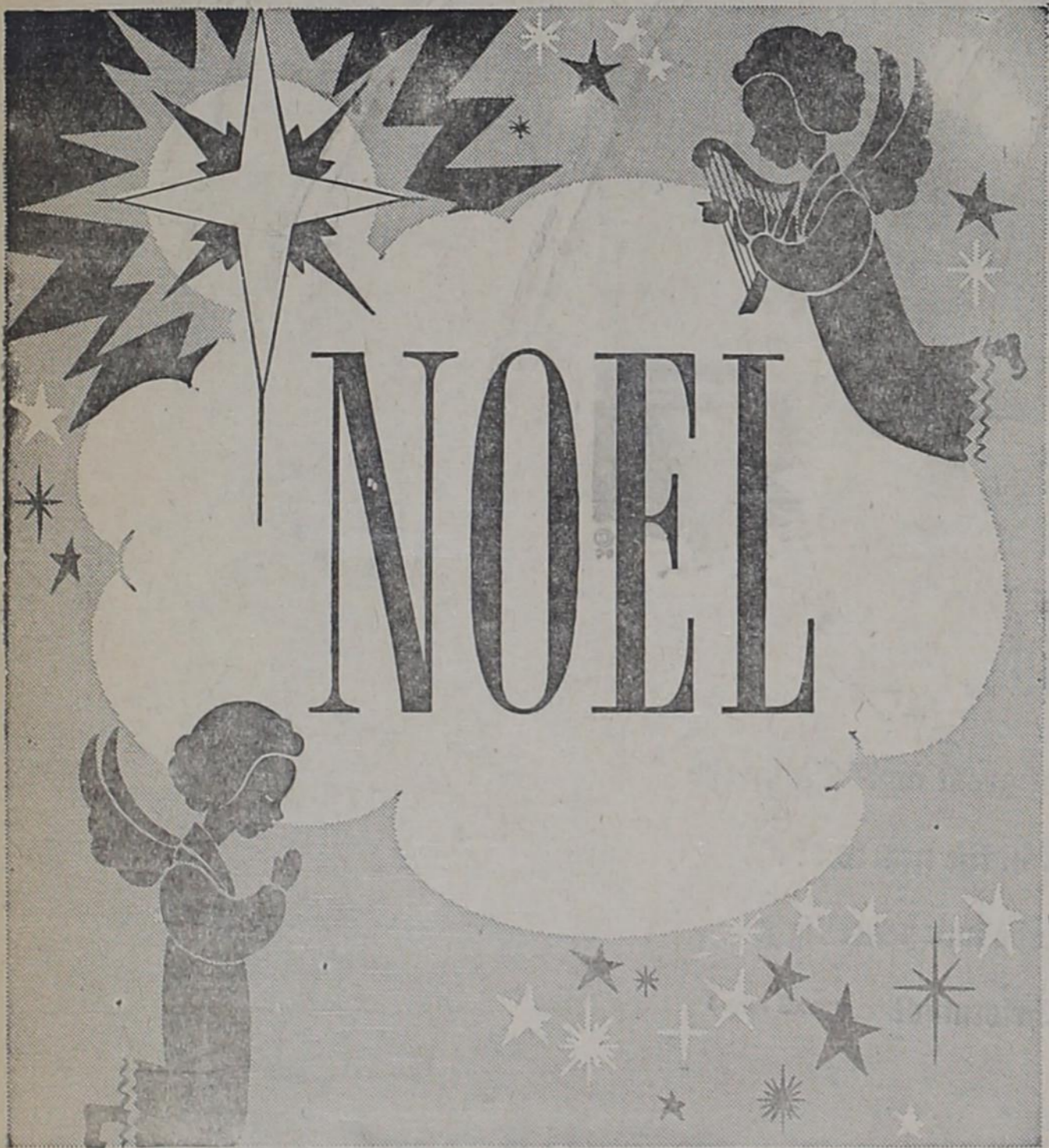

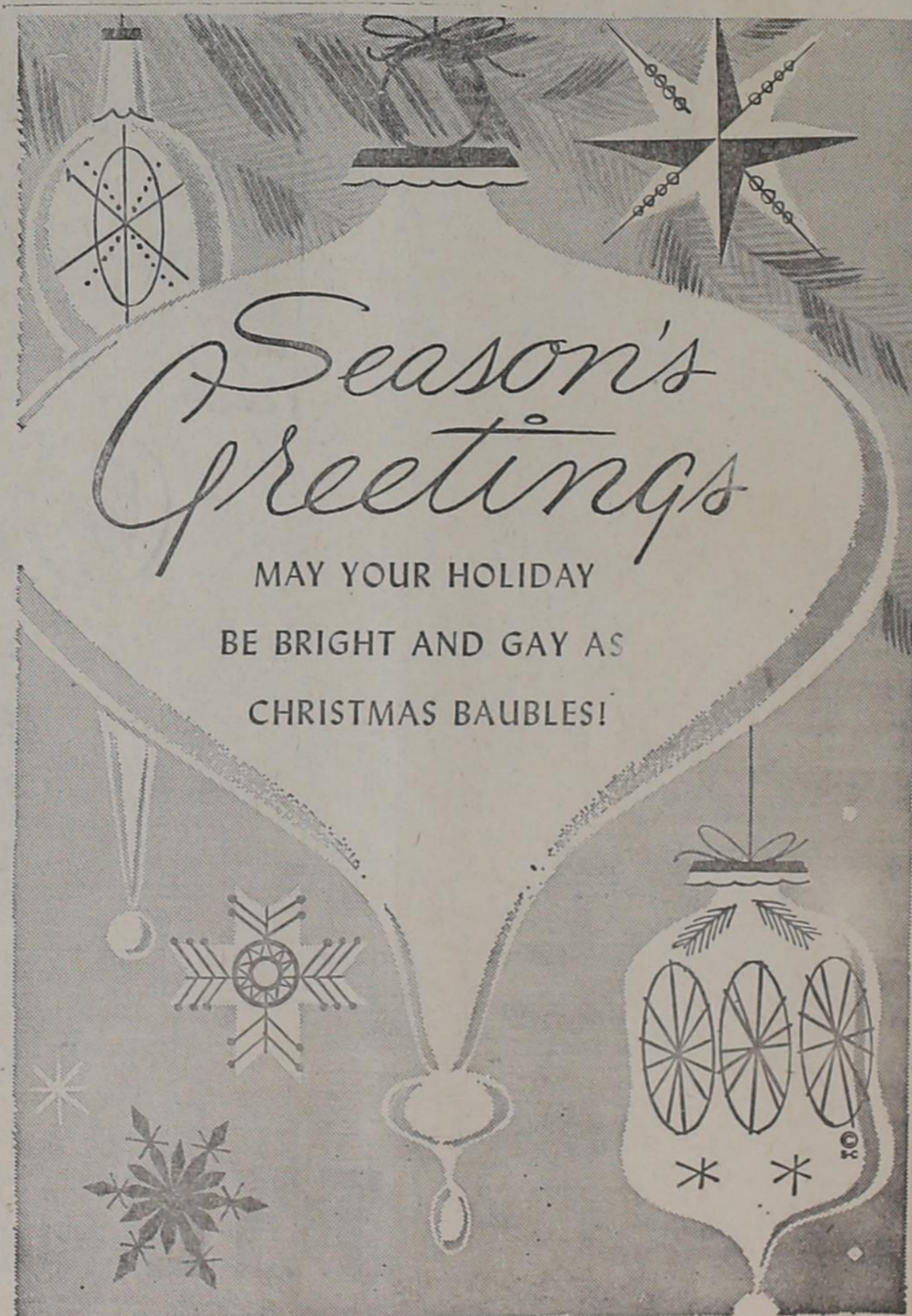

THE MIRACLE BOOK

The Bible, God's great "Miracle Book", is still the Word of the Lord that liveth and abideth forever. As Robert G. Lee has said, "All the enemies of yesteryears and nowadays have not extinguished one spark of its holy fire, nor diluted one drop of its honey, nor torn one hole in its beautiful vesture, nor broken one string on its thousand-string harp, nor weakened its vitality by one pulse beat, nor shortened its march of triumph by one step. Today the Bible walks more bypaths and travels more highways and knocks at more doors and speaks to more people in their mother tongue than any other book this world has ever known, or ever will know."

It continues to be the world's Best Seller and last

year there were more copies circulated throughout the world than ever before. The Missionary Research Library that is maintained by the National Council of Churches reported that 26,379,142 copies of the Scriptures were put in circulation. This included whole Bibles, Old Testaments, New Testaments, and other Portions. The figure was almost a million higher than the circulation for 1955.

If these figures are correct they mean that over half the Scriptures that were put in men's hands last year were produced by the American Bible Society. The remainder were produced by the Gideons, Pocket Testament League, Bible societies of other lands, private Bible publishers, etc.

Since 1816 the American Bible Society has been pub-

lishing God's Word without comment in many different languages. Last year alone it distributed 1,007,560 Bibles, 1,681,115 New Testaments, and 12,481,383 Gospels and other Portions, a total of 15,170,058 Scriptures. Nearly half of these went to sixty foreign lands. The printing was done in 193 different tongues.

The Bible appears in new languages each year, thanks to the Bible societies. It is now printed in 1109 tongues.

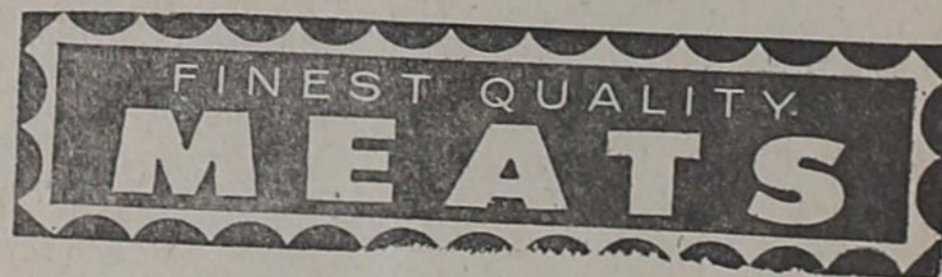

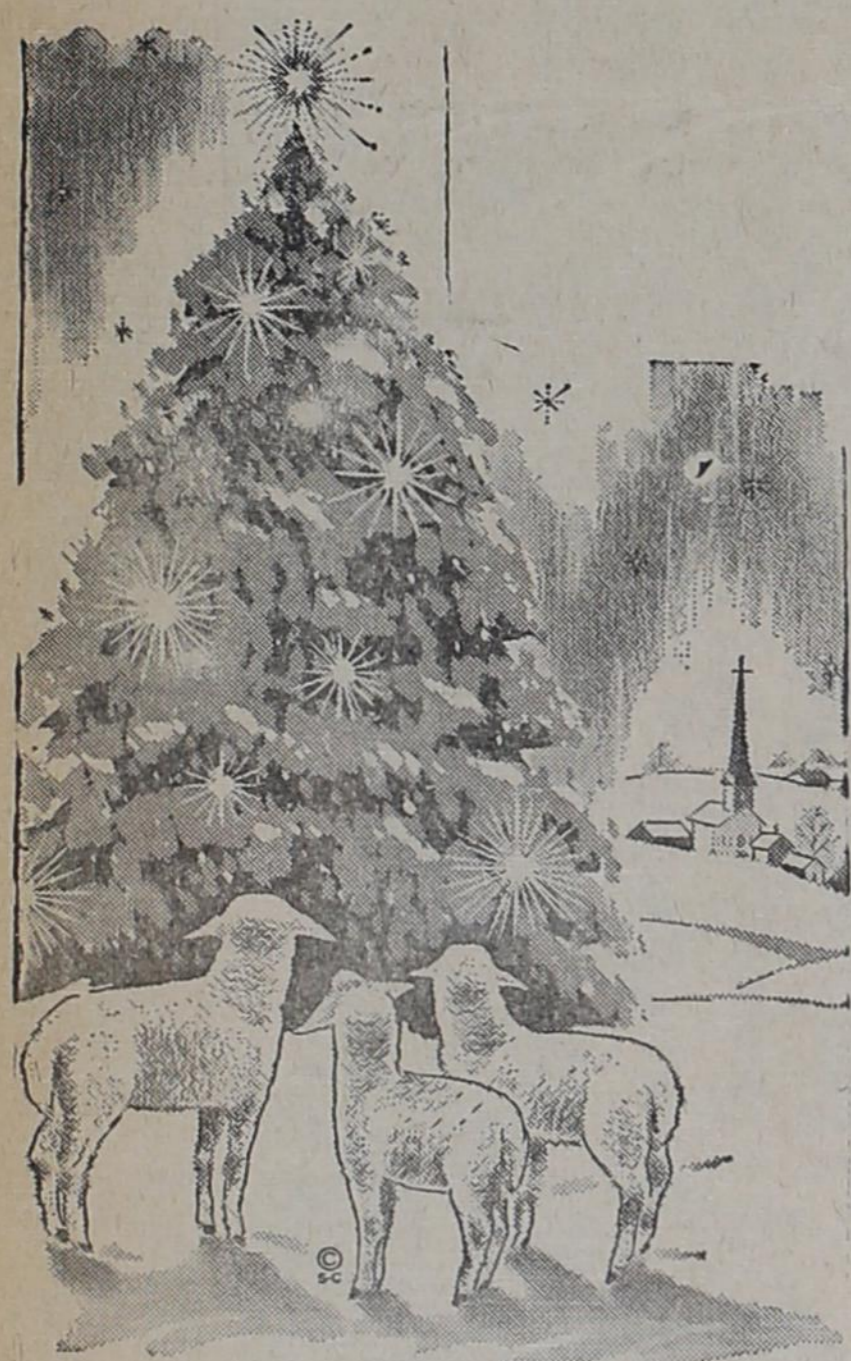

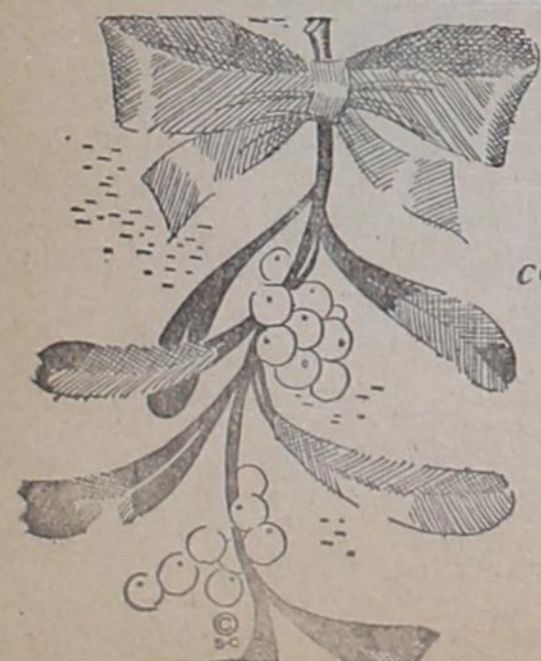

185,132 Bales Ginned in County

Ropes Territory Breaks Harvest Record With 40,000 Bales Ginned

As the harvest of the largest cotton crop ever harvested in the Ropes territory comes to a close reports from seven gins, Paymaster, Farmers Coop, Lockettville,

Weeks, Buster's, Center and Farm Center, show by actual tabulation that 35,285 bales of cotton have been ginned in the Ropes trade territory.

This does not include Loyd's Gin, northwest of Ropes, which could not be reached by telephone. It is estimated that this gin has turned out at least 5,000

bales, which would throw the crop gathered in this territory this year more than 40,000 bales, or approximately 10,000 bales above any crop heretofore gathered.

Of course, there is yet some cotton to come in, but most of the fields are bare, strippers being used to gather the "second" picking, and due to lack of hands, in

some instances, strippers were used to gather the entire crop.

It is stated that spots gathered as much as two bales to the acre, while a bale to the acre was not out of the ordinary.

A report from Bill Taylor, the county agent, states that there is approximately 190,000 acres planted to cotton in Hockley County and that the harvest, up to Wednesday, is more than 187,132 which is an average of more than a bale to the acre. It is estimated that 10,000 bales were lost to hail. This is the largest yield in the history of the county except in 1949 when the entire county was planted to cotton and 202,000 bales harvested.

This has been what is known as a seasonable year when a lot of the dry land produced as many pounds to the acre as irrigated land. As a matter of fact, irrigation was cut to a minimum and the crop was raised and matured on the natural rain fall which was above average in most parts of the county.

According to the above figures approximately 25 per cent of the cotton crop in the county will have been produced in the Ropes territory.

Mr. Taylor pointed out that while some of our cotton came from adjoining counties, on the whole we lost as much to neighboring counties as we gained.

Some forty years ago an old times in this section told us, "If we had irrigation the South Plains would bloom as the Garden of Paradise." Seemingly, with little or no irrigation, this year, the South Plains has proven that it has the richest and most productive soil in the nation.
