## Drought Holds With Bulldog Grip Sand and Wind Take Toll of Crops

### If There is Bindweed On Your Farm Report It

Thirty-one bindweed infestations have been reported to the County Agent's office so far this spring, County Agent Bill Taylor says.

The vine growth and white or pink blooms are easy to recognize at this time of year, says Taylor, as the weeds are growing actively. The County Bindweed Control Committee would like to ask all farmers to inspect

their fields and road right-of-ways for patches of this weed and take action to eliminate them. If you find an infestation in the road right-of-way contact the person in charge of maintaining the right-of-way.

Several soil sterilants are effective in controlling bindweed. These chemicals kill the ground for a period of from 1 to 3 years. Periodic

inspection should be made of the weed to make sure there is not any survival of old weed and that new seedlings have not emerged. Seed may remain viable in the soil for many years.

If we will now take the offense against the weed, maybe we can prevent it from putting us on the defense and becoming a major economic problem in future years.

As perhaps, at no other time in the history of this country the people who till the soil are having difficulty in getting a crop started. Any number have had to plant twice and some as many as three times.

This is not caused by a deluge of rain, nor a battering hail, but the wind. For the first time in the memory of old timers, May has been a month of high winds—not for a day or two, but for the full 29 days, as this is written on the 29th. For most of these days the wind has blown day and night, ranging from fifteen to thirty miles an hour.

To, for the first time in our memory this month has passed without enough rain to register, except on one occasion, when a quarter of an inch fell in the Ropes territory. This applies to the Ropes territory and to the south—it has rained to the north.

Artesian wells have supplied the moisture for planting, but once the seed have been in the ground, along comes the wind, dried out the earth and only a portion of the seed have germinated. This past Monday, was perhaps, the most damaging day—the sand blew and covered crops just planted until they will have to be planted over. It came in on the growing crops and burned many of them to a crisp.

Mayor Charles Shannon told us, "I don't know how much damage there has been, but the wind of Monday killed both feed and cotton.

The wind started to blow again Tuesday, but by noon it had dropped to a mere whisper, and one man told us, "We may have rain following this west wind."

Most of the wind has been from the south and east, but it has now varied to the west.

It is now raining in other parts of the state where no rain had fallen this month, so it might be that it will rain here. On June 2, 1957, we had a whopper of a rain—and hail—maybe the breaking of the drought is just around the corner.

We read recently where a trained anesthetist was administering a controlled mixture of oxygen and anesthetic gas during a minor surgery. The tank of oxygen became exhausted and a new tank labeled "Oxygen" was substituted.

Almost immediately, according to the police report, the patient died. The attending surgeon and hospital officials suspected some kind of accident and called for the coroner. An autopsy revealed carbon dioxide poisoning. Upon investigation the "Oxygen" tank was found to contain carbon dioxide. The tank had been mislabeled before it reached the hospital. Everything that could be done was done to learn why such a mistake could happen.

Now the manufacturer was sincere, the hospital authorities were sincere, the anesthetist was sincere, the surgeon was sincere, and cer-

tainly the patient was sincere. All were sincerely mistaken about the "Oxygen". They were sincere in what they were doing but the patient died. This tragedy demonstrates that sincerity and thinking and feeling so is not enough to save one's life. The correct things must be used in saving the physical life and the TRUTH of God must be used in saving the souls of men. Solomon wrote, "There is a way which seemeth right unto a man, but the end thereof are the ways of death." Prov. 14-12. There are a lot of things in this life that "seem" to be all right but are wrong when compared to the gospel of Christ. We must search the scriptures for therein is the salvation of the soul. Far too many people are saying "Just so you are sincere in what you believe, you are all right. Sincerity is all that counts." Beloved, THINK on the above things. Being sincere without investigating helped kill the patient.
