County Road Money To Be Divided

Even though, with Judge Louis Owens telling them the act was illegal, the Commissioners Court of Hockley County voted to divide the road and bridge money in 1964.

The original motion called for a division of all the money, but Monday the motion was amended to divide the ad valorem tax money equally, but to split the tag and gasoline tax money according to the number of miles of roads in the precinct.

Myrl Brock, commissioner of Precinct 1, backed by Jack Morton of Precinct 3 and Charles Hobgood of Precinct 4, brought the motion to a vote and it carried with the three voting for it and Smoky Janes, precinct 2, opposing it. Janes declared he was going to protest the motion, he siding with Judge Owens and declaring the motion illegal.

Janes also said if the other precincts wanted more road money, to raise the taxes. This was turned down.

Myrl Brock made the statement that no new taxes were needed, but a fair division of the tax money was necessary.

"I was elected as a commissioner not only of Precinct 1, but of Hockley County," Myrl Brock told the Plainsman, "and I expect to work for the good of the county. A larger portion of the land lays in Precincts 1, 3, and 4, and since the farms are the foundation of the economy of the county, I think the farmers should be given good roads on which to haul their produce to market."

"If you took the farmers out of Hockley County there is not a business that could continue to operate."

Myrl also stated that in Lamb and Yoakum Counties the road and bridge money was divided as they asked it to be divided in Hockley County. He further stated that a ruling by the Attorney General stated that the money could be divided in the manner it will be divided in Hockley County.

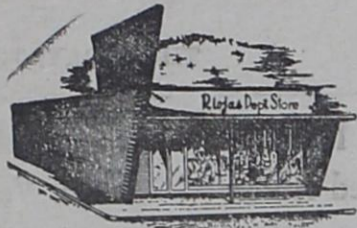


