"Ye shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free"

Jno. 8:32
The apostle Paul asked the church in Corinth, "Is Christ divided?", I Cor. 1:13. He asked this question to impress a fundamental lesson of great importance. He was trying to show how wrong it was for brethren to divide the church of the Lord.

Paul had heard of the contentions and divisions that existed among members of the church in Corinth. I Cor. 1:11; 3:3. The Corinthians went so far as to select men to be their leaders without the consent of the men selected. One said, "I am of Paul; and another, I am of Apollos" 3:5. Another, "I of Cephas" and another, "I of Christ" 1:12. If it had been approved of the Lord for His body to be

divided up into various groups, each looking to a human head it would have been given approval here by Paul. Certainly no better men could have been selected to head the different groups. The apostle knew this was in answer to the Lord's prayer in Jno. 17 so he wrote, "Now I beseech you, brethren, by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that ye all speak the same thing, and that there be no divisions among you; but that ye be perfectly joined together in the same mind and in the same judgment" I Cor. 1:10. "No divisions", being "perfectly joined together", "speaking the same thing", having "the same mind" and being of "the same judgment" may seem unworkable to some today yet it is the Lord's will that we all be one. Jno. 17:20-21. THINK on these things.
