So our question becomes:
What is judgement? What does Jesus mean when He says, "Judge not."
First let us consider what not saying that we close our eyes to what people do. He is not saying that we must
withhold ou thoughts about what we consider to b e
wrong. He is not saying that we must back down whe ment.
It is a false concept
think that Jesus asks us to
shun the heavy task of with
holding our best reasoning our best judgment.

In order to discover wh stand the word "judgment" ment in the New Testamen is a Greek word (remember
the New Testament was writ ten in Greek) krises. Krises has two meanings set aside, to cut, and (2)
distinguish right from wrong Jesus's admonition in Mat ne another. Our judgment should neighbor. No act of ours should break the ties tha we could read Jesus's command in Matthew $7: 1$ thusly your neighbor."
