That is so, we believe, with the other gins who bring in labor to gather the crops. <br> At the present time the estimation of the cotton crop for Texas runs well over four million bales, while in the South Plains area the largest estimate in several years has been released. Barring a calamity some sort, the Ropes community will run more cotton through its gins this fall than, perhaps, any time in its history. |
