Census Shows Big Growth

That the Ropes community is enjoying a healthy, steady growth is indicated by the increase in the scholastic census — this year's census shows an increase of 2; Lutheran, 1; Bible Church 33 over that of last year.

The census last year was religious preference. 690 whites and 31 Negroes; this year the census showed 714 whites and 50 Negroes.


