Looking forward to the Miss Texas USA Pageant, Adams said she is anxious to meet the other contestants.


"I believe that the Miss Texas USA Pageant will establish some forever friendships," she said.

One-way service roads prompt discussions in Faloc

The City Council of the City of Fate met July 1.

Hal T. Stanford, the area engineer for Kaufman and Rockwall counties-Dallas District for the Texas Department of Transportation, had been asked to be present to address any questions and concerns related to Resolution No. R-590 on the council's agenda, which was to be discussed and considered by the council. The resolution concerned the oneway frontage roads for the upcoming FM 551 interchange project.

"As the frontage roads in Royse City are being converted and the frontage roads in Fate will be converted as part of the upcoming FM 551 interchange project, the city is providing their support for conversion," Stanford said.

In Stanford's support of the one-way-service roads, "the current TxDOT Roadway Design Manual states: that "higher crash rates are normally experienced when the frontage roads are two-way. In large part, this is because of the risk of essentially head-on collisions at the ramp terminals and the likelihood of increased potential for wrong-way entry to the main lanes."

Resolution No. R-590 states "supporting the north and south service roads of Intestate 30 to be one-way from the city's west city limits to the city's east limits for the City of Fate, Texas."

Philip Martinez, Fate city manager said that he would like to see the

two-way service roads go to one-way now and not wait until the I-30 overpass at FM 551 is built. This will give citizens a chance to get used to the one-way service roads before the actual construction of the overpass begins.

Stanford said construction would likely begin in six to eight months. He said the relocation of Farmers Electric Cooperative and the right-ofway acquisition must be addressed and completed first.

Mayor Bill Broderick said that he wants to get the project underway, saying that he would even put his hard hat on and be out there to help move the project along.

After much discussion, the resolution passed 4-1.

During closing remarks, Broderick said the newly dedicated Billy Stevens Elementary School is "One beautiful school. It has natural lighting and is just one gorgeous school."

Broderick then asked the council to be thinking of any ideas of using the Fate Community Center for senior citizen projects or events.

"We have a really nice building here and I would love to see it benefit our senior citizens," he said.

Martinez reminded everyone that city code enforcements are being put into place because of the high weeds and grass. He stressed that he wants to keep our city nice and clean. He also reminded everyone that watering of yards can only be done on trash pick-up day, which is one day a week.

Fate City Council members present were Broderick and Councilmen Lorne Megyesi, Steve Skipworth, Michelle Butler and Cameron Cowan.





An examination of the Unemployment Compensation A

In 1977 the Texas Legislature established the Sunset Advisory Commission for the regular assessment of the need for a state agency

In 2015, the Sunset Advisory Commission (SAC) will closely examine and assess the need for the Texas Workforce Commission to exist.

The Texas Workforce Commission (TWC) is widely popular among the workers in Texas. However, a close examination and assessment of its procedures compared to the Texas Constitution and the Texas Unemployment Compensation Act (TUCA) reveals that the agency has sought to enforce the Texas Unemployment Compensation Act far outside of the act's narrow scope and in violation of the Texas Constitution Article 1 Section 16.

This article will briefly examine the law for a determination of exactly who is required to participate in the Texas unemployment compensation insurance plan.

This kind of study may seem extremely boring. But if people consider the broad state-wide implications of the Texas government forcing any and all natural people and business entities into purchasing an unemployment insurance plan and reporting payments, they might grow increasingly motivated to learn whether the law really requires them or their businesses to purchase such an insurance plan.

Texas law

Start with Texas Constitution Article 1 Section 16, "No bill of attainder, ex post facto law, retroactive law, or any law impairing the right of contracts, shall be made.'

The administration of the TUCA basically regulates contractual agreements in the conduct of business. The agreements may include whether or not to offer certain insurance plans such as health care insurance or unemployment insurance.

In order to pin down who is required to pay for a state run unemployment compensation insurance plan, the definition of "employer" for purposes of the TUCA must be determined.

Section 204.001 Contributions Required states, "an employer shall pay a contribution on wages for employment paid during a calendar year. Section 201.021 General Definition of Employer means an employing unit that paid wages and employed at least one individual.

Now it is important to learn the meaning of "employing unit."

Section 201.011 General Definitions (11) states, Employing Unit means "a person who has employed an individual to perform services."

If an Employing Unit is a "person," then how do the statutes define the term "person?"

The TUCA does not define the term "person" for the purpose of the Act.

Who is an "employing unit?"

Based on an October 9, 2012 TWC Rule 13 Appeal final decision, the Commissioners concluded that the term "person" in the definition of "Employing Unit" meant the full meaning of the term "person" found in the Texas Code Construction Act.

Code Construction Act Section 311.005 General Definitions (2) "Person" includes corporation, organization, government or governmental subdivision or agency, business trust, estate, trust, partnership, association, and any other legal entity.

The Rule 13 Appeal final decision was approved by Commissioners Andres Alcantar (Chairman) and Ronald Congleton. A dissenting vote was cast by Tom Pauken.

It's interesting to note that the Commission was not unanimous on the question of how to determine who really is required to participate in the state run unemployment insurance plan.

Furthermore, the TWC does not administer the TUCA within the

limited boundaries of its own interpretation of what "persons" fall in the meaning of "Employing Unit." The history of TWC may reveal numerous control-and-rob actions against natural people who pay others for services rendered. The term "person" in the Code Construction Act does not include natural people.

There is a little known code section that shines more light on the subject and reveals that the Commission's final decision did not settle the matter.

Conformity with the federal statutes

Section 201.101 Conformity with Federal Statutes requires the TWC to administer the TUCA in conformity with the federal statutes. This statute changes things.

unemployment compensation act (FUCA).

A precise examination of 26 U.S.C. 3306 Definitions reveals exactly what part of the term "person" applies to the meaning of the term 'Employing Unit" for the purpose of defining the term "Employer" in the TUCA.

Remember, the objective of this examination is to determine exactly who is required to purchase the Texas unemployment compensation insurance plan.

The federal statutes examined

Federal Unemployment Tax Act Section 3306 Definitions (g) Contributions "For the purpose of this act, the term 'contributions' means payments required by a state law to be made into an unemployment fund by any person ..."

It first glance, it appears that the state of Texas can require any person to make a payment into its unemployment fund. To test this assumption, the meaning of the term "state" must be determined.

Section 3306 (j)(1) State

"includes the District of Columbia, the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, and the Virgin Islands."

It looks like the word "state" does not include Texas state law or any other state in the united States.

Amazingly, the term "state" does include the District of Columbia and two U.S. territories.

A reasonable question to ask is, what types of legal business entities might be required by District of Columbia law to make a payment into an unemployment fund?

Next study the meaning of the term "employment."

Section 3306 (c) Employment, "For the purpose of this chapter, the term 'employment' means any service performed ... (i) within the United States, or (ii) on or in connection with an American vessel or American aircraft ...'

The meaning of the term "United States" is significant.


