estates previously dedicated to the city and to be maintained by the Home Owners Association.

The resident's main concern was drainage issues within the two open spaces.

Derr said the two properties consisting of 4.193 acres and 4.0 acres respectively and are no longer accessible without first accessing private property. There are neighbors who live in Riding Club who have volunteered to clean debris from the creek areas in the acreage, but if any damage should come to the property owners' fences or other structures in the process, Derr said he believes the volunteers would be liable for the damages.

City manager Philip Rodriguez pointed out in the discussion that there are drainage easements that exist around the property that should provide access, but it appears residents have built fences over the existing easements that now prevent access to the properties behind them.

There was extensive discussion concerning the matter that ended with Place 5 Councilman Forrest Murley suggesting that Derr schedule a meeting with Bobby Clay, director of public works in Fate, to come up with workable ideas and solutions to bring back for council consideration at a later date. The suggestion was agreed upon.

Also on the agenda was Ordinance No. O-1222 requesting a zoning

change for Chamberlain Crossing (formerly known as Creekside Estates) to be changed from the land use of Agriculture to Planned Unit Development. The properties include approximately 105.6 acres of open land, which will be transformed into a new single-family housing subdivision and amenity center with 412 lots at final build out.

Meek and lowly in heart ... Lamentations and Nehemiah

Our Lord Jesus was the perfect example of how to mentally keep and guard the heart and mind during the most terrible times of suffering.

During his last year, the Jewish leadership secretly plotted to arrest him many times. They tried to disrupt his service toward God by questioning and mocking those who were healed by Jesus. But Jesus stayed focused on his heavenly Father. Simply walking by the spirit of God, Jesus was able to evade arrest, boldly speak the truth directly to the brutally evil leaders, heal many people, cast out devil spirits and proclaim to all the Kingdom of heaven.



In Matthew-chapter 11, John asked two of his disciples to find Jesus and ask if he was the Messiah prophesied of throughout the Old Testament. Jesus answered their question and shared more about John.

After speaking about John, Jesus prayed to God by saying, "I thank thee, O Father, Lord of heaven and earth, because you have hid these things from the wise and prudent, and have revealed them unto babes Even so, Father: for so it seemed good in thy sight. All things are delivered unto me of my Father: and no man knows the son, but the Father; neither knows any man the Father, save the son, and he to whomsoever the son will reveal Him."

Jesus fully understood who he was and where he stood with his Father God. Jesus was thankful to God for allowing these truths to be hidden from the wise and prudent people of the world. The Fulton School came out on fire Saturday, and the Falcons - especially senior Conner Cleveland - barely cooled off for the rest of the morning's TAPPS 1A Area playoff game.

As a result of their 71-42 victory over Amarillo Ascension Academy at Rockwall Christian Academy, for the second consecutive year the Falcons advanced to the Regional round. They were scheduled to meet Conroe Lifestyle Christian School Tuesday for the right to advance to this weekend's state tournament in Mansfield.

Fulton (16-12) made 8 of 11 field goal attempts and all but one of six free throws to take a 21-7 lead after one quarter.

Cleveland scored 13 points in that quarter. For the game, he equaled Ascension's 42 points. Helping Cleveland, who also had four steals, were junior Branden Williams with 16 points and 18 rebounds, and freshman Trey Ivy with 11 points.

"Conner has played well for us, and Brenden has expanded his game this year. They're trying to make their teammates better," said Falcons head coach Josh Johnson.

HERITAGE CHRISTIAN ACADEMY: For the second consecutive season, the HCA girls won one basketball playoff game but couldn't get past the Area round.

A year ago, the Lady Eagles lost in the last second to Sherman Texoma Christian. This year's Area game at Rockwall Indoor Sports Expo wasn't in doubt after TAPPS 2A defending state champion Muenster Sacred

Heart Christian School ran off 13 consecutive points for a 23-4 lead.

HCA actually outscored Sacred Heart over the final 19 minutes, but not by nearly enough to avoid a 45-28 loss.

Lady Eagles head coach Van Minter said, "Last year's game was tougher, but this one was tougher in one sense because we're losing six girls.

Four of those six graduating seniors (Hailee Johnson, Rachel McMillan, Erika Mendoza and Taylor Powers) have been the core of a team that broke a drought of 6 years away from the playoffs in 2010-11 and has made the playoffs three years in a row, with two district championships.

The only non-senior starter, sophomore Madeline Schroepfer, led HCA's scoring against Muenster with 13 points. She represents the best hope for the future.
