Ropes and Whiteface battled each other in a crucial District g-B game Friday night on the home gridiron. When the final whistle blew, Ropes had won 28-22, almost entirely in the last half.

The large homecoming crowd shared a couple of very anxious quarters.

The scoring was fast and even in the first quarter, Ted Lowrie bombed a 30 yard pass to Larry Parchman to give the Eagles the first 6 points. Whiteface came right back and scored a touchdown with a three yard run.

Halftime score stood at 14 for the Antelopes, the Eagles trailing with six.

The beginning of the third quarter looked dismal for the home eleven as Whiteface stretched their lead to 22-6. However, this proved to be their last score while the Eagles were just beginning to score.

Ropes narrowed the score in the third quarter on a 30 yard Lowrie to Parchmas pass. Russel Arp added the extra two. The Eagles gave the fans a real thrill in the final period. David Bradshaw scored from the two, and Arp again added the extras. Then Arp took his turn at making the winning touchdown.

Ropes now has a 2-1 district record, and the win left them right up at the top of the District 5-B race, along with Meadow, Amherst and Sundown. Whiteface dropped to a 1-2, and are virtually out of the picture now.

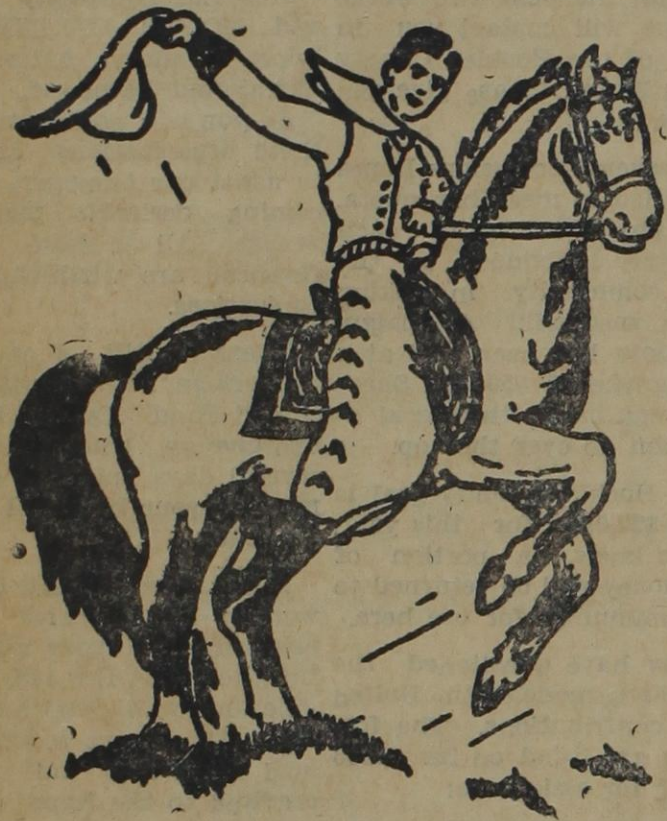

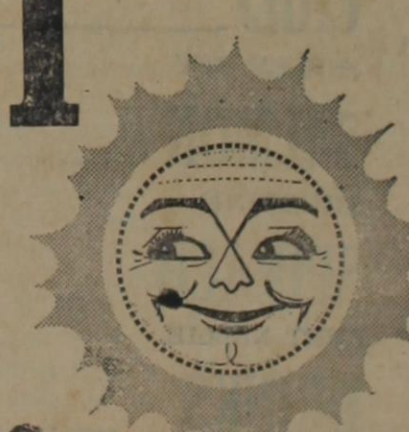

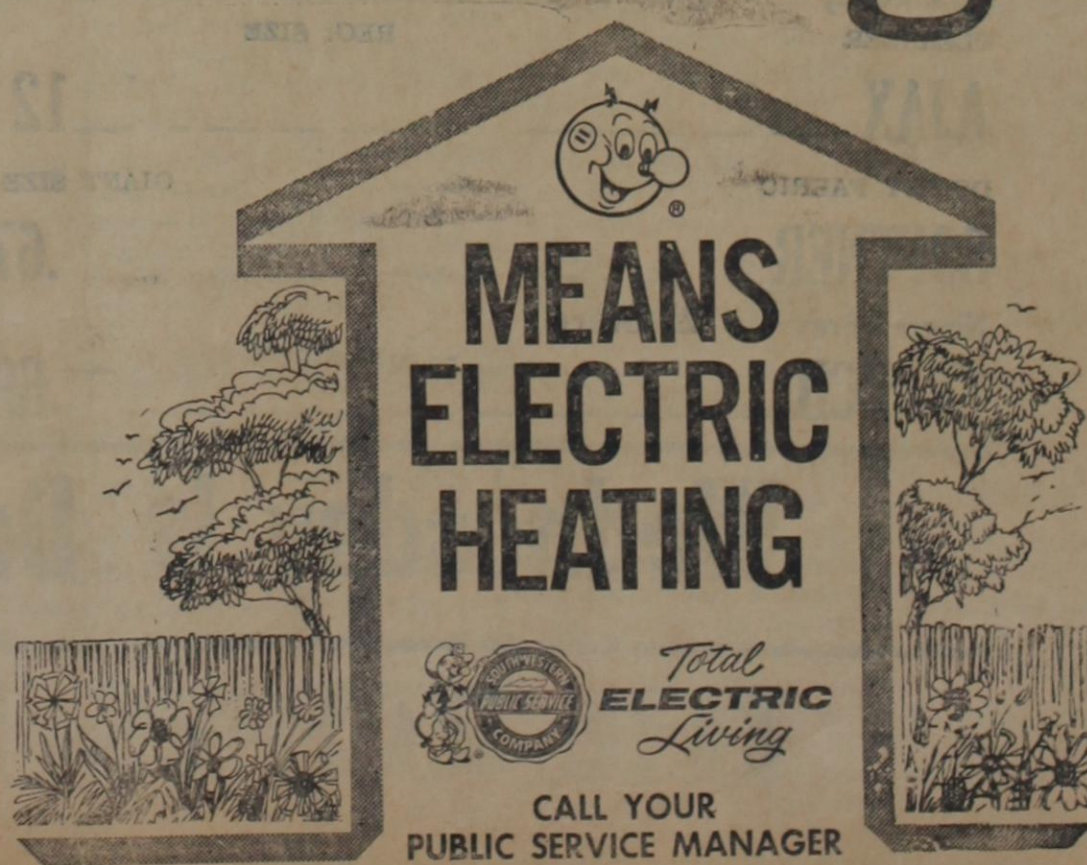
