Heath residents asked to join in planning growth and development effort

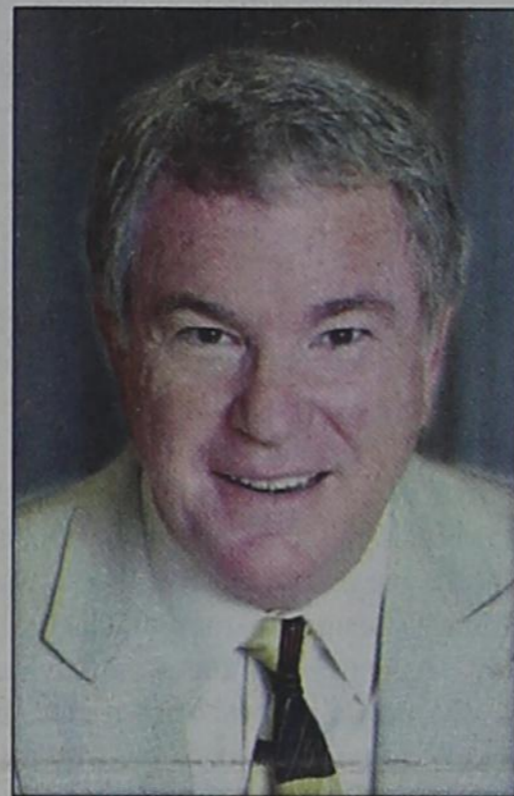
City of Heath's planned update of its Comprehensive Plan is being followed by a kickoff meeting conducted Oct. 15. The meeting to address the plan will be conducted at 6 p.m. on Nov. 11. All citizens are encouraged to attend and share their input, according to a city news release.

The update will address demographics, commercial and residential use and community livability.

Once the plan is completed and approved by the committee, it will be presented to the Heath City Council for adoption. Changes to the plan will be incorporated into the city's zoning ordinance.

The Comprehensive Plan Committee and the Planning Commission met last month to begin work on the plan.

The committee is comprised of a diverse group of residents who will be guiding the city's growth and development over the next 10 years by reviewing and updating the Comprehensive Plan, which was created in 1995 and updated in 2008. Committee members include Dennis Conder, chairman; City Councilman Barry Conder; Cam Brooks; Jon Bailey; Chuck Dale; Lorie Grinnan; Alison Grinnan; Hay Heinkele; Tom Johnson; Jayson Killough; John Main; and James Munnell, according to the news release.

Unofficial results reveal heavy approval for all propositions

Rockwall County voters overwhelmingly expressed approval for all constitutional amendments and the Rockwall ISD Bond Referendum, during the Nov. 3, 2015 general tabulation election.

The vote margin in the ISD Bond election appeared to be much tighter than that of the propositions, with 65.29% voting in favor, compared to the 34.71% of non-consenting voters.

Rockwall County Election Administrator Chris Lynch reported that out of the 52,176 registered voters, 9011 votes were cast for a 17.27% voter turnout.

- Proposition 2 – 8415 For (95.57%); 390 Against (4.43%)
- Proposition 3 – 6425 For (74%); 2257 Against (26%)
- Proposition 4 – 6271 For (72.06%); 2431 Against (27.94%)
- Proposition 5 – 7616 For (87.42%); 1096 Against (12.58%)
- Proposition 6 – 7658 For (87.49%); 1095 Against (12.51%)
- Proposition 7 – 7729 For (88.51%); 1003 Against (11.49%)
- Rockwall ISD Special Bond Referendum – 5328 For (65.29%); 2833 Against (34.71%)

State-wide election results were not available for publication.

strong voice, "You men of Judaea, and all that dwell at Jerusalem, be this known unto you, and hearken to my words: For these are not drunken, as you suppose, seeing it is but the third hour of the day." It was too early for them to be drunk, anyhow.

Peter then revealed, by the spirit of God, that what they saw and heard was spoken of by the prophet Joel.

The words can also be found in Joel 2:28-31.

The prophecy described how that God would pour out the spirit upon all flesh, which would make it available for them to prophecy and see visions and dream spiritual dreams, by the same spirit.

It's important to understand that prior to this event, it was not available for all people to simply be filled with holy spirit. Only certain called people were anointed with holy spirit. Even Jesus was anointed by the prophet John according to the will of God.

Here, Peter is telling everyone that the conditions had completely changed. It was now available for anyone to be filled with holy spirit.

According to Romans 10:9-10, believing with the heart that God raised Jesus from the dead results in righteousness, or being filled with holy spirit. It's that simple and easy to entreat.

Next, Peter continued to quote Joel's words that covered events that are yet to be fulfilled, including miraculous events seen in the sky and signs on earth such as blood, and fire, and vapour of smoke. These descriptions can also be read about in Revelations.

It goes on to say that the sun shall be turned into darkness, and the moon into blood, before that great and notable day of the Lord will

come. The word "notable" is more accurately translated, "terrible," as used in Joel. Once again, this describes extremely significant events that have not happened yet, and will precipitate the day when the Lord Jesus will return by the power and authority of the most High Creator of the heavens and the earth, his Daddy, and will judge and make battle against the mighty and powerful rulers of the world.

No doubt, there will be debate over the chronology of events, but the scriptures do reveal that they will come to pass.

Suddenly, Peter stopped after the next verse from Joel. Considering the Peter was speaking by the spirit of God, we can safely conclude that there was a truly spiritual purpose for stopping at this point.

The last of his words was, "And it shall come to pass, that whosoever shall call on the name of the Lord shall be saved" (See Acts 2:17-21).

What does calling on the name of the Lord have to do with what he said earlier?

When Peter stood up, he began to explain what they saw and heard. He explained that it was the fulfillment of the words spoken by Joel.

What did they see and hear on that day?

Of course, they saw and heard them speaking in tongues.

The break in verse 21 explained the second part of what occurred in Acts 2:4. When they started speaking in tongues, they were calling upon the name of the Lord by the spirit of God.

We will compare this with other areas that use the phrase "call upon the name of the Lord" in reference to salvation.

Rockwall Yellowjackets clinch District 11-6A championship

The Rockwall High School Yellowjackets downed Tyler Lee HS 65-35, Sat., Oct. 31, at Wilkerson-Sanders Stadium. With the win, the Jackets clinched the Region 2 District 11 Championship with a record of 6-3 Overall and 6-0 District.

Rockwall's total offense was 640 yards, with 267 rushing and 373 in the air.

The Yellowjackets received a total of 8 penalties for 67 yards.

Rockwall scored 3 touchdowns during most of the first quarter, the second of which included an 80-yard drive and a score from the 10-yard line.

With about 1:39 on the clock, Tyler Lee Quarter Back Zach Hall ran 75 yards for their first TD.

Next, Rockwall answered with a Will Reed (Sr) pass to Cole Talley (So) who carried the ball from about the Raiders 35 yard line into the end zone pushing the team to a 21-7 lead.

The Raiders followed with a drive from their 25 yd to the RHS 2 yd. Rockwall's defense stopped the Raiders from scoring, and answered with another TD drive in which Reed kept the ball for a TD from the 7 yd.

Throughout the first half, Rockwall continued to hold the Raiders to punt situations, and with TD answers, ending the half at 44-7.

The 2nd half began with a Raiders drive from the 10 yd. Rockwall held them to 4th and 1 yard. The Raiders responded with a fake punt and reverse that was stopped behind the line. Due a Yellowjackets' penalty, Tyler Lee retained position of the ball at the 45 yd. The next play, Hall connected with Wide Receiver Grayson Tyrec for a TD.

The Raiders turned around and recovered an onside kick at the 50 yd, with a follow-up drive the ended with another TD, cutting the Yellowjackets lead to 44-21.

The Jackets came back with quick drive the ended with a Reed pass to Cameron Crayton (So), who carried the ball in for TD from about the 50 yd.

Head Coach Rodney Webb expressed a great deal of pride in the team's overall improvement and performance throughout the season. The Yellowjackets will take on Copperas Cove for Bi-District 11 game information was not available as of press run.

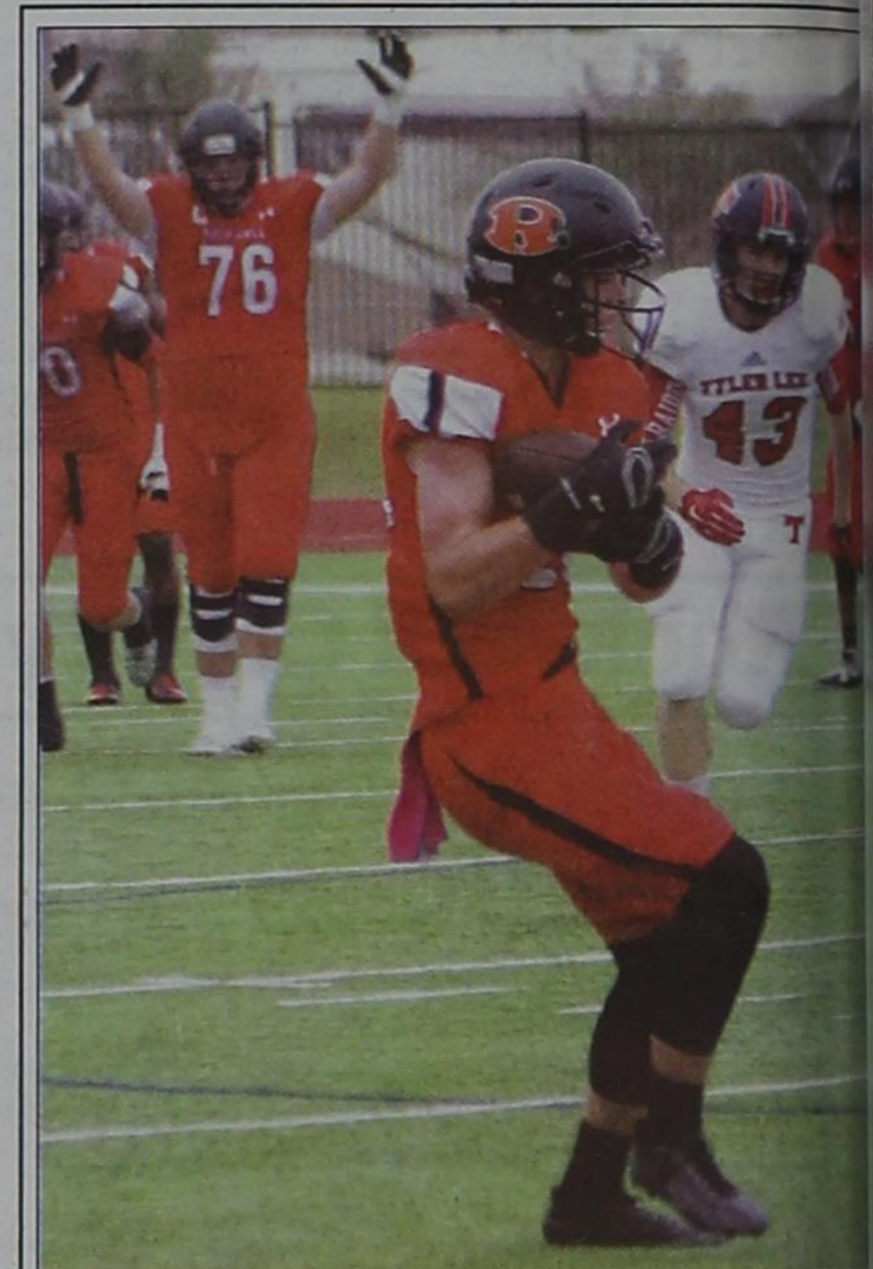

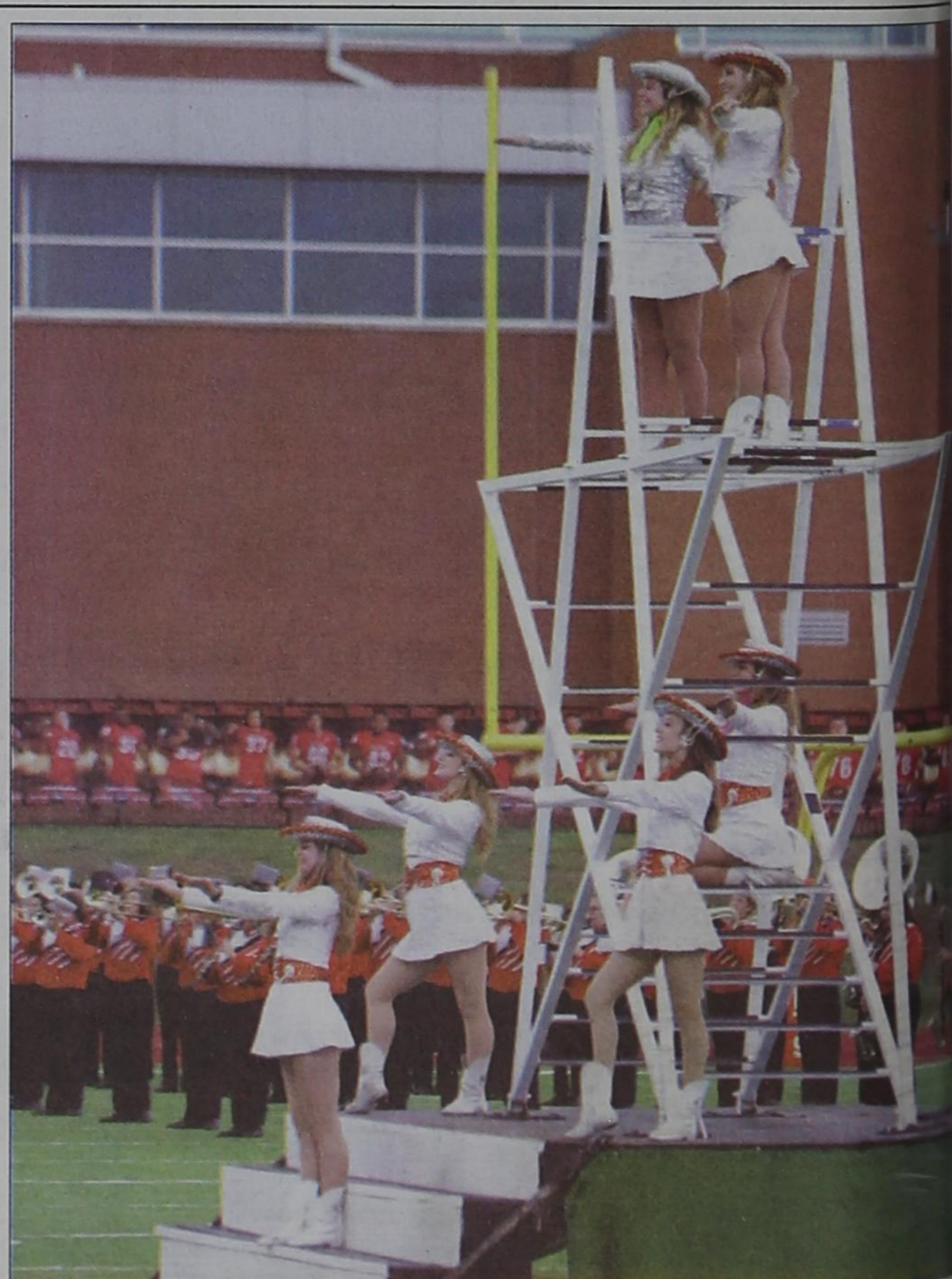
