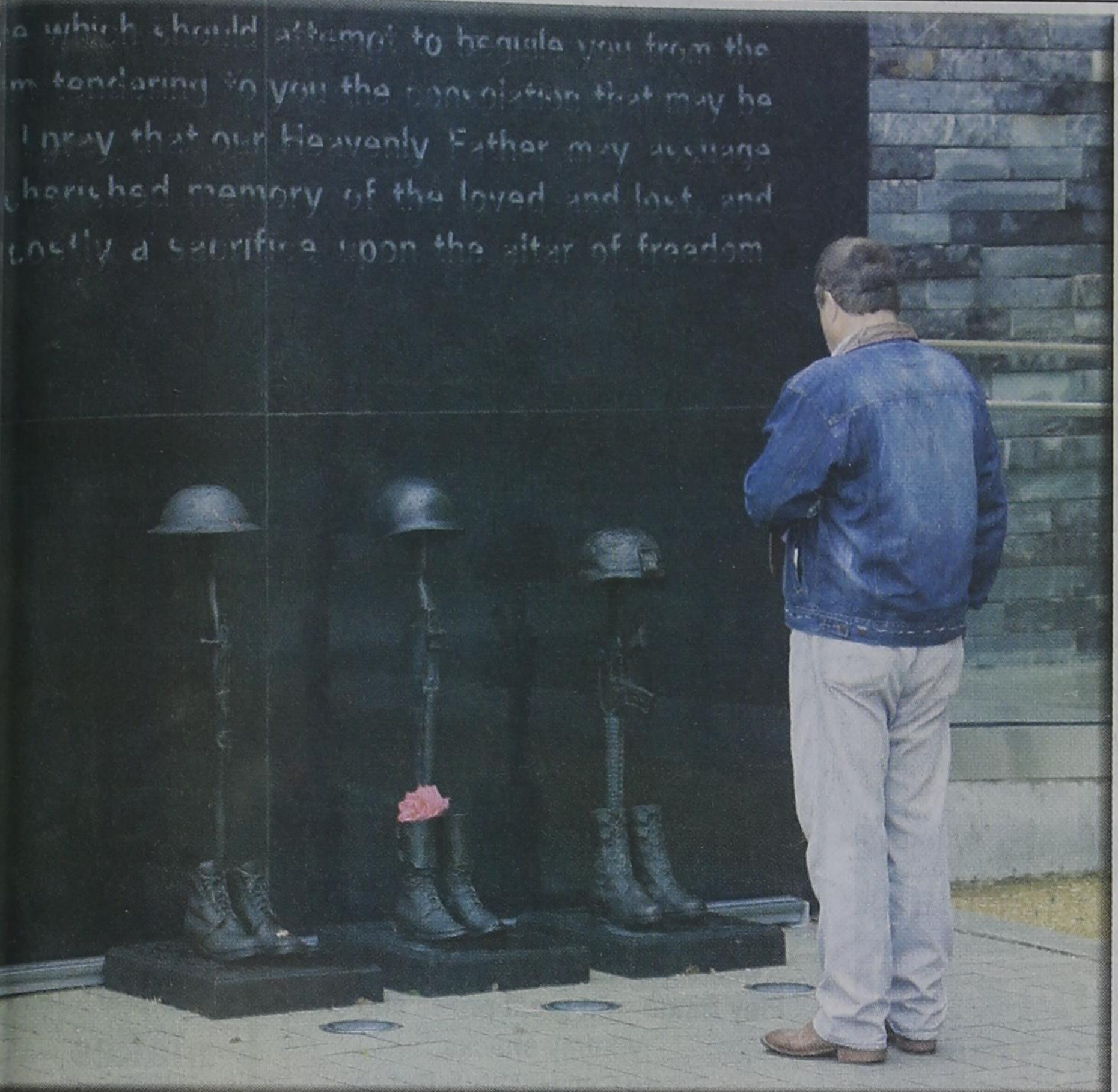

Royse City boy killed in foggy morning accident

The Rockwall County Sheriff's Department has determined that heavy fog in the early morning hours of Nov. 6 contributed to a two-car accident in which a 6-year-old Royse City boy was killed.
Lt. David Davis of the sheriff's department said according to witnesses and the accident investigation, neither driver saw the other until they were right on top of each other due to the foggy conditions.
The sheriff's department received its first call about the accident at 6:22 a.m.
Lt. Davis said the two cars involved were headed in opposite directions on SH 276. The eastbound car, driven by 40-year old Esther Michelle McCormick, turned northbound on FM 548 and was hit on the passenger side by the westbound vehicle. Her son, Ethan Michael McCormick, was in the front passenger seat and was killed in the accident.
The McCormicks were transported to Lake Pointe Hospital in Rowlett. Mrs. McCormick was not seriously injured, according to reports.
The driver of the westbound car, 30-year-old Frank James Clark, refused transport to the hospital at the time of the accident, but was checked out in the emergency room later in the day. He was not injured.
"It was extremely foggy that morning," Lt. Davis said. "Some parts of the county had moderate fog and some places, like at this intersection, had heavy fog."
Lt. Davis said there were no skid marks at the scene indicating neither driver saw the other until just before impact.
"The westbound driver indicated to sheriff's deputies that he didn't realize a car was turning in front of him. He said he was going west and the next thing he knew there was a car there," Lt. Davis said. "It was just a tragic accident."
No charges will be filed.
Ethan was a student at Fort Elementary School in Royse City. He was a member of the Royse City Soccer Association and Cub Scouts, where he was working on his Bobcat Merit Badge. He was a member of Abundant Life Church in Garland.
Funeral services were conducted Nov. 10 at Abundant

Rockwall Council appoints board for downtown revitalization, hears complaint on city code violation

Rockwall City Council appointed a committee last week to study an urban renewal project in historic downtown Rockwall already in progress.
The committee will review plans for street scrapes, sidewalks, landscaping, parking, a pedestrian court and the like," said Rockwall City Council director Robert LaCroix, adding that the plans may also include outdoor stage and enhancement around the courthouse.
The plans will be discussed and reviewed before any engineering or architectural efforts begin, LaCroix added.
City banker Shon Cass also addressed the council regarding local ordinance 818, which states that it is "unlawful for any non-

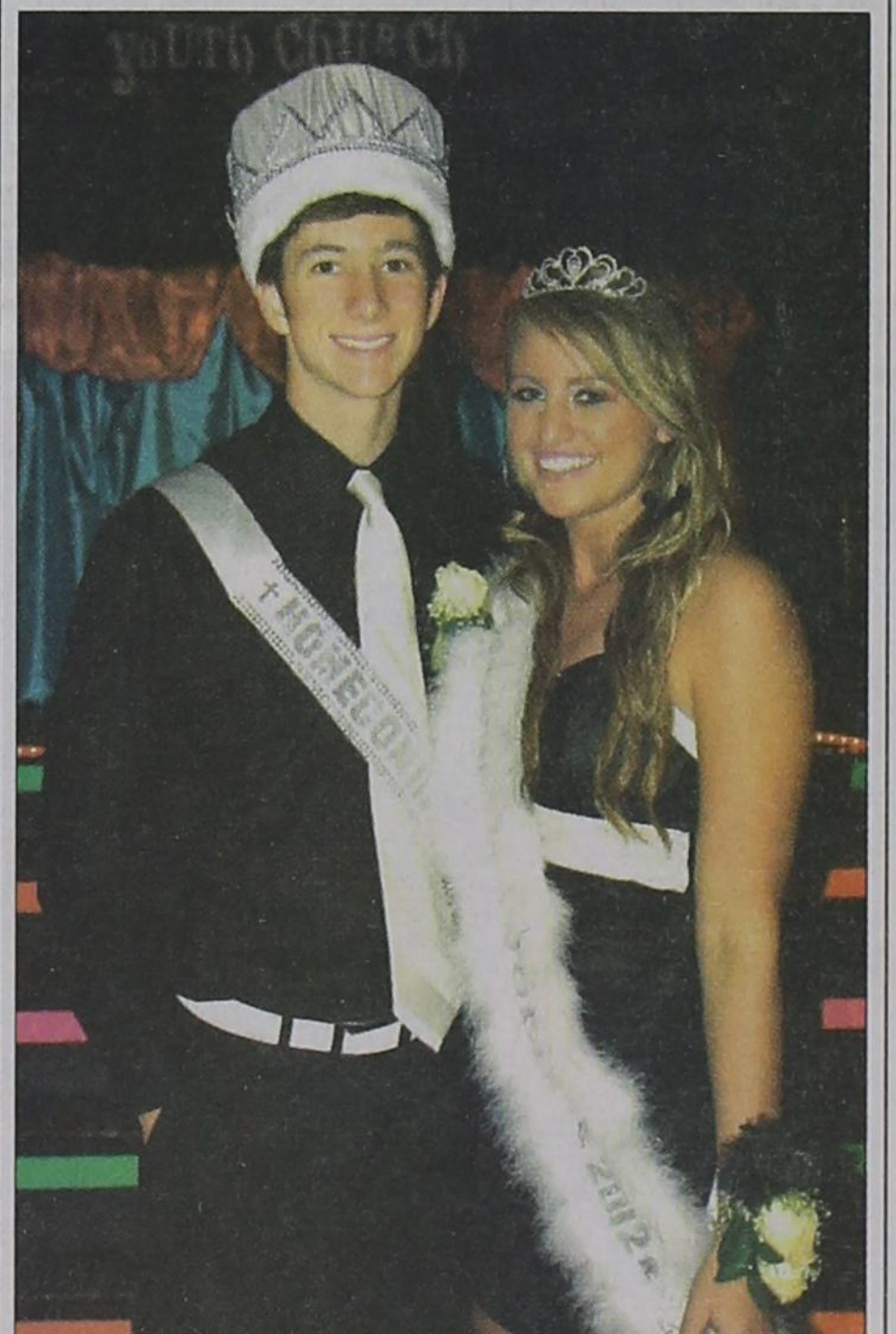
emergency vehicle to park or stop in a fire lane," thereby possibly obstructing fire and other emergency vehicles. The ordinance carries a fine of up to \$2000. Cass said he was given a \$240 citation on Easter morning that eventually cost him \$1,000, when he stopped for 30 seconds in front of a local Wal-Mart to let his elderly mother out of his car. Cass appealed the fine, which was eventually reduced to \$565.
"How do you avoid the ordinance while stopping at a stop sign or stopping for a pedestrian in a crosswalk?" Cass asked the council.
He also showed photos of children being let off in school carlines in apparent violation of the ordinance, as well as at the stop sign at the corner of Route 66 and Lakeshore Drive. Stopping at that sign would also put someone in violation of the ordinance, Cass said.

"I don't believe the way this is being enforced is in keeping with the spirit of the ordinance," he said.
Council members said they would review Cass' concerns and discuss them with the city attorney.
Each council member was joined at the meeting by his or her counterpart from Rockwall or Rockwall-Heath High Schools as part of the Youth Advisory Council program. Assistant city manager Joey Boyd said it was an opportunity for the students to be involved with community affairs.
In other business, the board voted to annex an .857-acre plot of land near the intersection of Tubbs and White roads to allow for a single

Heath City Council makes changes to city staff designation

Three items under a Consent Agenda were approved unanimously in one motion at the Heath City Council at its recent meeting November 6.

- Item 1 authorized the Manager to enter into a Maintenance Agreement with the Texas Department of Transportation for services associated with Phase I of the 740 road widening project encompassing FM 740 between FM 3097 (Horizon Rd) and 1140 (Smirl Dr.) This is a prerequisite to the city entering into a Landscape Maintenance Agreement.

- The Landscape Maintenance Agreement, Item 2 pertains to "associated services" allocated in the previous paragraph. A solution to a financial limitation of the city of Heath regarding ongoing maintenance of the landscaping being installed medians of the FM 740, Project. TxDOT is constructing the landscaping through its Ribbon Program. However, to cover the ongoing maintenance of the median landscaping not included in the new 2013 Parks Division Operating Budget. The installation of landscaping was anticipated at a later date. By executing an agreement with TxDOT maintenance will be covered next year's 2013-14 budget make appropriate allocation.

- The third item under Consent Agenda amends Chapter 32, of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Heath to designate the City Attorney's position as Officer of the City, providing a Severability Clause, providing for a Repealer Clause and an effective date. Section 2.02 of the Home Rule Charter of the City of Heath and Section 26.041 of the Texas Local Government Code respectively authorize the Manager to create offices, determine method for selection of officers and prescribe the qualifications, duties, and tenure of officers.

- Department Reports made available reflecting month of September which represents the end of fiscal 2012. Of interest was an

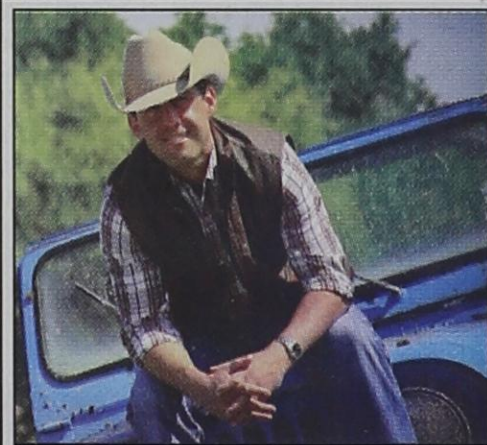

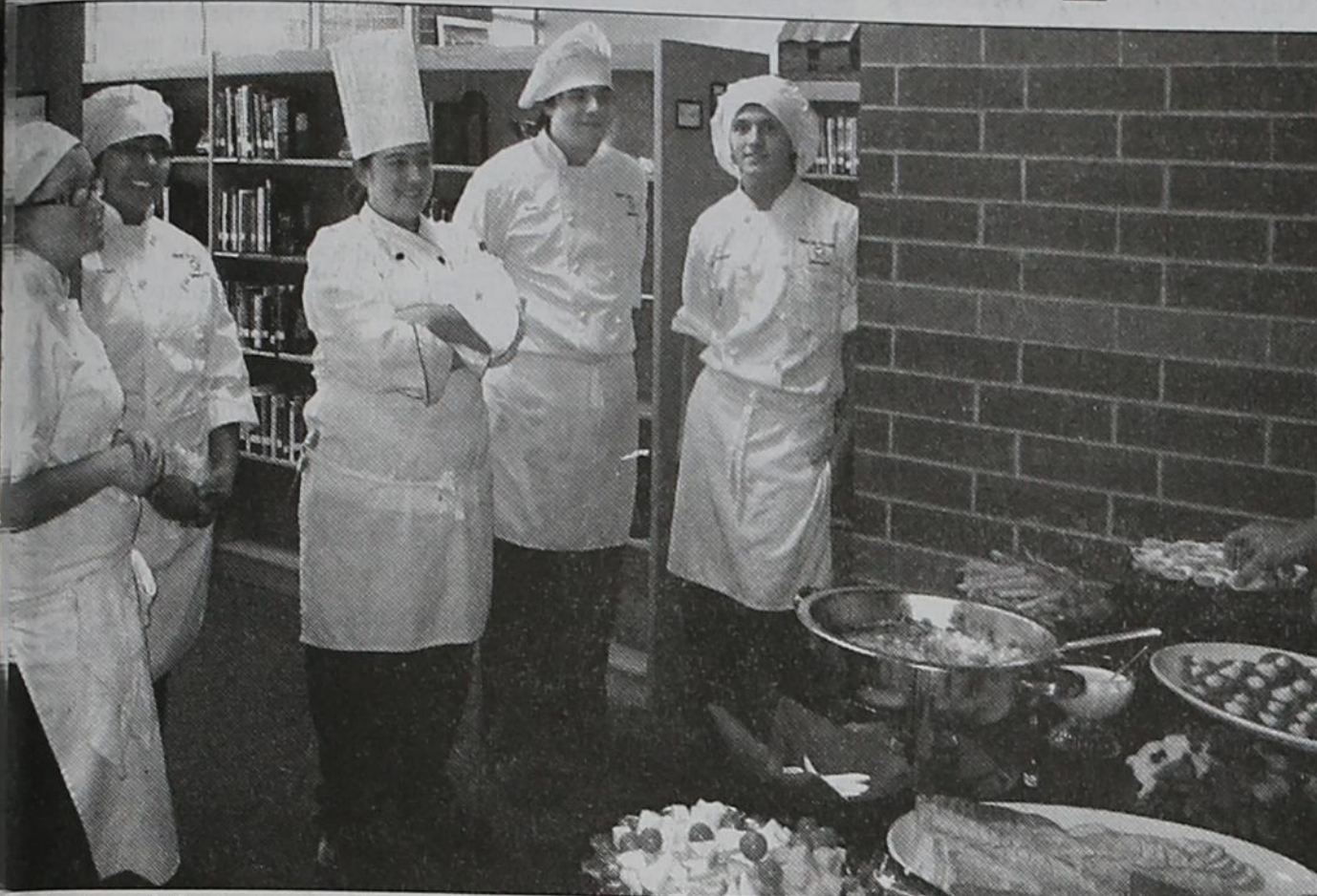

When decay damages a tooth's chewing surface more than a traditional filling can repair, a dental inlay or onlay may be recommended. These types of restoration, most commonly made of gold alloy, spare more tooth structure that would ordinarily have to be removed to prepare a crown. An inlay is similar to a filling in that it fits inside the cusp tips of the tooth. Once the decay is removed and the tooth is prepared, an impression is made of the tooth from which an inlay is fabricated. On the second visit, the inlay is set and cemented in place. An onlay is similar except it is a more extensive reconstruction that covers one or more cusps of the tooth.

Royse City students were awarded certificates during the Oct. 23 Royse City Council meeting. Shelby Short, Austin Young, Haleigh Sillavan, Soraya Hernandez and Bryan-Tre Sillavan received awards for completing the Teen Court Program. Hannah Negrete, Roland Carbolla and Michaela Grace Morris were also awarded for their involvement in other programs.

Anna Negrete, Teen Court coordinator, and Royse City Municipal Judge Bonnie Lee Goldstein presented the awards.

These Teen Court officers act as Teen Court prosecutors and defense attorneys for Teen Court defendants in Municipal Court," Negrete said. "We have several actual attorneys that volunteer to help mentor them who are Jason Michael Day, Royse City's city attorney; Jon Thatcher from the district attorney's office in Dallas; Jeff Schell also from the DA's office in Rockwall; and Royse City's Municipal Court Judge Bonnie Goldstein.

The awards were in recognition of their work and we wanted to recognize them during Municipal Courts Week," Negrete said.

Teen Court officers handle real cases. If a juvenile/youth commits an offense, such as failure to attend school, possession of alcohol, curfew, possession of drug paraphernalia or a traffic violation, she may plead guilty or no contest and request a court date to have the case heard by the Teen Court. The teen then is judged by a jury of his peers. The Teen Court is conducted on the third Monday of each month.

Depending on the severity and type of the juvenile's offense, the teen may receive community service hours, attend an alcohol abuse class, write an essay concerning the offense or other duties ordered by the court. The punishment is usually not a fine.

Class C Misdemeanors, which is the least serious of all criminal offenses, are handled in the Teen Court.

According to Negrete, the Teen Court has handled more than 30 cases in the last nine months and has proven to be successful.

Men taught by Jesus after his resurrection

Some time during the first day of the week after the women arrived to the sepulcher at sunrise, Jesus joined two of his disciples as they walked to a village called Emmaus. The record of this event is found in Luke 24:13-33.

Starting with verses 13-24, "And behold two of them went that same day to a village called Emmaus, which was from Jerusalem about three

score furlongs. And they talked together of all these things which had happened.

And it came to pass, that while they communed and reasoned, Jesus himself drew near and went with them. But their eyes were holden that they should not know him. And he said unto them, 'What manner of communication are these that you have one to another as you walk and are sad?'

And one of them whose name was Cleopas said, 'Are you only a stranger in Jerusalem, and have not known the things which are come to pass there in these days?'

And he said unto them, 'What things?' And they said to him, 'Concerning Jesus of Nazareth, who was a prophet mighty in deed and word before God and all the people. And how the chief priests and our rulers delivered him to be condemned to death and have crucified him. But we trusted that it had been he who should have redeemed Israel.'

And besides all this, to day is the third day since these things were done. And certain women also of our company made us astonished, who were early at the sepulcher. And when they did not find his body, they came, saying that they had also seen a vision of angels, who said that he was alive. And certain of them who were with us went to the sepulcher and found it even as the women had said, but him they did not see.'

As we continue to grow in God's word and in fellowship with God, there will be times when we will not recognize the truth because we have believed something different. Cleopas and his friend were two out of many disciples who did not believe Jesus was alive. This is probably the biggest reason they did not recognize him.

Continuing with verses 25-33, "Then he said to them, 'O fools, and

slow of heart to believe all that the prophets have spoken. Ought Christ to have suffered these things and to enter into his glory? beginning at Moses and all the prophets, he expounded unto them the scriptures the things concerning him self.'

They drew near to the village where they were going, and he went if he would have gone further. But they constrained him, saying, 'with us. For it is close to evening and the day is far spent.' And he went in to tarry with them.

And it came to pass as he sat at meat with them, he took bread, blessed it and broke it and gave it to them. And their eyes were opened and they knew him, and he vanished out of their sight.' And they said to each other, 'Did not our heart burn within us while he talked with the way and while he opened to us the scriptures?'

The first thing Jesus addressed in his reply was their believing. I proved them for not believing the earlier prophets who spoke of The prophets would include John who baptized with water and pre- many to follow Jesus.

After his loving reproof, Jesus began to teach out of the scriptures Moses and all the prophets. He opened up the scriptures and helped to see how they spoke of himself.

So also can we patiently and lovingly help others see the beautiful thread of our Lord Jesus as it strings throughout the scriptures Genesis 3:15 through Revelation 21:21.

The number of DPS calls in 2012, compared to 2011 by 15%. Calls were down 22% between police, fire and EMS. Police calls were down 22%, from 5,572 in 2011 to 2,790 in 2012. Fire calls were down 12.5%, from 35,201 in 2011 to 30,912 in 2012. EMS calls went up slightly from 121 in 2011 to 139 in 2012.

In fiscal year 2012 the city saw significant declines in assault, burglary, drug and drug offenses. There was an increase in the offenses of domestic violence, theft and disorderly conduct, although the overall numbers for these offenses were small. Larceny/theft increased from 43 to 58 cases and disorderly conduct increased from 20 to 26 cases.

Arrest totals were virtually the same for adults from 2011 to 2012 at 38 cases consecutively. But arrests for juveniles increased 24% from 12 in 2011 to 15 in 2012.

Building permits for single family homes rose from 31 in 2011 to 48 in 2012. A look at all permits issued by the city saw a leap from 499 to 512 from fiscal year 2011 to 2012.

The city also voted to purchase electronics that no longer work or paper that needs shredding, and to purchase a new calendar for Saturday, November 17. From 9 a.m. until 11 a.m. at Rockwall Heath High School multiple sponsors, including the City of Heath, are sponsoring a free E-Waste Collection event. 70% of heavy metals, lead and mercury contents in today's landfills come from electronic waste.

The regularly scheduled Oct. 22 meeting was cancelled, due to the urgent pending business related to the city.

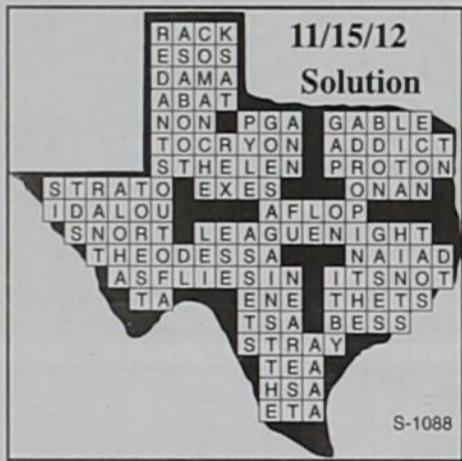

Rockwall-Heath secures playoff berth with 34-3 win over Tyler Lee

Part of Friday's game didn't look promising for Rockwall-Heath as the Hawks attempted to nail down a playoff berth in the final regular-season game. In the first quarter, RHHS trailed last-place, upset-minded Tyler Lee's Raiders' Bryce Wilkerson was running through the Hawks' defense as if it were the banner set up for the team to run through before the game.

Schultz had one of his best games, completing 17 of 20 passes for 245 yards and three touchdowns. He also led RHHS with 148 rushing yards and three touchdowns. The Hawks totaled 554 yards of offense. The touchdowns went to senior Shyon Motlagh, Rockwall-Heath's receiver. The third was to junior R.J. Williams, who showed he could become a worthy successor to Motlagh next year by dodging and dodging to an 81-yard score. RHHS' other touchdowns were on short runs by Brandon Young, who gained 101 yards on his 15 carries, and Brandon

Young leading 12 touchdowns. South Garland's scores included a blocked punt return and touchdowns by its leading rusher (Marquel McNac, 1,524 yards, 17 TDs) and receiver (Jermine Smith, 424 yards, 7 TDs).

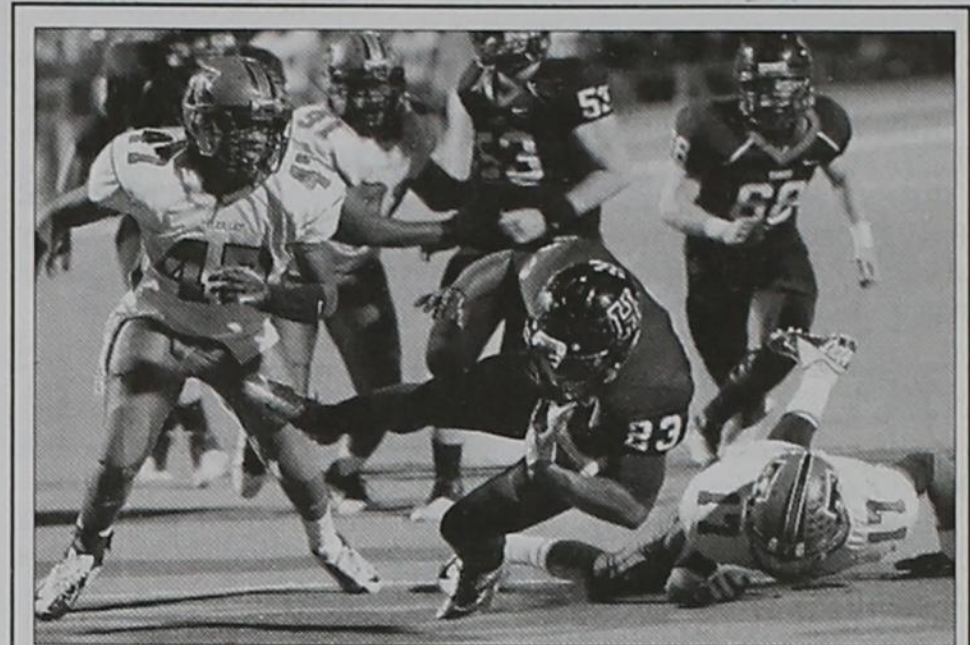

Trailing, Royse City rose to the challenge as they began at the 5:44

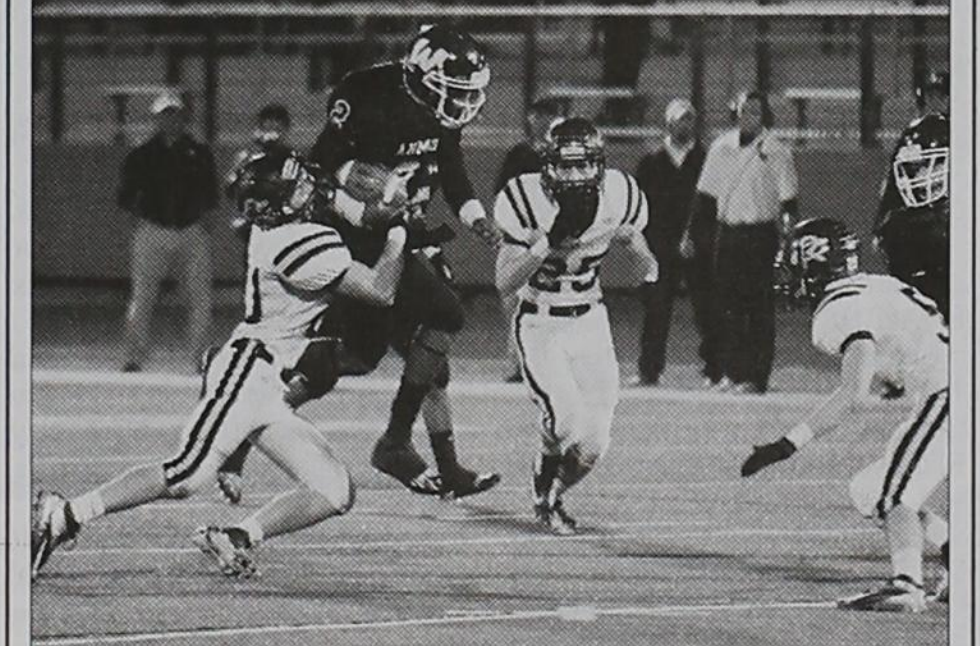

He finished a season when he wasn't even an offensive starter in the opening game, with 1,059 yards.

Rockwall, a 4A school between 2008 and 2011, finished its first season back in the "East Texas" 5A district with a 2-4 record, 3-7 overall. The Jackets were fifth in a district where every team lost only to the teams that finished ahead of it in the standings.

Smith said, "It was a challenging year. Week in and week out, we played against competition with more players with size and speed. In the middle part of the season, we played better and were able to win some games. We made improvement, but we could never pull together as a collective unit."

Rockwall's other offensive leaders were Dylan Campman with 996 yards, but just two touchdowns, passing; Xavier Castille with 48 catches for 528 yards; Warren with 90 points, and Tyler Bonny with three field goals made in five attempts. The Jackets totaled just four passing TDs.

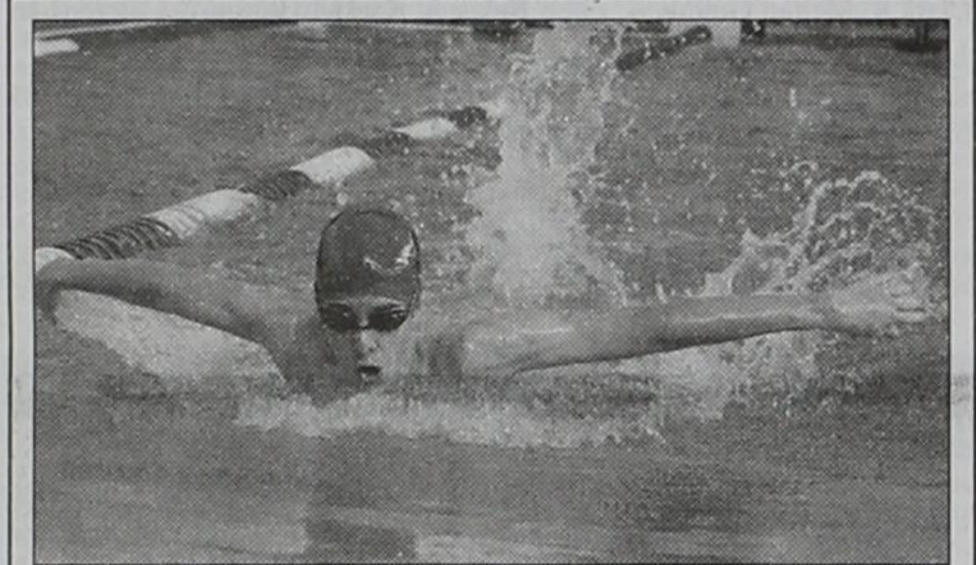

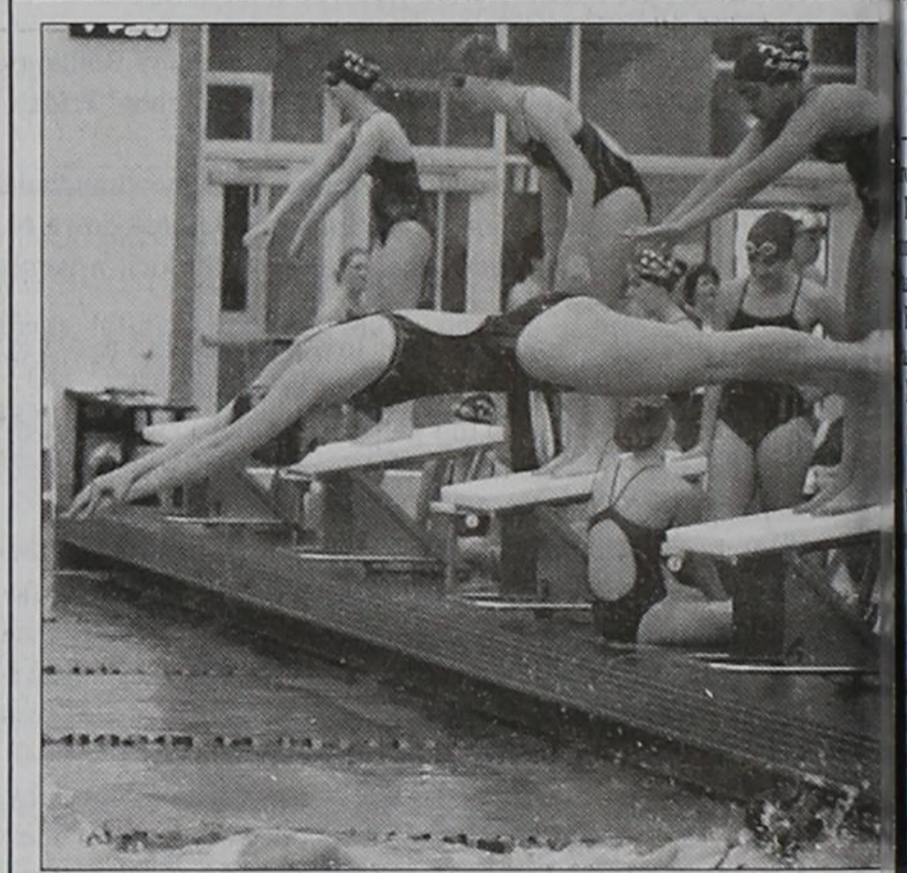

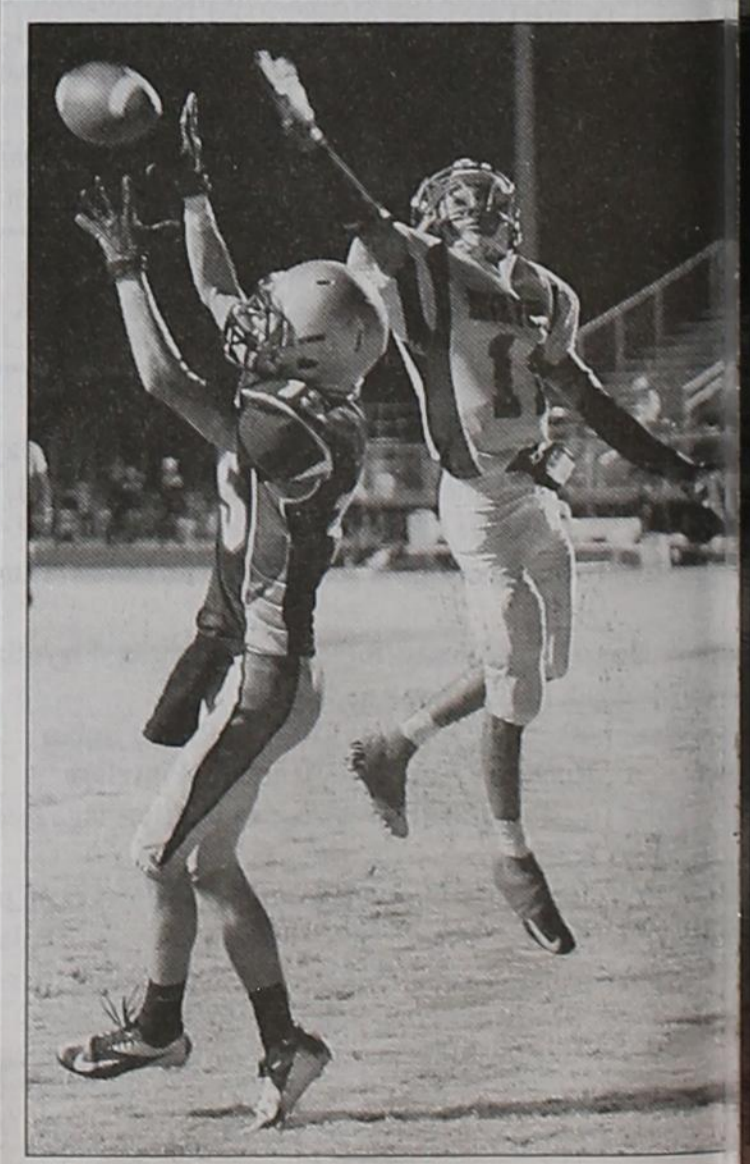
