Royse City, Caddo Mills scenes of fatal accidents

A fatal accident between mile markers 74 and 75 on I-30 near Royse City around 7:30 p.m. on Tuesday, Oct. 6, is thought to be possibly the cause of another fatal accident at mile marker 82 near Caddo Mills, east of Royse City High School.

The Texas Department of Public Safety Director Brian Griffeth said the fatal accident happened just inside the jurisdiction of Royse City, and the state DPS also was called out to help work the accident. Griffeth said the accident, which was not in the construction area near the interstate, is being investigated by the Royse City Police Department.

As the investigation is ongoing, the exact cause of the accident has not been determined. Royse City Police Officer Sgt. Tim West is the investigating officer for the accident. None of the names of those involved have been released, he said; however, he did confirm that three vehicles were involved in the accident.

The Royse City Fire Department was also on the scene. Fire Chief Ricky Bell said it appeared that a car hit an 18-wheeler, then several other vehicles, possibly five or more, followed by another 18-wheeler. He also said this is still under investigation to determine the cause of the first automobile hitting the truck.

Rumors had originally been floated that one fatality involved a child, but Bell said it was not a child, but an adult male.

"Everyone was alive when they were taken from the scene to various hospitals. All I know is that I was told that it was a male," he said. "I have not heard if any others involved in the accident have died."

West affirmed that the accident did involve multiple automobiles. "We haven't gotten the final report back from the investigating officer, so we don't know exactly how many cars were involved yet," he said. "We transported nine people and I assume they were transported to Dallas and area hospitals. It is too early to determine

the cause of the accident thus no charges have been filed."

Bell said that shortly after the Royse City accident, another fatality was reported at an accident at mile marker 82, east of the Royse City High School, also on I-30 headed west. Traffic from the first accident had backed up when the second accident occurred.

West said that the cause of the Caddo Mills accident is also still under investigation. Royse City's coverage area ends with mile marker 81 and the accident occurred at marker 82; therefore, the police department is not handling the case.

"We originally responded to the accident, but DPS is handling the investigation," he said. "I'm not sure the accident was related to the Royse City accident. The driver may have rear-ended a guardrail. The cause of that accident has not yet to be determined either."

The investigation for both accidents will take weeks if not longer, West said.

The goal of the Hazard Mitigation Plan is to minimize or eliminate the long-term risk to human life and property from known hazards by identifying and implementing cost-effective mitigation actions, according to the news release.

Rockwall based ministry holds 5th annual summit in Addison

 On Friday, Oct. 9th, Global Advance of Rockwall had their 25th annual summit. People from across the world gathered together at the Central Hotel in Addison to celebrate the work God has done through Global Advance.

Global Advance hosted 55 international delegates, as well as, pastors and ministry from across the U.S. Global Advance is a ministry that specializes in equipping Pastors and leaders worldwide to fulfill the call of the "Great Commission - to take of Jesus Christ to all the nations."

Global Advance was founded in 1990 in the home of founders David and Shibly of Rockwall, their son Jonathan joined the ministry in 2010 and was appointed President.

Frontline Relief sends aid through underground channels to the persecuted church in nations where the gospel is under attack. Through Frontline Relief, Global Advance is able to send Bibles, clothes, medical and food supplies to meet the needs of the persecuted church, both physically and spiritually.

In the past 25 years they have reached 97 nations, equipped 738,000 indigenous leaders that have impacted the nations with the power of the gospel.

Call upon the name of the Lord and be saved ...

Romans 10:9-10 is the foundational scripture used to explain how to get born-again and obtain salvation.

Yet, when pulled out of context, people are left wondering what it means what happens that results in righteousness, and what it means to call upon the name of the Lord.

In the accounts of Acts and the Epistles, the phrase "call upon the name of the Lord" is used a number of times in describing what to do to be saved. Repeated use of the command is like an exclamation point in God's word, trying to grab our undivided attention.

The phrase is first used in Acts 2:21 where Peter was explaining what the others saw and heard. He finished the quote from the prophet Joel, "... whosoever shall call on the name of the Lord shall be saved."

The word "call on" was translated from the ancient Greek word epikaleo, which meant to invoke anyone as a helper; or to appeal to one; to invoke the Lord Jesus the Messiah. The word saved meant to be rescued from danger.

In most cases, to "call on" or "call upon" are put for words spoken in the speakers own understanding. This is common sense. But, considering 1 Cor. chapter 14, we know it's available to also speak with the spirit of God by speaking in tongues.

In Acts 2:11, what did everyone see and hear?

MetroTex joins Rockwall Chamber in support of RISD bond issue

to a Thurs. Oct. 8, 2015 press release from the Rockwall Chamber of Commerce Bond Referendum Political Action Committee (PAC), MetroTex Association of REALTORS joined the Rockwall Area Chamber of Commerce in support for the RISD \$257,000,000 bond issue.

voters will have an opportunity to authorize RISD to sell bonds to fund a loan that will be designed to purchase new schools, renovate and upgrade existing schools, and maintain a "College and Career Academy." The bond issue will also include upgrades with new computers, basic maintenance for every campus including improved security, heating, cooling, roofing and flooring. The MetroTex Association of REALTORS (Co-Chair of Better Schools Brighter Future PAC) said, "The overwhelming support we are receiving from the business community proves just how valuable quality public schools are to our community."

there was overwhelming support from the business community. "We did not formally survey membership. Electronic communications regarding the support process and endorsement were utilized. We did not receive any negative or concerned emails, phone calls or personal visits to the Chamber offices prior to the Board of Directors' vote of endorsement," explained Macalik.

Romeo Arrieta, Director of Government Affairs & Community Relations for The MetroTex Association of REALTORS, confirmed with the County News that the Association "officially supports the Rockwall ISD bond Campaign." He verified that the decision was not based on a poll of the Association members.

Arrieta explained that a PAC representative, Karen Myers, gave a presentation during the Association's Sept. 16, 2015 meeting, which included a promotional video that can be found in the ISD's website and in youtube.com.

The Association's Public Education Committee made a recommendation to the Board of Directors for support of the bond package. The board voted to support the bond during the Sept. 24, 2015 meeting.

Arrieta lauded the Association's history of supporting similar bond packages throughout North Texas. "Realtors don't just sell homes, they help build communities. The MetroTex Association of Realtors understands that healthy school districts and healthy neighborhoods go together," concluded Arrieta.

According to the press release, Travis King stated that with the bond, "we can best manage our fast growth and provide the academic excellence needed to educate our next generation of doctors, engineers, teachers and entrepreneurs."

Macalik emphasized the Chamber's close connection with the local workforce and economic development.

"The Chamber's Workforce Development Committee has worked closely for several years with the school district and Economic Development office with the goal to develop and support business, technology and manufacturing opportunities to the future workforce while providing an educational path on how to prepare for different careers," explained Macalik.

She said that the Chamber has worked with the school district during the past 3-5 years structuring a business development initiative that would have a positive impact to the community members and

business community. Macalik likened it to supporting economic development.

The press release explained that the student population was expected to grow by more than 4,000 children during the next decade.

The ISD recently released a statement about a Templeton Demographics study, which projected growth by over 2000 students during the next 5 years. It did not mention reasons for the projections, and any relationships between growth and anticipated increase in economic and residential development projects.

uncomfortable questions about US foreign policy. If the political and media elites were really interested in preventing future mass shootings, they would repeal the federal "gun-free" schools law, for example. By letting shooters know that their intended victims are defenseless, the gun-free schools law turns schoolchildren into easy targets.

Even some who oppose gun control are using the shooting to justify expanding federal power instead of trying to repeal unconstitutional laws. Some opponents of new gun control laws say Congress should expand the federal role in identifying, tracking, and treating those with "mental health problems." This ignores the fact that many shooters were using psychotropic drugs prescribed by a mental health professional when they committed the horrible acts.

While our political and media elites are eager to debate how much liberty people must sacrifice for safety, they are desperate to avoid debating the morality of our foreign policy. To admit that the US

military sometimes commits immoral acts is to admit that the US government is not an unalloyed force for good. Even many proponents of our recent wars support using the US military for "humanitarian" purposes. Thus they are as reluctant as the neoconservatives to question the fundamental goodness of US foreign policy.

Anyone who raises constitutional or moral objections to the US use of drones, bombs, indefinite detention, and torture risks being attacked as anti-American and soft on terrorism. The smear of "terrorist apologist" is also hurled at those who dare suggest that it is our interventionist foreign policy, not a hatred of freedom, that causes people in other countries to dislike the United States.

The disparate reactions to the Oregon school shooting and the Afghanistan hospital bombing shows the political class is unwilling and unable to acknowledge that the US government cannot run the world, run our lives, or run the economy. Clearly, politicians will never stop expanding government and give us back our lost liberties unless and until the people demand it.

Balancing the government's budget now

The national debt over the past twelve months. According to the Congressional Budget Office (CBO), the Federal government ended its fiscal year September 30, 2015 with a budget deficit of a "mere" \$5 billion. Total Federal expenditures for the fiscal year were nearly \$1.6 trillion, while Federal tax receipts came to around \$3.3 trillion. This has now pushed the Federal government's debt level to over \$17.4 trillion. In calendar year 2014, U.S. Gross Domestic Product (GDP) was \$17.42 trillion. That means if the American people were to pay off the Federal government's accumulated debt, it would still fall short by nearly one trillion dollars!

America's Debt Burden will Keep Growing

With an estimated population of around 320 million people, the per capita financial burden of the national debt comes to around \$57,500 per person in the United States. About half of the U.S. population submits and pays some amount of tax to the federal government. This means that the per capita burden of national debt for those submitting and paying Federal taxes is almost \$115,000 per taxpayer. Of course, in reality, many pay no or little net taxes to the Federal government, while others pay far more. But this number at least gives a sense of what it would cost each of us, on average, if we were to try to pay off the national debt in one lump payment.

Furthermore, it is only going to get worse. In its most recent estimate, the CBO projects that over the next five years, 2016-2020, the Federal government will add an additional \$2.5 trillion to the national debt, and over the next ten years, 2016-2025, the accumulated additional debt will be over \$7 trillion. So the total national debt owed by the Federal government will be over \$25 trillion in 2020 and about \$32.5 trillion by 2025.

Spilling Over the Statutory Debt Limit

The statutory debt limit set by Congress earlier in 2015 was \$18.1 trillion. The U.S. Treasury Department has been using accounting tricks and shuffles to cover additional deficit spending that already exceeds \$100 billion more than Congress authorized. Secretary Jacob Lew has warned that the accounting gimmicks will run out by the end of October of this year and the U.S. government will not be able to legally meet its financial obligations, thus forcing the Federal government to default on its bills.

Obama have called for raising the debt limit, or even place a moratorium on any limit on how much the Federal government may continue to borrow and spend over and above what is collected in taxes.

If the President and the Treasury keep asking for increases in the national debt limit, and if Congress, in turn, after handwringing and gnashing of teeth about fiscal irresponsibility, continues to raise that debt limit there will clearly be no end to the deficit spending.

A Frozen Debt Limit Means a Balanced Budget

But there is a simple and straightforward way to bring the fiscal hemorrhaging to an end. Don't raise the debt limit. In one legislative act, in this case, a non-action, the Federal government will have to operate within the confines of a balanced budget.

With no increase in the debt limit, the Federal government will be legally restrained to spend only what it takes in, in taxes and other revenue sources. This, in itself, makes the case for not increasing the debt limit very appealing.

Of course, this would mean that the government could not cover a part of those expenditures that it has contracted or legislatively committed itself to in previous years. This is what generates most of the outcry about needing to raise the debt limit.

The Congressional Budget Office estimates that in Federal government's fiscal year, 2016, that began on October 1, 2015, Uncle Sam will spend nearly \$4 trillion and collect in taxes about \$3.6 trillion, leaving a budget deficit again in the neighborhood of \$400 billion.

To stay within the current statutory budget limit during the new fiscal year, all that the Federal government would need to do is to cut spending across the board by about ten percent. Given the mismanagement and waste that virtually everyone admits goes in every bureau, agency, and department run by the Federal government, a ten percent "trimming" does not threaten any of that "cutting to the bone" that the budget busters among both Democrats and Republicans constantly warn about.

Either You Spend Your Money or Government Does

But we should also realize that if the government is prevented from anymore borrowing, it would become crystal clear that the government does not possess an unlimited financial horn-of-plenty from which to satisfy every conceivable ideological and special interest demand for which an appeal is made to Washington.

If any of these demands for government spending above what can be covered by current government revenues were to be satisfied, it would then compel politicians and bureaucrats to tell the American public that which they avoid admitting like the plague: there is an inescapable trade-off between the people spending their own money and government taxing it away and spending for them.

In other words, no longer could there be the illusion of a "free lunch," in which the Federal government makes it seem that something can be had for nothing, or at less than its real full cost. Every additional dollar of higher government spending above what is currently collected in taxes would require one less dollar left in the hands of private citizens who had produced and earned it, because that extra dollar of govern-

ment spending would require an extra dollar of taxes taken out of the taxpayer's pocket.

This would require the citizens and the taxpayers of the United States to ask themselves exactly what it is they want the government to spend money on, and for which they will have to make the hard choice to have less money in their own pockets to pay for it.

In other words, the American people would be reminded that there is a thing called "scarcity," that the resources and financial means to obtain all that we would like to have is limited and insufficient relative to our wants and demands for things.

Balancing the Budget Means Accepting Trade-Offs

We each make such trade-offs and hard choices in our own personal, daily lives. Out of our take-home pay we decide whether we are willing to sacrifice going on that desirable but more expensive vacation so to put more money in our savings account to have the means to repair the roof on our home or to have more money put aside to pay for our child's education when they are ready to go off to college.

Or if we put that new flat-screen television on our credit card, we know it may mean planning to go out to dinner less frequently for a while, since our monthly payment will be higher while we are paying it off, including more interest on that borrowed money.

A balanced budget for the government means having to prioritize what it can afford to spend, and on what - just like you and me.

Would the burden of cuts have to fall on "discretionary" government spending - including defense - if "entitlements" remain off the table? Yes, but that in itself would impose hard thinking on the American people as to whether or not they were willing to face the fact that it is the entitlement programs like Social Security, Medicare, and now ObamaCare that are sucking up the greatest amount of what the government takes in as taxes now and will be even more so in the future.

Deciding on the Role of Government in Society

The American citizenry would be forced to look themselves in the face, and ask whether they are willing to pay the higher taxes to cover these rising entitlement costs, or whether they are finally going to accept the fact that real entitlement reform must be undertaken - including ending government responsibility and involvement in people's retirement and health care costs altogether through full privatization and real free market alternatives.

These are tough choices, given the increasingly embedded psychology of government paternalist dependency, and the politics of trying to live at other people's tax expense for things we want government to do for us.

But we either face this reality and reevaluate what is and should be the role of government in society, or we go on "busting the budget" with continuing deficit spending and growing national debt, and face potential financial ruin for ourselves and our children and grandchildren further on in the 21st century.

The inescapable and inevitable choice is ours.

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of the Rockwall Independent School District hereby finds that an election should be held to determine whether said governing body shall be authorized to issue bonds of said District in the amount and for the purposes hereinafter identified; now, therefore,

BE IT ORDERED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE ROCKWALL INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT:

SECTION 1: An election shall be held on the 3rd day of November, 2015, in the Rockwall Independent School District, which date is seventy-one (71) or more days from the date of the adoption hereof, and is a uniform election date pursuant to Texas Election Code, Section 41.001, for the purpose of submitting the following measure:

"SHALL the Board of Trustees of the Rockwall Independent School District in Rockwall, Kaufman and Collin Counties, Texas be authorized to issue bonds of the District in the principal amount of \$256,820,000 for the construction, renovation, demolition, acquisition and equipment of school buildings in the District, the purchase of necessary sites for school buildings and the purchase of new school buses; and shall there be pledged and levied, assessed and collected annually ad valorem taxes on all taxable property in the District sufficient, without limit as to rate or amount, to pay the principal of and interest on said bonds and the costs of any credit agreements executed in connection with the bonds; said bonds to mature serially or otherwise not more than thirty (30) years from their date, to be issued in one or more series at any price or prices, and to bear interest at such rate or rates (fixed, floating, variable or otherwise and not to exceed the maximum rate permitted by law at the time of issuance of the bonds) as in its discretion the Board of Trustees shall determine?"

SECTION 2: In accordance with the provisions of an election services contract with the Rockwall County Elections Administrator (the "Rockwall Contract") for that portion of the District located in Rockwall County, an election services contract with Kaufman County (the "Kaufman Contract") for that portion of the District located in Kaufman County and an election services contract with the Collin County Elections Administrator (the "Collin Contract") for that portion of the District located in Collin County, the election shall be conducted by the Rockwall County Elections Administrator, Kaufman County and the Collin County Elections Administrator, respectively, in accordance with the provisions of the respective election contract or agreement (collectively, the "Contracts").

SECTION 3: (a) With respect to that portion of the District located in Rockwall County, the locations, dates and times for early voting for this election shall be as shown in **Exhibit A**, which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference as a part hereof for all purposes. Christopher Lynch, Rockwall County Elections Administrator, is hereby appointed early voting clerk and shall appoint and designate deputy clerks for early voting in accordance with the Rockwall Contract.

(b) With respect to that portion of the District located in Kaufman County, the locations, dates and times for early voting for this election shall be as shown in **Exhibit B**, which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference as a part hereof for all purposes. Tonya Ratcliff, Kaufman County Tax Assessor-Collector, is hereby appointed early voting clerk and shall appoint and designate deputy clerks for early voting in accordance with the Kaufman Contract.

(c) With respect to that portion of the District located in Collin County, the locations, dates and times for early voting for this election shall be as shown in **Exhibit C**, which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference as a part hereof for all purposes. Sharon Rowe, Collin County Elections Administrator, is hereby appointed early voting clerk and shall appoint and designate deputy clerks for early voting in accordance with the Contract.

For purposes of processing ballots cast in early voting, the election officers for the early voting ballot board for this election shall be appointed and designated in accordance with the provisions of the respective Contracts.

SECTION 4: Pursuant to the provisions of the Contracts, the election precincts and polling places for voters in Rockwall County are shown in **Exhibit D** attached hereto, election precincts and polling places for voters in Kaufman County are shown in **Exhibit E** attached hereto and the Collin County Election Day Voter Centers for voters in Collin County are shown in **Exhibit F** attached hereto, which Exhibits are hereby incorporated herein by reference as a part hereof for all purposes. The election officers and maximum number of clerks for each polling place or voting center shall be determined and appointed in accordance with the provisions of the respective Contracts.

On election day, the polls shall be open from 7:00 A.M. to 7:00 P.M.

SECTION 5: A voting system or systems meeting the standards and requirements of the Texas Election Code, as amended, is hereby adopted and approved for early voting by personal appearance and by mail and for election day voting.

Ballots shall be prepared in accordance with the Texas Election Code, and permit electors to vote "FOR" or "AGAINST" the aforesaid measure which shall appear on the ballot substantially as follows:

"THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS IN THE AMOUNT OF \$256,820,000 FOR THE CONSTRUCTION, RENOVATION, DEMOLITION, ACQUISITION AND EQUIPMENT OF SCHOOL BUILDINGS, THE PURCHASE OF NECESSARY SITES FOR SCHOOL BUILDINGS AND THE PURCHASE OF NEW SCHOOL BUSES AND THE LEVYING OF THE TAX IN PAYMENT THEREOF"

SECTION 6: With respect to the voters of the District residing in Rockwall County, the Central Counting Station for the tabulation and counting of ballots for this election shall be located at the Office of the Elections Department, 915 Whitmore Drive, Suite D, Rockwall, Texas. With respect to the voters of the District residing in Kaufman County, the Central Counting Station for the tabulation and counting of ballots for this election shall be located at the Kaufman County Courthouse Annex, 100 North Washington Street, Kaufman, Texas. With respect to the voters of the District residing in Collin County, the Central Counting Station for the tabulation and counting of ballots for this election shall be located at the Collin County Elections Administration, 2010 Redbud Drive, Suite 102, McKinney, Texas,

The Manager, Tabulation Supervisor, Presiding Judge and Alternate Presiding Judge at each Central Counting Station shall be appointed and designated in accordance with the provisions of the respective Contract. The Manager and Presiding Judge of the Central Counting Station may appoint clerks to serve at such Station, as provided by Section 127.006 of the Election Code.

SECTION 7: This election shall be held and conducted in accordance with the Texas Election Code, except as modified by the provisions of the Texas Education Code, and to the extent required by law, all election materials and proceedings shall be printed in both English and Spanish.

SECTION 8: A substantial copy of this Order shall serve as proper notice of said election. Said notice shall be published at least one time not more than thirty (30) days or less than ten (10) days before the day of the election in a newspaper of general circulation in the District. Additionally, the notice shall be posted (i) on the bulletin board used for posting notices of Board meetings and at three public places within the District not later than twenty-one (21) days prior to election day, (ii) on the District's Internet website during the twenty-one (21) days prior to election day, and (iii) in a prominent location at each polling place on the day of the election and during early voting.

SECTION 9: In accordance with Texas Election Code, Section 3.009(b), the current ad valorem debt service tax rate for the District is \$0.40 per \$100 of taxable assessed valuation; the aggregate amount of outstanding principal of the District's debt obligations as of the beginning of the District's 2015/2016 fiscal year, totaled \$326,241,461.40; and as of the beginning of the District's 2015/2016 fiscal year, the aggregate amount of outstanding interest on the District's debt obligations totaled \$328,662,091.91. Based on the bond market conditions at the date of adoption of this Order, the maximum net effective interest rate for any series of

the bonds is estimated to be 4.50%. Such estimated maximum rate is provided as a maximum interest rate and in accordance with the requirements of Texas law, but is not a limitation on the interest rate at which the bonds, or any series thereof, may be sold.

SECTION 10: This Order hereby incorporates the provisions of the Contracts, and in the event of any conflict between this Order and the Contracts, the provisions of the Contracts shall control. The Superintendent of Schools or his designee, is hereby authorized to correct, amend or change the information in this Order and the attached Exhibits based upon the final local election dates and times agreed upon by the Rockwall County Elections Administrator, Kaufman County and/or the Collin County Elections Administrator and the District as well as incorporating additional voting locations as designated by the Rockwall County Elections Administrator, Kaufman County and/or Collin County Elections Administrator.
