Father proves to be a miracle for his son

Jenado Benjamin Sr. is just one of the many miracles in his son's

life. Seven-year-old Jenado Benjamin Jr. is excited about starting the school year. But his dad wasn't sure for most of his son's life that the boy would live to see this day.

Months before Jenado Jr.'s birth at Children's Hospital of Dallas, doctors realized something was wrong. The baby's kidneys weren't working properly. When he was born Nov. 4, 2008, there was a serious blockage of his kidneys and he had other grave health issues.

For the first six years of Jenado Jr.'s life, it was just father and son. Jenado Sr. took care of him from the time he came home from the hospital. "It was hard. My mother who lives in Mesquite helped me work to make money for his medical care. It was just me and we really bonded," his dad said.

Jenado Jr. was in the hospital the first six months after he was born. He was finally able to come home, then had to go back into the hospital many times. He has had 13 surgeries. Basically, he has spent most of his life in the hospital," his dad said.

Jenado Jr. was put on peritoneal dialysis shortly after birth. This was to surgically insert a catheter into his abdomen. A dialysate called dialysate is pumped through the tube into the abdomen and wastes are pumped out of the body through the tube. The procedure was performed three times a week, with trips to Children's Hospital for every treatment.

Due to continual infections from the tube and the procedures, Jenado Jr. went on hemodialysis in 2010. He now has a GJ (a gastrostomy, or feeding tube) in his abdomen where the dialysis is performed and all nutrition and medications are administered. He has been on a feeding tube since he was born. PediaSure, a nutritional supplement, is administered through the GJ.

Diversity scholastic honors

Barsoom, Vinson make honors list

Local students were among the more than 400 University of North Texas students named to the spring semester Dean's List, according to a news release from the Irving-based university.

The President's List recognizes academic achievement for students with a 3.8 or greater grade-point average. Foreman is a sophomore mechanical engineering major.

Williams draws 20 years for evidence tampering

A Rockwall County jury convicted 37-year-old Denton resident Archie Williams last week on the third-degree enhanced charge of tampering with physical evidence.

Less than an hour after retiring to deliberate on punishment, the jury sentenced Williams to the maximum sentence of 20 years in prison and a fine of \$10,000, according to a news release from the Rockwall County District Attorney's office.

Testimony showed that on Feb. 18, 2015, Williams committed theft at a local store in Rockwall and fled the location in a vehicle. Rockwall Police Department Officer Tracy Gaines detained Williams' vehicle in a parking lot on SH 205 and observed the defendant throw marijuana outside his passenger window during the traffic stop, according to the news release. The marijuana was recovered as evidence.

After the defendant's conviction and in the punishment phase of the trial, lead prosecutor Lauren Black presented additional evidence that Williams assaulted a detention officer while in jail, according to the news release.

Prosecutors also introduced 13 prior convictions against Williams for theft, drugs and assault-related offenses.

"I thought the jury's decision to give the defendant the maximum

sentence was appropriate and fair considering the defendant's criminal history and risk to re-offend," Black said in the news release.

"We appreciate the hard work by the Rockwall Police Department in this matter," Rockwall County District Attorney Kenda Culpepper said in the news release. "We also appreciate the hard work put in by the jury. Rockwall County residents who are summoned and serve as jurors are to be commended for their attention to these cases."

DOING AWAY WITH PERIODONTITIS

Gum disease (periodontitis) is a serious gum infection that not only poses a threat to soft tissue and bone that supports teeth, it has also been linked to a number of diseases in other parts of the body. Periodontitis, which affects 15% to 20% of adults between the ages of 35 and 44, begins when the bacterium Porphyromonas gingivalis infects the tissue surrounding the teeth, causing inflammation. While current treatment options include scaling and root planing (deep cleaning), antibiotics, and surgery, researchers have recently found that a material used in spinal implants may potentially lead to an effective new treatment. Silicon nitride is a ceramic material that was found to kill P. gingivalis on contact.

Johnson is the son of Amanda and Steven Johnson of Fate. He is a 2015 graduate of Rockwall High School.

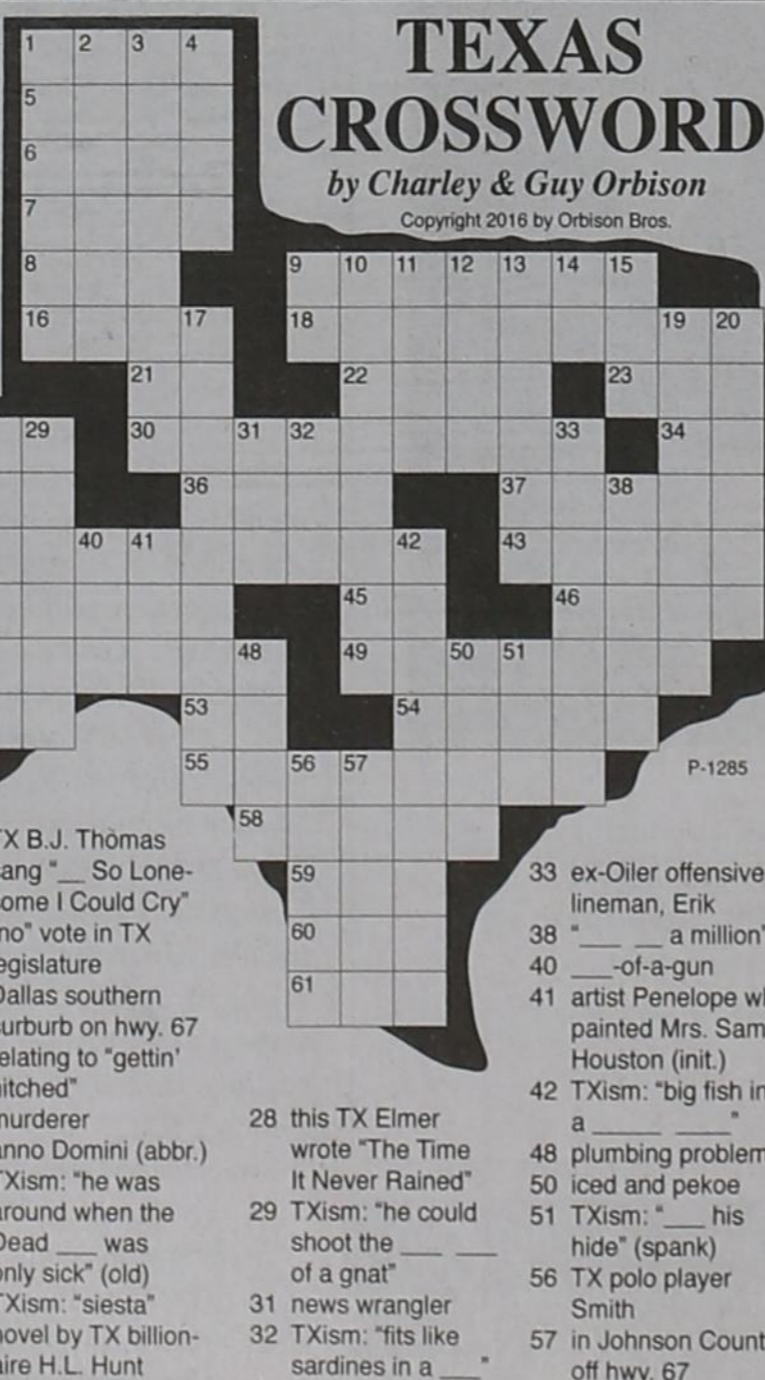

Capitalism as the Liberator of Man

These accusations against capitalism and the free society justified? Absolutely not. Indeed, never in historical record been more twisted and distorted than this socialist critique of the free market

Beginning in the eighteenth century and throughout the nineteenth century, capitalism and the political philosophy of classical liberalism that accompanied it insisted on the freedom and dignity of the individual. Classical liberals campaigned against and brought about an end to human slavery, first in Europe and then in the rest of the world. These free market liberals called for ending the rule of kings and princes and for restraining their powers through constitutional government and peaceful elections. It called for the rule of law, and the end to torture and other cruel punishments.

The classical liberal and free market agenda included the abolition of all privileges, favors, and monopolies that benefited the aristocracy, as well as the end to all monopolies created by government intervention. It called for free enterprise, freedom of trade and occupation, and freedom of movement. In other words, classical liberalism and capitalism have been an ideology for the liberation of man and protection. It has served as the foundation of the American Republic.

Capitalism in the nineteenth century did not doom the worker to a life of perpetual poverty. Instead, the free market economy kept creating new and better-paying employments as the decades went by. It produced the wealth and rising income that resulted in the emergence of a phenomenon completely new in human history: a self-supporting and educated middle class that grew more and more as the lower classes bettered their economic well-being.

Through private investment, capitalism kept raising the productivity of labor to new heights. Parents were able to earn enough so their offspring did not have to join the work force at an early age. This was something unique in history: childhood, a time when the young could experience the innocence and the opportunity of schooling before entering the world of work.

Classical liberalism and the market order fostered the private associations and charitable organizations that helped the working poor to provide medical care, pensions, and education for their families. Famines were reduced; poverty was dramatically and continuously reduced; and hard and long hours of work were made more surely eased and shortened to a degree never before experienced.

Capitalism has been the liberator of mankind. The great history and glorious achievements of that free market capitalist epoch must be relearned once again in a society that knows little of the standard of living that has provided the comfort and standard of living that too many of our fellow countrymen take for granted.

The Dangerous Growth of Government

For more than a hundred years, now, the anti-capitalist mentality has undermined the original American political philosophy of individual rights and economic liberty. In its place has grown a politics of paternalism and dependency. This has easily played into the hands of those who have desired political power under the guise of democracy, and by those who have desired and now believe that they have an entitlement – a right to redistributive largess because they cannot imagine life without those government "safety nets" that they believe that a free market, limited government world would be cruel, uncaring, and inhumane to them and others.

Big government has brought with it this big and growing debt because the entitlement society, the distributive society, the political plundering society has no limit once government is viewed as paternalistic rather than an essential but more modest protector of each individual's life, liberty and property. Now, in Washington, D.C. among the political culprits, whose interactions with special interest groups have created and maintain the Fiscal Leviathan State, will solve America's debt and deficits problem. What is a change in the ideas and beliefs among many of our fellow citizens.

As long as too many of our fellow Americans believe they are "entitled" to the income, wealth and possessions of others, and as long as so many of our fellow Americans accept either through ignorance or greed that they have an obligation to be taxed, regulated and plundered to fulfill those entitlements little change or will happen to radically shift the direction we are moving in.
