JNO. 8:32

We are hearing and reading of many storms, strong winds and tornados. One evening last week many went to the storm cellars as the possibility of a tornado was announced. You even think little of your friends and neighbors; you flee to safety. Now, let's make a spiritual application. Death, eternity and torment in a Devil's hell is approaching, very rapidly. We have the warnings in the Bible and out of it. "the Lord . . . is coming in flaming fire . . . rendering vengeance to them that know not God, and to them that obey not the gospel of our Lord Jesus: who shall suffer punishment, even eternal destruction from the face of the Lord and from the glory of his might." II Thess. 1:7-9. Your Bible teaches you that Jesus will save the church. Eph. 5:23; he adds the saved to the church, Acts 2:47 and that salvation is in Christ, II Tim. 2:10. In spite of this teaching in your Bible and many other passages that teach the same thing, many will

say, "You don't have to be a member of the Lord's church to be saved; you can be saved out of the church as well as in it. Will you reason like this when the tornado is coming your way? Your Bible teaches you that we are baptized into Christ, his body the church. Gal. 3:36-37; Rom. 6:3-4; I Cor. 12:13 and there is "one baptism" Eph. 4:4-6. The only way to get into Christ is to be baptized into Christ. With death, eternity and a devil's hell approaching, why will you argue and contend contrary to what your Bible teaches? 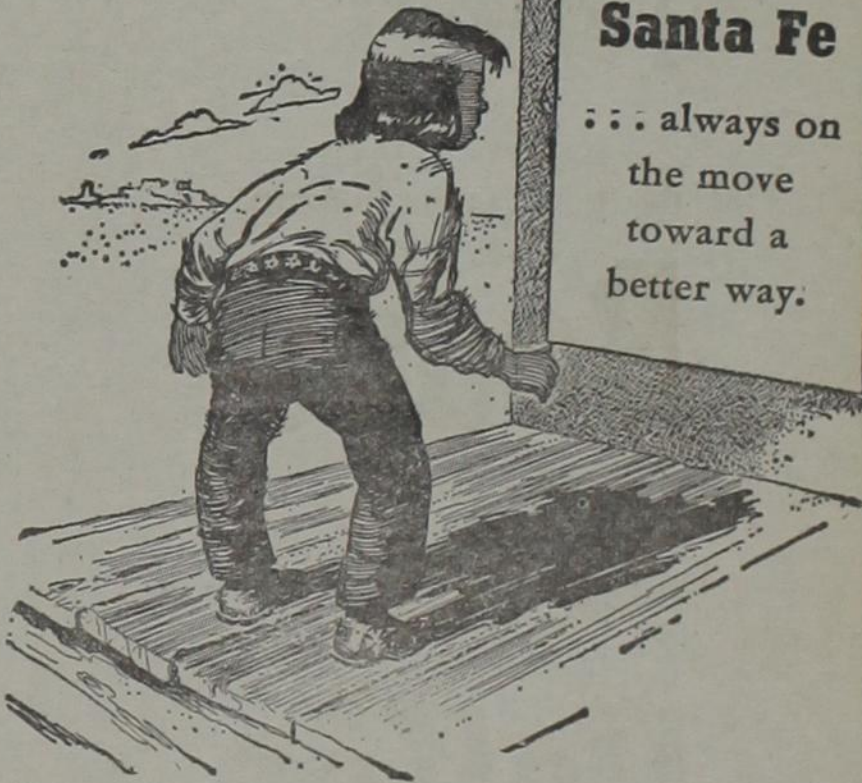
