In a very busy week, the City Council and I called meeting on Sept. 18 at 5 p.m., then the City Council meeting on Sept. 19. The two meetings in five hours. Resolution No. R-649 concerned the approval of a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the City of Fate and the Royse City Independent School District. Brian Griffith, director of the Department of Public Safety for Fate, said this would be a really good move. If either Royse City or Fate needed help from the other, such as a fire officer assistance or possibly a facility to house people in case of an emergency, the plan would already be in place. The motion passed unanimously. Several other items were on the agenda, but the most surprising one came at the very end of the night. A separation agreement was made and approved by the city council. This was to have been Rodriguez's last week on the job. Broderick said no details of the separation agreement can be given until the entire process is finalized by the attorneys. **Sept. 18 -- Morning** Broderick conducted his fourth Breakfast with the Mayor. A productive question-and-answer session with citizens of Fate centered on the budget, the new city hall and the proposed improvements for Fate over the next several years. These casual meetings are

conducted on the third Wednesday of each month at the Fate Community Center, giving citizens a chance to get to know the mayor, his aspirations for the city and his beliefs of what will take to make Fate an exceptional place to live. **Sept. 19 -- Evening** The 2nd public hearing for the annexation of property was conducted at 6 p.m. All Fate City Council members were present except Mayor Pro-Tem Sheri Garber. After city secretary Jean Dwinell read each ordinance for annexation, all were passed except for six that were tabled. There were 37 annexation proposals. According to Broderick, "These six were having to do with Nelson & Alamo Fireworks. The council is going to work with them on a plan of how and when the sale of fireworks would be discontinued." **Sept. 20** There were two items on the agenda. Resolution No. R-650 was "to discuss and consider an Administrative Officer of the City to perform the duties of the City Manager." Broderick made a motion to elect Brian Griffith, director of the Department of Public Safety, as the administrative officer until an interim manager can be selected. The vote was unanimous and Griffith agreed to accept the position. The second item was Resolution No. R-654, which was to "discuss and consider the resolution, approving a contract with a recruiting or consulting firm to search for candidates to serve as an Interim City Manager for the city of Fate." The council voted unanimously, selecting "Texas First Group, Replacement Services- Interim Management Services" to search for a candidate for an interim city manager. All council members were present except Garber. The interim manager will serve until which time a permanent city manager can be appointed. This meeting was dismissed after approximately 15 minutes. The Fate City Council meetings are conducted on the first and third Mondays of each month at the Fate Community Center, 104 South W.E. Crawford at 6 p.m.

City of Rockwall: Water conservation efforts still in progress

The City of Rockwall remains in Stage 3 watering restrictions of ongoing drought conditions, according to a news release officials last week.
 The current once-a-week watering schedule, based on street addresses, will continue until further notice, according to the release.
 Under the restrictions, watering is prohibited from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. As of Sept. 6, Lake Lavon, one of the city's water sources, is at 52.8 percent capacity. Because of the lack of significant rainfall in months, the lakes are receiving no inflow. That, coupled with higher temperatures are causing heightened evaporation, making it imperative that residents practice conservation measures.

A rebuttal on issue of Photo ID

A previous writer alleges that the soon-to-be-enacted Photo ID Law requirement to vote in Texas is tantamount to voter suppression, effectively disenfranchising about 600,000 people. She says that most are poor, students, elderly, black and Hispanic voters that typically vote as Democrats. She claims very few cases of voter fraud have been uncovered in the last 10 years.

What she doesn't do is mention that on average nationwide, there is a 1.9 percent rejection rate of voter registration forms from being invalid, or duplicates, and thereby fraudulent. Without a photo ID, someone can feasibly vote several times using someone else's voter registration cards because no one knows what the voter looks like. The writer forgets too soon about ACORN and the fraud that they perpetuated continuously, which led to their being defunded by the federal government (though they've been rebranded into dozens of other organizations and continue to exist).

Just some of these examples are: In 1998, an Arkansas ACORN contractor falsified info on 400 voter registration cards; in 2005 the Virginia Board of Elections reported that 56 percent of ACORN voter registrations were ineligible; in 2006 an ACORN worker in New

Mexico registered a 13-year-old to vote; in Ohio gave those who registered to vote cash and cigarettes. Some said they registered dozens of times, and one person said he filled out 72 voter registration cards.

In 2008 in Indiana, over 4,000 ACORN submitted voter registration cards were rejected because many were in the same handwriting and many belonged to dead people. In 2008, Pennsylvania election officials threw out 57,435 voter registrations generated by ACORN. Also in 2008, here in Harris County, Texas, almost 10,000 voter registrations were tossed for being invalid, containing fictitious addresses and personal information. In 2009 in Florida, officials found

that 197 out of 100 had information that didn't match any living person.

The list could represent the hundreds of thousands of people who registered those cards but were all to the legal registration process. Any citizen can get a picture ID card in 14 months from voter integrity, vote, that gives time to get off the picture ID preventing you from voting.

In the first half, Heritage had had a difficult time stopping the Saints' running game, and particularly Zak Norris' outside running. He scored again on an 11-yard run to make the score 36-18, but after that the Eagles shut him down – and shut out Carrollton for the remainder of the game.

"We had a little trouble on the edge at times," Huckabee said.

Heritage Christian had a slight edge in total yardage 242-222, but the final score was far more indicative of how well the Eagles played.

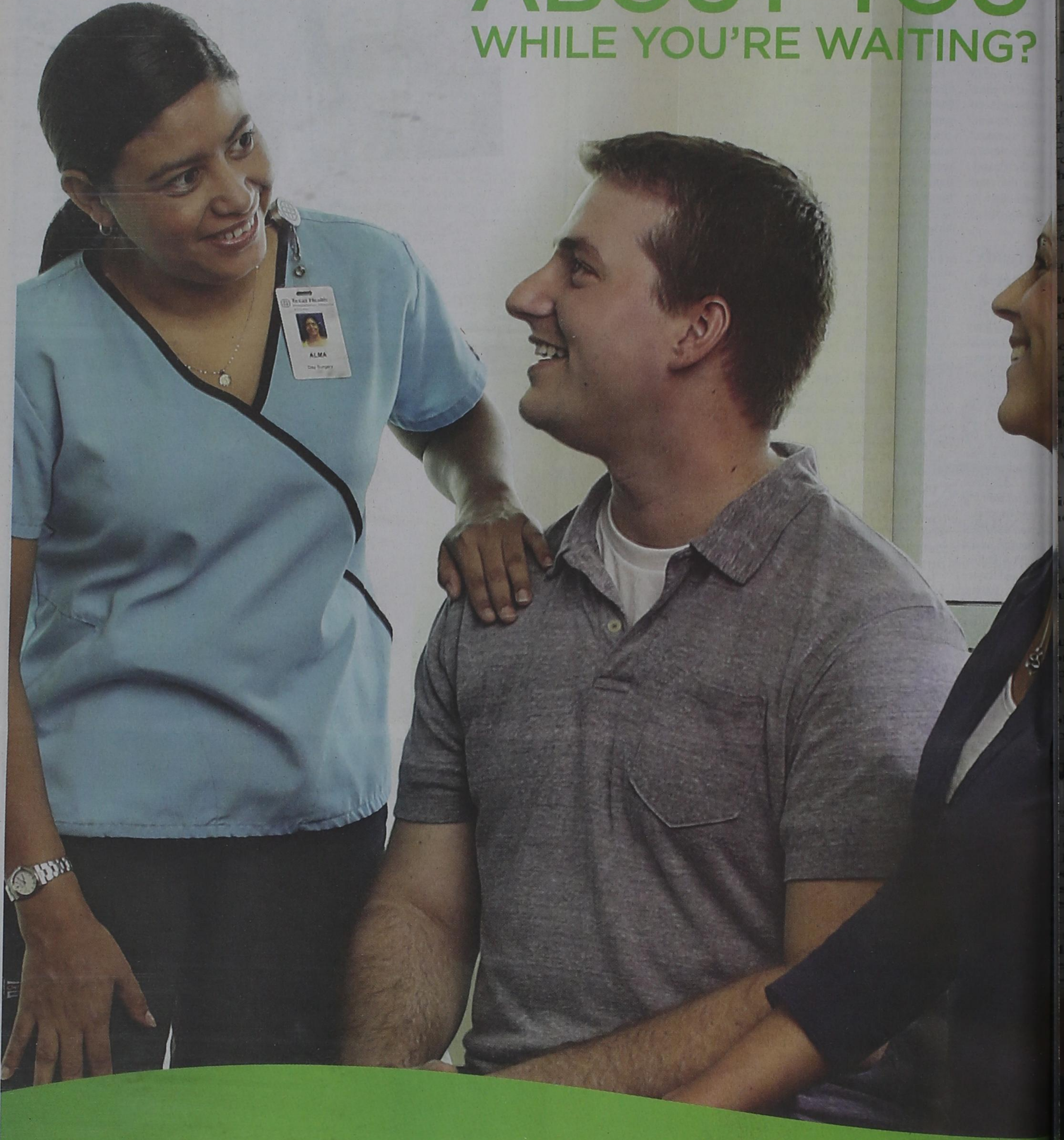
