# eath Golf & Yacht Club hot topic uring Heath City Council meeting

Heath continued discussions regarding the development Golf & Yacht Club, at a public hearing held last Tuesday, City Hall.

nout was far from inconsiderable; the City Hall quarters iding-room only" within minutes of the meeting being er. iosity about the proposal was not lost on Whittle, who riad questions with numbers and facts. He revealed plans names in the golfing world, to lend expertise for the design ourse, including golf-course management, Hampton Golf. reminded citizens that "his company has added \$545 million ix-value to Rockwall County", while in Heath, Whittle has hird of it, \$285 million in Buffalo Creek, alone

Golf & Yacht Club has been compared to the recent Heath

development community, Buffalo Creek, which comprises residential luxury with opulent homes and villas, alike; however, concern regarding the cost of the project has struck concern with some residents of Heath. The total figure for the venture is \$500 million; yet, that same amount could end up back in the city's bankroll after completion of the project and taxes subsequently collected from it. Chris Cudy iterated "the residents of the City of Heath, their taxes will not be affected by [the development], only the members of the Public Improvement District."

Whittle reminded citizens that the unique idea behind a Public Improvement District is its singular method, by which property taxes generated from the development are absorbed back into said development rather than just going to the City's "General Fund". That way, it pays for its continued improvement by itself, and the undertaking will be neither fiscally indentured, nor obligated, by the other property owners of the city of Heath.

Cudy explained that Whittle had established an account in the amount of \$6.2 million in the City of Heath's reserve account, over which The City has complete control. He said, "[The bond] pays for the roads, sewer, water and other items that are dedicated once a project is completed. City has those assets & revenue base and the fact that there has been a fund established in the City's name to mitigate that risk, is huge." Further, the

holistic City Council has autonomy over the decision-making regarding the fund, along with control over when bonds are sold & who can make that recommendation.

The roughly 800-acre expansion is bordered by the east side of Lake Ray Hubbard, through Hubbard Drive's FM740 NW portion, and onto the city limits due south, where the planned entrance would be. Some citizens have expressed concern over the overall cost to the community, while others have expressed excitement over the value they believe it will bring to the community. Whatever your views, you are free to express them at the next City Council meeting which will be held Tuesday, April 9th . "Visiting the Health Center is cost-effective for those who need a medical home," said Vanhdy Miller, practice manager. "Patients can see one of our doctors or nurse practitioners at a very affordable rate. We also offer a sliding scale for our fees based on income for those that qualify and are residents of Rockwall County."

The pleasant atmosphere at the Health Center is welcoming and inviting. Those needing an appointment will find that there are no significant wait times. There are no significant wait times. Five doctors from the Rockwall community as well as two on-staff nurse practitioners serve patients. The office can see private pay and Medicare and Medicaid patients alike.

A significant benefit the Health Center offers our community is their Health Maintenance Plan, which provides preventative healthcare to those uninsured or underinsured. The cost for the plan is \$300 and includes the following in a one-year timeframe:

- Four office visits
- · One seasonal flu shot
- One PAP smear for women or one PSA test for men
- One-time maintenance lab, including a general health panel, lipid panel, hemoglobin A1C and a urinalysis

The total value of the plan is \$700.

"This plan is perfect for those unable to obtain affordable insurance, like independent small business owners," said Miller. "This is not an income-based program. The Health Maintenance Plan is available to anyone who would like access to affordable preventative healthcare."

The Health Center also offers bilingual community education classes, like monthly classes for diabetics. Recently, the Health Center offered a class designed to help parents effectively cope with the challenges of living with asthma. Jovita James-Osondu, a nursing student at Trinity Valley Community College and RN intern at the Health Center, lead the class.

"We want to help empower parents," said James-Osondu. "We helped them develop an action plan to help prevent unnecessary emergency room visits."

of injustice. If women are not serving equally in Afghanistan, then a gender balance should correct "the problem." But, perhaps, the problem is that any American is in Afghanistan. The addition of women would only result in a gender-balanced injustice. Still other gender and liberal feminists admit the injustice of a draft but consider equal treatment to be more important than the injustice being imposed. The National Organization for Women (NOW) exemplifies this approach. Its board policy states,

BE IT RESOLVED, that NOW opposes the reinstatement of registration and draft for both men and women. NOW's primary focus on this issue is on opposition to registration and draft. However, if we cannot stop the return to registration and draft, we also cannot choose between sisters and brothers. We oppose any registration or draft that excludes women as an unconstitutional denial of rights to both young men and women. And we continue to oppose all sex discrimination by the volunteer armed

Would NOW object to a situation in which 10 randomly chosen males were being executed by Nazis? Would they interrupt the proceedings to demand the "right" of women to become equalopportunity victims? At best, equality under injustice reshuffles the identity of victims. Usually, it expands the scope of the injustice itself. These positions are identity politics in action. A fairly standard definition of identity politics is the politics of group-based movements claiming to represent the interests and identity of a particular group, rather than policy issues relating to all members of the community. The group identity may be based on ethnicity, class, religion, sex, sexuality or other criteria.

Identity politics divides society into distinct political classes that have antagonistic interests: blacks against whites, women against men, gays against heterosexuals. It focuses, not on the individual rights of the group

members, but on the interests that all members allegedly share. Receiving the same treatment from government as other groups "enjoy" is high on the hierarchy of shared interests.

The endorsement of drafting women represents the triumph of identity politics over the respect for individual rights.

#### Identity politics denies a shared humanity

Only those unwilling to go to war need to be conscripted. Conscription is a statement of absolute ownership of the individual by the state. The state owns not merely the individual's body, which it can ship at will to any corner of the world, but also the individual's conscience, which it can command without explanation

to kill strangers.

Plantations in the antebellum South can be seen as expressions of economic slavery, because the primary purpose of enslavement was to produce wealth. A conscripted military represents political slavery, because the primary purpose is to produce political ends.

No one — no man, no woman — should be enslaved for any reason. Gender and liberal feminists want to force unwilling women into state slavery. Why? Because men become slaves during times of conscription. Rather than oppose the clear injustice of enslaving anyone - male or female — they want the slave master (the state) to be an equal-opportunity oppressor.

Gender and liberal feminists are willing to trash the freedom and lives of individual women in the name of the idealized group, "woman." But the category "woman" is an abstraction that does not exist in reality. All that tangibly exists are individual women - counted one by one.

It can be valuable to divide people into abstract categories or classes. A class can be defined by almost any factor: income level, hair color, age, nationality, ice cream preference. The factor chosen depends on the purpose of the definer.

Doctors screen women for menopause and men for prostate problems. But doctors do not deny that both men and women have the same fundamental biology and biological needs as human beings.

Equally, the political realities of men and women differ on a few specific issues; abortion is an example. But men and women have the same fundamental political interests: individual rights and dignity. People are not defined primarily by their genitalia but by their shared humanity. As human beings, each one is entitled to the basic freedoms that all people hold in common, such as the peaceful use of their own bodies and the freedom of conscience.

Identity politics is a sharp departure from this conception of rights as being universal to all human beings. As important as such secondary characteristics as gender or race may be, they are precisely that secondary. The shared humanity is primary. We are, first and finally, all human beings.

#### Conclusion

Conscription is not a man vs. woman or a Left vs. Right issue. It is the state vs. the individual in a life-or-death contest over who owns the individual's body and conscience. In this contest, gender and liberal feminists side solidly with the state.

An unjust inequality is not properly answered by an egalitarianism that offers the "right" to be equally enslaved; the answer resides in an equality under just law that protects the ability of every person to say "no." The justice of actions does not hinge on whether the perpetrator or victim is male or female; it lives in the content of the acts themselves. The bankruptcy of gender and liberal feminism has never been more bare than in the endorsement of the crushing of individual women under the wheels of the state in order to further a hollow abstraction. Don't enslave women. Free men.



(EDITOR'S NOTE: The following column information is taken from Florelle Burks' handwritten journal written for her granddaughter, Jennifer, personal interviews, and other information she provided. Florelle, now age 90, has five children, 10 grandchildren and 12 greatgrandchildren.)

My life has been full and happy. I was born in Royce City, Texas, on Jan 12, 1923. My father, James Michael (Mike) Cookston, and my mother, Virginia Sue (Dink) Terrell Cookston, owned the Cookston Café and Hotel on Main Street. I was born in the hotel, delivered by Dr. Charlie Sorrells, the family doctor. I lived there until I married.

My father was in business for 55 years. The hotel was over the café and a men's shop. It had 22 rooms and they all had marble dresser tops. There were five permanent residents, some retired men. As time went by, nearly all the rooms were occupied with retired men.

Everybody said my father gave away more than he made. Many people were having a hard time making ends meet. They would come by the café and my father would feed them, free of charge. Back then, a meal only cost 65¢ for the meal, dessert and drink, but people just didn't have any money.

In later years we had a bakery where we cooked fresh bread, pastries, and donuts. It was so wonderful to wake up in the morning and smell those wonderful donuts cooking.


For the RHHS girls, Morgan Hines placed fourth all-around (74.30) and Darion Mellorn was eighth (71.05).






