

Once they earn the yard sign, it is theirs to keep, whether they are on the honor roll again or not, but Walker thinks the students will strive to be on the honor roll to receive the decal recognition each six weeks.

"This is something new," Walker said. "I did not use this program in McKinney at my prior school. I think that in this day and age, things that are not going well in the schools seem to be focused on. I think it is a good idea to acknowledge the kids and the parents by letting them know that we recognize they are doing a good job."

"We ordered 400 yard signs based on the highest number of students on the honor roll last year," Walker said. "The first six weeks of this year, we had 427 students earn honor roll recognition. That is higher than any six weeks we had last year, so I am really excited about that. We gave most of the signs out last week, but more signs are being printed and will be given out to the rest of the students as soon as we get them."

"If a student makes the honor roll the last six weeks, he will be notified to come to the school and pick up his decal. If the last six

weeks is the only time he made the honor roll all year, he will be given the yard sign and a decal at the beginning of the summer."

"I'm excited about how the community is appreciating what we are doing to recognize these kids. Many parents have said that this was the first time their kids have been acknowledged and they have always been on the honor roll. They are very appreciative that someone is noticing their kid's hard work."

"This is human interaction," Walker said. "Someone at the school is recognizing that the students are doing a good job."

As a new reward system for those students with perfect attendance includes calling them to the office, recognizing them for being at school every single day for that six weeks and they will be given freebees donated by businesses in the community, he said.

"We received gift certificates from places like McDonalds, Jack In The Box, Taco Bell and other businesses in town," he said.

As a third recognition program, Walker said the Beacon Award will be given from 4 p.m. to 5 p.m. on April 27. Every professional (teacher, nurse, principal, coach, etc.) in the school will recognize one student who they come in contact with who is striving to really go over and beyond to do his best. He may not necessarily be on the honor roll, or have perfect attendance, but he is working extra hard to do his best. The professional may know of things going on in the student's life, or have obstacles that he is having to overcome possibly just to be at school. That professional and the student will sit together and be recognized during the assembly.

"All three of these programs are something new that we are doing. It is to say to that kid that 'You are a beacon of light. You are doing something special. You are being a good citizen.' This also lets the teachers/professionals know that what they are doing with kids matters," he said.

The school does have high expectations for the students and that is a given," Walker said. "But it is important to know that everybody understands that the school needs to rally around those students and support them as they achieve those things, while making sure their parents are kept in the loop."





# **Rockwall Council** supports Prop 7 in Nov. 3 election

The Rockwall City Council unanimously approved a resolution supporting Proposition 7, a constitutional amendment that will appear on the Nov. 3 ballot for voter approval, according to a city news release.

If approved, Proposition 7 would require the state to allocate portions of certain sales, use tax and motor vehicle sales revenue to be used for non-tolled roadway projects and to pay for transportation related debt.

Information provided by the North Central Texas Council of Governments indicates the proposed amendment would result in an additional \$3 billion per year for the State Highway Fund by year 2020, according to the release. When funding from the state has been available, the Rockwall County Transportation Consortium (which includes Rockwall County and all of the cities in the county) has historically been successful in securing roadway improvements to the benefit of local roadway transportation.

Although this would not fully fund the State's overall transportation needs, it represents a key step toward securing funding for transportation projects in Texas, according to the release.

Early voting is underway and runs through Oct. 30. The general will be on Tuesday, Nov. 3.

The current language of Texas Constitution Article 8 Section 7(a) allows for "all net revenues remaining after payment of all refunds allowed by law and expenses of collection derived from motor vehicle registration fees, and all taxes, except gross production and ad valorem taxes, on motor fuels and lubricants used to propel motor vehicles over public roadways, shall be used for the sole purpose of acquiring rights-of-way, constructing, maintaining, and policing such public roadways, and for the administration of such laws as may be prescribed by the Legislature pertaining to the supervision of traffic and safety on such roads ..."

The section goes on to describe the state authority to use the above stated revenues "for the payment of the principal and interest on county and road district bonds or warrants voted or issued prior to January 2, 1939, and declared eligible prior to January 2, 1945, for payment out of the County and Road District Highway Fund under existing law; provided, however, that one-fourth (1/4) of such net revenue from the motor fuel tax shall be allocated to the Available School Fund; and, provided, however, that the netrevenue derived by counties from motor vehicle registration fees shall never be less than the maximum amounts allowed to be retained by each County and the percentage allowed to be retained by each County under the laws in effect on January 1, 1945. Nothing contained herein shall be construed as authorizing th pledging of the State's credit for any

The amended Section 7-c (a) removes the narrow limitation of legislative "appropriation, allocation and direction," and instead requires the state comptroller to "deposit to the credit of the state highway fund \$2.5billion of the net revenue derived from the imposition of the state sales and use tax on the sale, storage, use, or other consumption in the state, of taxable items under Chapter 151, Tax Code, that exceeds \$28 billion of that revenue coming into the treasury in that state fiscal year."

The amendment also requires the "comptroller to deposit to the

The amendment includes subsection (c), which repeats the narrow use of the tax revenues, but removes its use for policing the public roadways and administration of the related laws pertaining to traffic and safety on the same roads. It also specifies that the revenues are not authorized for appropriation to toll roads.

In summary, the amendment requires the comptroller to make two separate deposits, from the revenues of two separate sales taxes, without the checks and balances that come with legislative "appropriation, allocation and direction."

# Hawks defeat Forney 21-14, on ground

The Rockwall-Heath Hawks (3-2 District 12 5A), defeated Forney High School, 21-14, without a passing game, Fri., Oct. 23, at Wilkerson-Sanders Stadium in Rockwall.

By maintaining a consistent and strong ground game, the Hawks were able to avoid potential ball handling problems associated with an equally consistent rainfall.

Hawks Senior Quarterback Canaan Smith led the team with 28 carries for 205 yards, and scored all 3 touchdowns.

Balancing out the running game were Tanner McCallister (So) with 17 carries for 84 yards; J'Corian Jimmerson (Jr) with 8 carries for 42 yards; Tyler McCalister (Sr) with 3 carries for 5 yards; and Jackson Salley ran the ball 3 times for 10 yards.

Forney attempted to launch a passing game, but was unable to overcome the effects of the elements of nature. Quarterback Luke Skipper (Sr) completed 10 out of 21 passes for 153 yards. Skipper also carried the ball 15 times for 42 yards and scored 1 touchdown. Michael Prox (Sr) ran 18 times for 64 yards, and Aaron Rideaux (So) carried 3 times for 17 yards.

The Hawks ground game seemed helped to avoid penalties compared to Forney's 34 penalty yards.

Forney won the defense game with 87 total tackles compared to the Hawks' 66.
