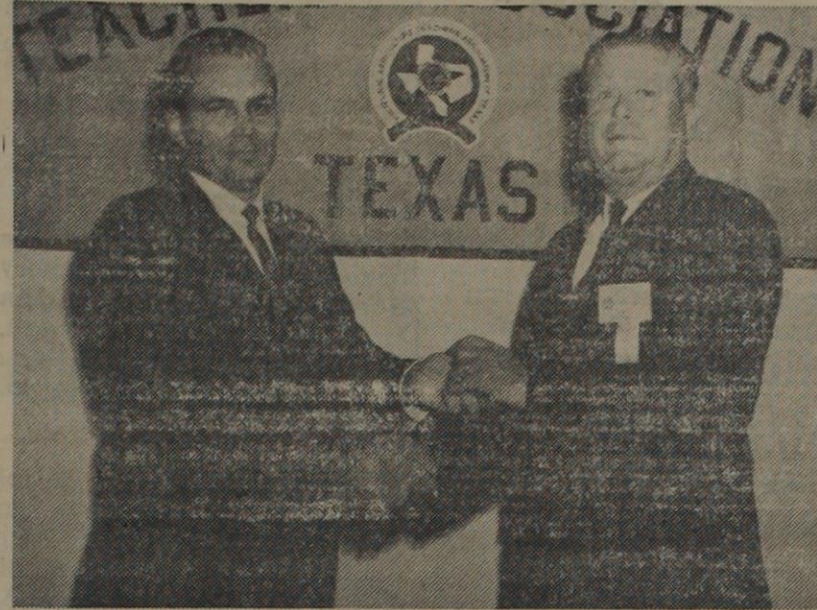

Lubbock .... An Appaloosa horse show has been carded as a special event of the 51st annual Panhandle South Plains Fair here Sept. 23-28.

### House Acts on Farm Bill

The House of Representatives recently approved a one-year extension of the present farm program. The major controversy on the bill came on an amendment to limit government payments to producers.

A report from Representative George Mahon advises that he spoke against and voted against the limitation of payments, but supported final passage of the bill in order to give the Senate-House Conference a chance to work out an acceptable bill.

The Senate, on July 20, had passed a four-year bill without limitations. Mahon said that by sending the House bill to conference with the Senate, he felt most hopeful that one-year extension without limitations would be worked out this year.

Following is a recipe sent us by Jewel Robinson, County Home Demonstration Agent.

- 100 cucumbers
- 3 onions
- 2 cups salt
- 4 cups sugar
- 1 cup olive oil
- 2 tablespoons peppercorns
- 4 tablespoons mustard seed
- 4 tablespoons celery seed
- 4 cups vinegar

Wash, dry and thinly slice cucumbers and peeled onions. Dissolve salt in 1 gallon cold water. Add cucumbers and onions. Let stand 12 to 18 hours. Drain. (Taste cucumbers; if too salty, rinse well in cold water.) Add sugar, spices, 1 cup water, to vinegar. Boil 1 minute. Add cucumbers, onions and oil. Simmer until cucumbers change color. Then bring to boiling. Pack, boiling hot, in hot jars. Seal at once.
