## Four States Fruit

 and Truck Exhange Organize Daling, Tex., Dec. 22. - To aid in the organization of individual rowers and local growers' rganizations for a more busi ess-like distribution and mar eting of their fruits and truck and the buying of their supplies to aid legislative co-operation, to aid in adjustment of complaints to aid educational work for standardization of packs and packages; and to aid educational work among growers for better cultural methods and for the control of insect enemies and diseases of fruit and vegetables. To establish a credit-reporting service. To establish a crop-rewith transportation and refrig ration lines in all necessary atters relating to loading, pack service.These are the purposes of the our-States Fruit and Truck Exchange which has entered the field to solve the marketing prob lems of Arkansas, Oklahoma, Louisiana and Texas.
The Exchange will be a nonprofit, purely co operative organ ization and will have its perman ent headquarters at Texarkan and will work in co-operation with other agencies now in the field. It will attempt to prevent glutted markets and uneven dis tribution. it will orgahize loca associations on a uniform basis incorporating the best feature of the most successful associa tions now operating.
This organization is headed by W. A. Nabors, of Winnsboro Texas, manager of the Winns buro Fruit \& Truck Growers, As sociation. The other officers are: First vice-president and chairman of the committee on transportation, Bert Johnson, Highland, Arkansas; second vice president and chairman of committee on finance and member ship, S. J. Verhalen, Scottville Texas; third vice-president and chairman of committee on legal and legislative matters, T. J Thornhill, San Benito, Texas treasurer, J. W. Ogburn, Ogburn Texas; temporary secretary Charles W. Holman, Farm and Ranch, Dallas.

Men From All Countries o the Globe Farming In Texas
Washington, D. C, Dec, 26 . The fertile soil and abundant harvests of agricultural products in Texas have attracted farmers from all countries on the globe to that state and according to the returns of the Thirteenth Census which are now being compiled there are 28,864 foreign born white farmers in the Lone Star State. Of this number 10, 815 were born in Germany, 5,236 in Australia, 1,026 in Sweeden 82 in England and 710 in Italy Farmers from practically every other European country numbe are represented by 7081 fountrie There is a total of 69,918 nonwhite farmers in the state and of this number 66,816 are negroes, 52 are Indians, 44 are Japanese and 6 Chinese. The native white farmers of that state number 318988 and the total number of all farmers of all color and nativity is 417,770.
