If either Royse City or Fate needed help from the other, such as a fire, officer assistance or possibly a facility to house people in case of an emergency, the plan would already be in place. The motion passed unanimously.

Several other items were on the agenda, but the most surprising one came at the very end of the night. A separation agreement was made and approved by the city council. This was to have been Rodriguez's last week on the job.

Sept. 19 -- Evening

The 2nd public hearing for the annexation of property was conducted at 6 p.m. All Fate City Council members were present except Mayor Pro-Tem Sheri Garber. After city secretary Jean Dwinnell read each ordinance for annexation, all were passed except for six that were tabled. There were 37 annexation proposals.

According to Broderick, "These six were having to do with Nelson & Alamo Fireworks. The council is going to work with them on a plan of how and when the sale of fireworks would be discontinued."

Sept. 20

There were two items on the agenda. Resolution No. R-650 was "to discuss and consider an Administrative Officer of the City to perform the duties of the City Manager." Broderick mad a motion to elect Brian Griffeth, director of the Department of Public Safety, the administrative officer until an interim manager can be selected. The vote was unanimous and Griffeth agreed to accept the position.

The second item was Resolution No. R-654, which was to "discuss and consider the resolution, approving a contract with a recruiting or consulting firm to search for candidates to serve an as Interim City Manager for the city of Fate."

The council voted unanimously, selecting "Texas First Group, Replacement Services- Interim Management Services" to search for a candidate for an interim city manager. All council members were present except Garber. The interim manager will serve until which time a permanent city manager can be appointed. This meeting was dismissed after approximately 15 minutes.

The Fate City Council meetings are conducted on the first and third Mondays of each month at the Fate Community Center, 104 South W.E. Crawford at 6 p.m.





## A rebuttal on issue of Photo ID

A previous writer alleges Mexico registered a 13-yearthat the soon-to-be-enacted Photo ID Law requirement to vote in Texas is tantamount to voter suppression, effectively disenfranchising about 600,000 people. She says that most are poor, students, elderly, black and Hispanic voters that typically vote as Democrats. She claims very few cases of voter fraud have been uncovered in the last 10 years.

What she doesn't do is mention that on average nationwide, there is a 1.9 percent rejection rate of voter registration forms from being invalid, or duplicates, and thereby fraudulent. Without a photo ID, someone can feasibly vote several times using someone else's voter registration cards because no one knows what the voter looks like. The writer forgets too soon about ACORN and the fraud that they perpetuated continuously, which led to their being defunded by the federal government (though they've been rebranded into dozens of other organizations and continue to exist).

Just some of these examples are: In 1998, an Arkansas ACORN contractor falsified info on 400 voter registration cards; in 2005 the Virginia Board of Elections reported that 56 percent of ACORN voter registrations were ineligible; in 2006 an ACORN worker in New




