

Fate to establish in-house Department of Public Safet obits

The City of Fate is in the process of establishing a Department of Public Safety. At this time, the City Council and city manager are preparing to begin the process of selecting a director and will begin application reviews on April 1.

City manager Philip Rodriguez may be contacted at the Fate City Hall at 972-771-461 for more information on the position or a resume may be submitted to jobs@cityoffate.com.

At the March 18 City Council meeting, Fate's Fire Chief Sean Fay introduced two new employees to the council, staff and those in attendance. The officers joining the force are Tyler Young from the Heath Department of Public Safety with five years of experience and Casey Northcut from the Rockwall County Sheriff's Department with 10 years of experience.

The goal for the new department is that eventually each officer is to have a triple certification, that of certified peace officer, firefighter and emergency medical technician (EMT).

Fate is one of the fastest growing cities in the United States. The community had a population of 497 in 2000 and now has about 10,000.

Also discussed at the Fate City Council meeting was the annual Fate Cleanup Day, which is scheduled for April 20. Director of public works Bobby Clay updated the council about the event. The free disposal of bulk household items will run from 9 a.m. until 2 p.m. This service will be residential only; no commercial disposal.

· Items accepted include furniture, brush, old carpet, metal, wood, old fencing and recyclables. Anyone wishing to dispose of paint is directed to pour kitty litter into the can and let it dry three to five days. Visit the Annual Fate Clean-up Day website for more information. The disposal site located on the frontage road of I-30 going west (a map is on the website), will limit the visits to three per household.

Clay noted that there were items that are considered as hazardous


Candidate Scott Milder did not receive a challenger for Place 5 held by Michelle Smith. Smith did not seek reelection.

Defendant frustrated, motions and requests ignored

Editor's Note: The following letter is one in a series from a Rowlett man accused and incarcerated by Rockwall County government official actions which raise questions about violations of due process of law as well as the Texas Constitution Article 1, Section 9 and U.S. Constitution Fourth Amendment. I have waived my right to counsel and now represent myself pro se. I've served the motion to dismiss with the 382 District Court. The dashcam video has been compromised and I've enclosed a copy of a letter on this.

Thus I've been locked up illegally for over 100 days and pressured into entering another guilty plea. I have requested full discovery including all DPS documents & dashcam video in writing.

I have received nothing from the D.A.'s office.

I have not been in court before the Judge or met the D.A. Assigned to my case. State sponsored intimidation, extortion here in the Bamboo Republic of Rockwall...

All 4 RISD gymnastics teams on track toward State Championships

The girls' and boys' gymnastics teams from both Rockwall and Rockwall-Heath put themselves in position Monday to advance from the Region I Championships to next month's State Championships.

After Monday's Compulsory events, the first half of the Regionals, both RHS squads were in first place and the Hawks and Lady Hawks were third in the competition at RHHS.

The top three teams could qualify for the State Championships April 19 and 20 at RHS, where the Lady Jackets would be trying for their third To qualify, the girls' teams would have to be among the top three and meet

the qualifying score of 215. The boys' qualifying score was set at 305. All four RISD teams were more than halfway to the qualifying number. On Monday, the Rockwall girls scored 115.250 and the Lady Hawks

109.350, second to Highland Park's 113.100. Rockwall-Heath was 5.35 points ahead of fourth-place Garland. The RHS boys, at 171.800, were just ahead of Garland's 171.4. RHHS was at 168.70, 7.5 points better than Garland Lakeview Centennial in fourth place.

Among individuals, gymnasts from Highland Park were first all-around in both the girls' and boys' competition.

In second place all-around were the Lady Hawks' Morgan Hines at 38.450, 0.8 behind HP's Arielle Iola, and Rockwall's Michael Weidman, with a 57.900 score 1.5 behind the Scots' Meyer Williams.

Hines, who had left the field at RHHS' soccer match Friday because of a back injury, recovered to rank among the top five in each event Monday. She was tied for first in the floor exercise at 9.70, tied for second on the uneven bars at 9.55, and fifth on the balance beam and tied for fifth in the vault, both

Four other RISD girls were among the top 10 all-around. Representing Rockwall, Kailea Coles was third (38.20), Shelbi Crawford fourth (37.85) and Jamie Pultorak sixth (37.40). Coles was tied for first in the vault and beam, both at 9.85. Crawford's best event was the vault, fourth in 9.75. Pultorak was tied for second in the vault at 9.8. Lady Hawks freshman Darion Mellorn was ninth all-around at 36.00 despite being no higher than 11th in any event.

Weidman was tied for first on the still rings at 9.80, second in the floor exercise (9.50) and tied for second in the vault (9.90).

Also among the top 10 boys all-around were RHS' Zach Bennett, fifth at 56.40, and the Hawks' Trevor Newell, sixth at 56.10, and Cameron Callaway, eighth with 54.90. Bennett was tied for second on the high bar (9.60) and tied for third on the floor (9.60). Newell's highest place was tied for third on the rings (9.70). Callaway was tied for eighth in three events – vault (9.80), floor (9.30) and high bar (9.0).

The Jackets' Adam Alford, also tied for eighth on the floor, was 11th allaround (52.20).

Lady Hawks surprise softball district foes

It wasn't a surprise that Rockwall's softball team came into this week in first place in District 12-5A.

Raising eyebrows, however, is Rockwall-Heath's performance.

Since losing their district opener to Rockwall, the Lady Hawks had won four consecutive games to move into second place at 4-1. That was only one game behind RHS, a perennial district champion in District 10-4A before moving up this season.

In contrast, RHHS won just three district games in 2012, one fewer than it already has in five district contests this year.

Hayley Baker went 4-for-4 with a triple and three runs batted in against Mesquite. Kindal Sauter also ripped a triple. The Lady Jackets scored two runs in each of the first six innings before the run rule gave RHS and pitcher Emily Cowan a victory.

After what Lady Jackets head coach Melissa Garcia called "the 45-second goal," neither team could score. Miranda Larkin made four saves for the shutout in a game when RHS controlled the ball and put eight shots on Hierholzer. "It's always a good game against Heath," Garcia said.

Lady Hawks head coach Marco Duran said after the match, "We should be playing overtime now." Horn would have liked that, because the Lady Jaguars would have won a tiebreaker for first place over Rockwall.



The district championship is the third consecutive for the Lady Jackets, who had won in District 10-4A in 2011 and '12. They will be making their sixth consecutive playoff appearance.









