Long have we heard moralistic warnings against seeking pleasure for pleasures sake; and though we may be bored with the cliche, it still holds some valid truth. Pleasure is never really found when sought as an end within itself. Dr. Harvey Cox made the comment during the interview that the pursuit of self-gratification always turns to ashes in the long run. Indeed so!
