



### Man arrested for following woman into public restroom







### On God's Word

Right to liberty ... Part 5 (continued)

We will be bombarded with attempts to place us under religious and political rules that scorn and punish people for mere actions without injury to others.

A close examination of the U.S. and Texas statutes reveals a strong religious influence. They create an illusion of safety and security for the people. The various prohibition laws are basically "sin" laws, including drugs, alcohol, weapons, gambling, gaming, employment laws protecting laborers. In short they are preventative regulations with attached punishments in many cases.

Based on the accounts in Acts, the Apostles and believers did not strive hard against the abusive governments and their religious partners, which were extremely abusive and tyrannical compared to what is seen in America. It is noted that they resisted the abusive religious sect that had influential control over the government.

Some of the original Apostles were thrown in prison numerous times for openly telling the truth of our Lord Jesus' death and how his Father raised him from the dead and that he still lives seated at the right hand of his Father, with all power and authority from his Father.

Peter and John were arrested and put in prison for telling the truth. While in prison, they were rescued by an angel from God, and instructed to "go, stand and speak in the temple to the people all the Rockwall County News • Thursday, June 23, 2016 Page 3

words of this life" (Acts 5:20).

In a prior incident, Peter and John were confronted by the Jewish High Priest and family in high positions about the man who was healed while sitting just outside of the Temple (Acts chapter 3).

Notice how Peter explains what happened. He boldly declared that the people present participated in the killing of the "Prince of life, whom God raised from the dead."

The rulers did not punish them and put them in prison because the miracle was "notable" among the people.

Later, Paul was imprisoned numerous times. He utilized his knowledge of the local laws and judicial system, and appealed to higher authorities. This allowed him opportunities to declare the truth directly to the Roman leaders and judges.

Acts also reveals that many other Christians suffered persecution and imprisonment without being released. Many others were killed. All cases involved a collusion between the influential Jewish sectarian leaders and the Roman government.

Peter was released from prison by an angel from God. Paul boldly used the Roman judicial system to the advantage of the ministry, others suffered and were killed.

In all cases, their primary objective was to go, stand and declare the truth about our Lord Jesus. They walked by the Holy Ghost, and suffered with the victorious hope of the Day of Christ (a.k.a. rapture) (See Philippians 1:10, 1Thess 1:10, 4:13-18, 5:9, and 1Cor 15:51-(To be continued in the 6-30-2016 edition)





The Orlando shooting is being used to justify mass surveillance and warrantless wiretapping. For the past three years, the House of Representatives passed an amendment to the Defense Department appropriations bill limiting mass surveillance. But, last week, the same amendment was voted down. The only difference between this year's debate and previous debates was that this year defenders of the surveillance state were able to claim that the Orlando shooting justifies shredding the Fourth Amendment.

The fact that the Orlando shooter had twice been investigated by the FBI shows that increased surveillance and wiretapping would not have prevented the shooting. Mass surveillance also creates a "needle in a haystack" problem that can make it difficult, or impossible, for law enforcement to identify real threats. Unfortunately, evidence that giving up liberty does not increase security has never deterred those who spread fear to gain support for increased government power.

The Orlando shooter successfully passed several background checks and was a licensed security guard. But, just like those who used Orlando to defend unconstitutional surveillance, authoritarian supporters of gun control are not allowing facts to stand in the way

of using the Orlando shooting to advance their agenda. Second Amendment opponents are using Orlando to give the federal government new powers to violate individuals' rights without due process. One pro-gun control senator actually said that "due process is what's killing us."

Ironically, if not surprisingly, one of those calling for new gun control laws is Hillary Clinton. When she was sectary of state, Clinton supported interventions in the Middle East that resulted in ISIS obtaining firearms paid for by US taxpayers!

Mass surveillance, gun control, and other restrictions on our liberty will not prevent future Orlandos. In fact, by preventing law-abiding Americans from defending themselves, gun control laws make us less safe from criminals. Similarly, mass surveillance and warrantless wiretapping erode our rights while making it more difficult for law enforcement to identify real threats.

If Congress really cared about our security and liberty, it would repeal all federal gun laws, end all unconstitutional surveillance, and end the hyper-interventionist foreign policy that causes many around the world to resent the US.

A person with character approaches life wholeheartedly; he is 100-percent behind the tasks set ESQUITETicks or Donald. I'm referring to character - as in what you stand before him. He is honest in his abilities, humble when faced with

> person with a positive attitude can move mountains; someone with a negative attitude gives up before even trying. When a person of great character is faced with a difficult task, her first thought is not, "I can't," but "How?"
