PNEUMONIA DEATHS.

LAST week's Bulletin spoke of the large number of death-claims-34-paid in eight weeks by the New York Life on the lives of policy-holders who died from a single disease -Typhoid Fever.

During the same eight weeks—July 1 to August 31, 1906—24 policy holders of the New York Life died from Pneumonia, another very common malady.

The Company paid the beneficiaries \$63,453.28—a large amount to pay out in eight weeks for the ravages of one disease in two summer months which are not really the months in which Pneumonia most frequently occurs.
