### ORDER AND NOTICE FOR INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT TRUSTEE ELECTION BY BOARD OF TRUSTEES

THE STATE OF TEXAS ) COUNTY OF HOCKLEY )  
On this the 3rd day of February, 1969, the Board of Trustees of Ropes Independent School District convened in Regular session, open to the public, with the following members present, to-wit:

H. Joe Schwartz, President  
Billy Odom, Crate Snider, C. P. Arnwine, Hollis Borland, C. E. Bradshaw  
constituting a quorum, and among other proceedings had by said Board of Trustees was the following:

WHEREAS this school district has fewer than 500 scholars and is subject to the terms and provisions of Article 2746a; and

WHEREAS on the first Saturday in April, 1969, being April 5, 1969, a trustee election will be held in said School District for the purpose of electing two (2) members to the Board of Trustees of said School District,

THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF ROPES INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT:

That an election be held in said School District on April 5, 1969, for the purpose of electing two (2) members to the Board of Trustees of said District.

That all requests by candidates to have their names placed upon the ballot for the above mentioned election shall be in writing and filed with the County Judge of the county in which this district is located not later than 30 days prior to date of said election.

That said election shall be held at the following place and the following named persons are hereby appointed officers for said election.

At Ropes High School Library Building, in Ropesville, Texas, in said School District with Everett Wallace as Presiding Judge and Anna Green and Kathleen Armstrong Clerks.

Ruth Braden is hereby appointed Clerk for absentee voting. The absentee voting for the above designated election shall be held at Ropes School Tax Office within the boundaries of the above named District and said place of absentee voting shall remain open for at least eight hours on each day for absentee voting which is not a Saturday, a Sunday, or an official State holiday, beginning on the 20th day and continuing through the 4th day preceeding the date of said election. Said place of voting shall remain open between the hours of 8:30 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. on each day for said absentee voting. The above described place for absentee voting is also the absentee clerk's mailing address to which ballot applications and ballots voted by mail may be sent.

The manner of holding said election shall be governed as near as may be by the Election Code of this state, and the County Judge shall furnish, at the expense of this School District, all necessary ballots and other election supplies requisite to said election.

Immediately after said election has been held, the officers holding the same shall make returns of the results thereof to the County Judge

and return the ballot boxes and other supplies of said election to the County Judge for safekeeping, and the Commissioners' Court shall canvass the returns of said election and notify the candidates and this Board of Trustees of the results thereof.

A copy of this order shall serve as notice of said election and be posted in three different places in said School District, which posting shall be done not less than 20 days prior to the date for said election. The Secretary of this Board of Trustees shall also cause a notice by publication of this election to be published one time in a newspaper of general circulation in the county where this school district is located, which publication shall be not more than 30 days nor less than 10 days before said election.

The above order being read, it was moved and seconded that same do pass. Thereupon, the question being called for, the following members of the Board voted AYE: H. Joe Schwartz, Billy Odom, Crate Snider, C. P. Arnwine, Hollis Borland, C. E. Bradshaw, and the following voted NO: None.


