## Odd Reptile Is Found In Banana Stalk By Cross Plains Grocer

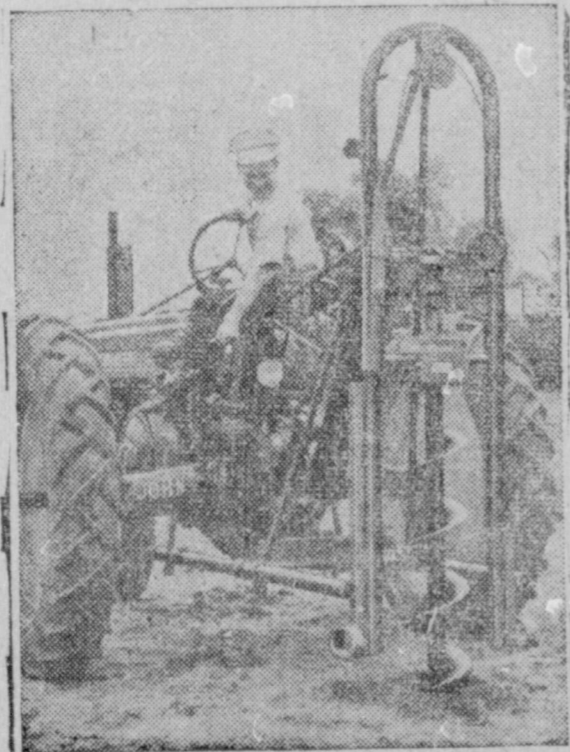

**Rheumatic Fever**

The "growing pains" suffered by many children may not amount to much, and at the same time they may be the first warning of the childhood disease, rheumatic fever, says Mrs. Eloise T. Johnson, family life education specialist of the Texas A. & M. College Extension Service.

Statistics show, says Mrs. Johnson, that rheumatic fever causes more deaths among school-age children than any other disease in the United States.

Apart from "growing pains" other symptoms of rheumatic fever are loss of appetite and failure to gain weight; pain and swelling of first one joint and then another, usually accompanied by fever, jerky movements of the face, arms, and legs, especially when the child tries to dress or feed himself; and has unexplained crying spells.

Mrs. Johnson urges parents to guard against rheumatic fever. Although the "growing pains" may not mean anything serious, it is a good idea to take the child to a doctor and find out.

**4-H Training Camp**

The 4-H Club training camp for District 7 was held at Christoval on June 10-12. The thirteen counties in this district were represented. The registration for the entire camp was 41 4-H girls, 13 adult leaders, 11 home demonstration agents and 15 visitors.

The campers were trained in handicraft, recreation, and camp cookery to assist in training in county camps for all the 4-H Club girls.

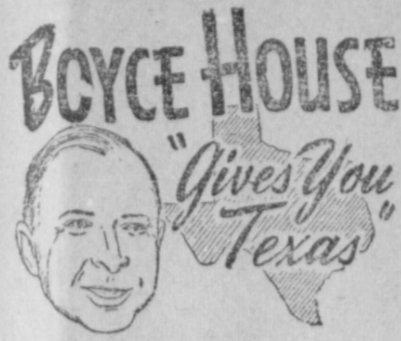
The 4-H girls who attended from each county were selected for their achievements in 4-H work. In Callahan county each girls club nominated one outstanding girl and sent her record to the education committee of the women's council. From these records, the girls selected to go were Doris McClain from Bayou, Betty Louise Smith from Eula and Elizabeth Ann Burleson from Denton. Mrs. Earl Jobe from Putnam, adult leader, and Evelyn Wieland, home demonstration agent accompanied the girls. Expenses for the camp were paid by the County Home Demonstration Council.

**Things Are Different Now**

A big percentage of West Texas beef cattle that usually run off many pounds of flesh, trying to get away from heel flies, are grazing peacefully this summer. The reason: DDT fly spray.

In Roberts county, during the month of May, ranchmen sprayed about 24,000 head of cattle with DDT to control flies. County Agricultural Agent L. E. Breeding reports now that, unlike the old days, the animals are not seen running across pastures and kicking at heel flies. The DDT is getting horn flies, too, says the county agent, which is still another big money saving feature of DDT spraying.

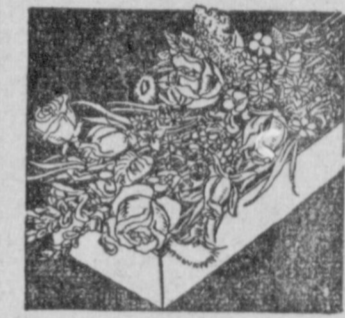

COUNTY AGENT**

Harvest Warnings

As a precaution against the further spreading of undesirable weed seeds, and particular the bind weed, or often spoken of as passion vine, all combines should be thoroughly cleaned before going into clean fields. This is especially important with combines coming in from other counties and communities. There is some bind weed in the county and because it is very difficult and expensive to eradicate on account of its extensive and deep root system. All precaution should be used in preventing its spreading.

Combines that have cut rye and vetch, or been in wheat fields that had some rye in them should be thoroughly cleaned before entering another wheat field. Rye is the curse of millers and you will be docked in price when you go to market with your wheat if it has rye in it. With increased plantings of rye and vetch in the county the possibilities of rye infested wheat fields increases and all precautions should be taken to prevent it getting mixed with wheat.

Farmers who do not own their own combines should insist that those coming in have been thoroughly cleaned.

The machines should not be cleaned in fields or on the highway as there is danger of seed germinating and the plants spreading from these spots.

A vigil look out must be kept for grasshoppers. There has been 56 lbs. of poison (sodium flourisilicate) distributed this week. This is 30 lbs more than was distributed the whole season last year.

Those receiving poison Wednesday were: Leo Clinton and Y. C. Wilson. Help your neighbor control grasshoppers by joining in on distributing poison.

Farm Labor Situation

With the coming of wheat harvest, there is a demand for combines, combine operators, and laborers and for those interested in working in the wheat areas, here's some information you are interested in.

A large number of combines will be needed by June 10 to 12 in the south part of Texas Panhandle in Crosby, Briscoe, Floyd, Hale, Castro, Swisher and adjoining counties. This large demand for combines will continue through all the Texas Panhandle as wheat ripens in the counties farther north.

Some trucks will be needed in the Panhandle wheat harvest after June 12, but the total number needed will depend on how fast the wheat moves by rail from the elevators.

There now is a surplus of labor, but this surplus will disappear by June 10.

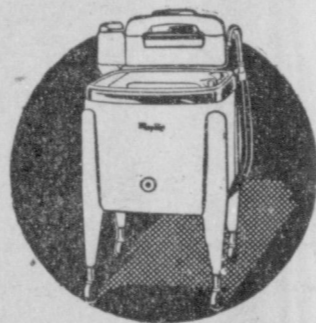
