We've kept quiet so long we don't know whether we know how to talk or not.

The most recent feud in Hockley County is taking place in the Commissioners Court where a recent order was passed to divide the road and bridge funds according to the mileage of roads in a precinct. Smokey Janes of Sundown, commissioner of Precinct 2, is yelling to high heaven he is being robbed, as he has the least number of miles of roads in the county, yet he has been receiving the same amount of money to keep them up as the other precincts who have the greater mileage.

Right now Smokey is threatening an injunction against the other commissioners and a law suit to see they do not take away any of his funds.

The other commissioners point out they are justified in making the division—that it is legal—and is practiced by other counties in this neck of the woods. They also declare that such a step is for the betterment of the county, and will give improvements to roads where farmers have to haul their produce to market—they accuse Smokey of being a precinct commissioner and not a county commissioner.

Personally, we don't know a great deal about roads and their upkeep, but as one citizen told us, "It is a healthy condition when the commissioners are fighting—it shows they are trying to do something. Letting one or two men run the court is unhealthy."

There may be something in that—it assures you it is not a rubber stamp court. Maybe if they get to feuding enough there are one or two other things they will straighten out that have been needing it for some time.

A county that is under the rule of one or two men is more or less a dictatorship and the people suffer—and the people will suffer just so long, then they make things take place—such as making changes in office.

Yes, There is Meeting At First Baptist Church

This is an apology and explanation brought about by the fact we did not mention in last week's paper the revival meeting in progress at the Ropes First Baptist Church. The fact that no mention was made whatever was due to a set of circumstances over which we had no control.

To start with the minister of the Church of Christ brought in information about the evangelist at his church and was soon followed by the pastor of the Church of the Nazarene with a sketch about the evangelist to be at their church.

In using these articles we decided we needed something about the evangelist at the Baptist Church. From ten o'clock in the morning until four o'clock in the afternoon we made eight phone calls to the Baptist Church but no one answered.

At this point we laid the article aside and thought we would call later. At four o'clock we had to leave the office and did not return until six. When we returned the paper was on the press ready to be printed. We never once thought of the piece we were to write about the Baptist revival and we did not discover we had nothing in the paper about the meeting until the next morning when the paper was already printed and mailed.

We deeply regret the article was omitted but the inference that it was done purposely is preposterous. During the twenty-five years we have been in the newspaper business in Ropes, our first concern has been for churches and the school news—no pastor has ever come to Ropes that he was not invited to

use the Plainsman freely. On top of that we call the pastors regularly for news of their congregation. There are times we cannot reach them by phone, but we try.

As to display advertising given us by churches it is charged for at the same rate we charge other advertisers—we run no church display ads free. The two ads run by the Church of Christ last week in the Plainsman were charged at our regular rate. Advertising is the way we make a living—and we do appreciate the business. However, our news columns are run without cost and we are glad to get church news. All the churches, regardless of belief, are welcome in the Plainsman.

Our personal belief is our business, but as a newspaper the Plainsman has no special belief—we try to treat all denominations with fairness, and a check of our files over the years will show we have played no favorites. And we will play no favorites in the future.

Naturally, we can understand the feeling of the Baptist pastor when he found his meeting was not mentioned and the other two meetings were on the front page, and it is with regret we learned on Thursday morning no mention was made of the meeting.

Evangelist Dr. Thurman Bryant is bringing the messages, and the meeting closes Sunday night.

We think we make more mistakes than anyone, and when we make one it is usually a bad one—as in this instance.

And now, we'll crawl back under our rock.

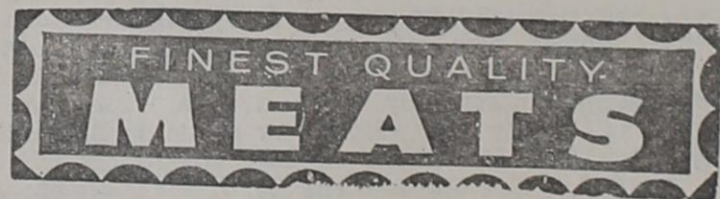

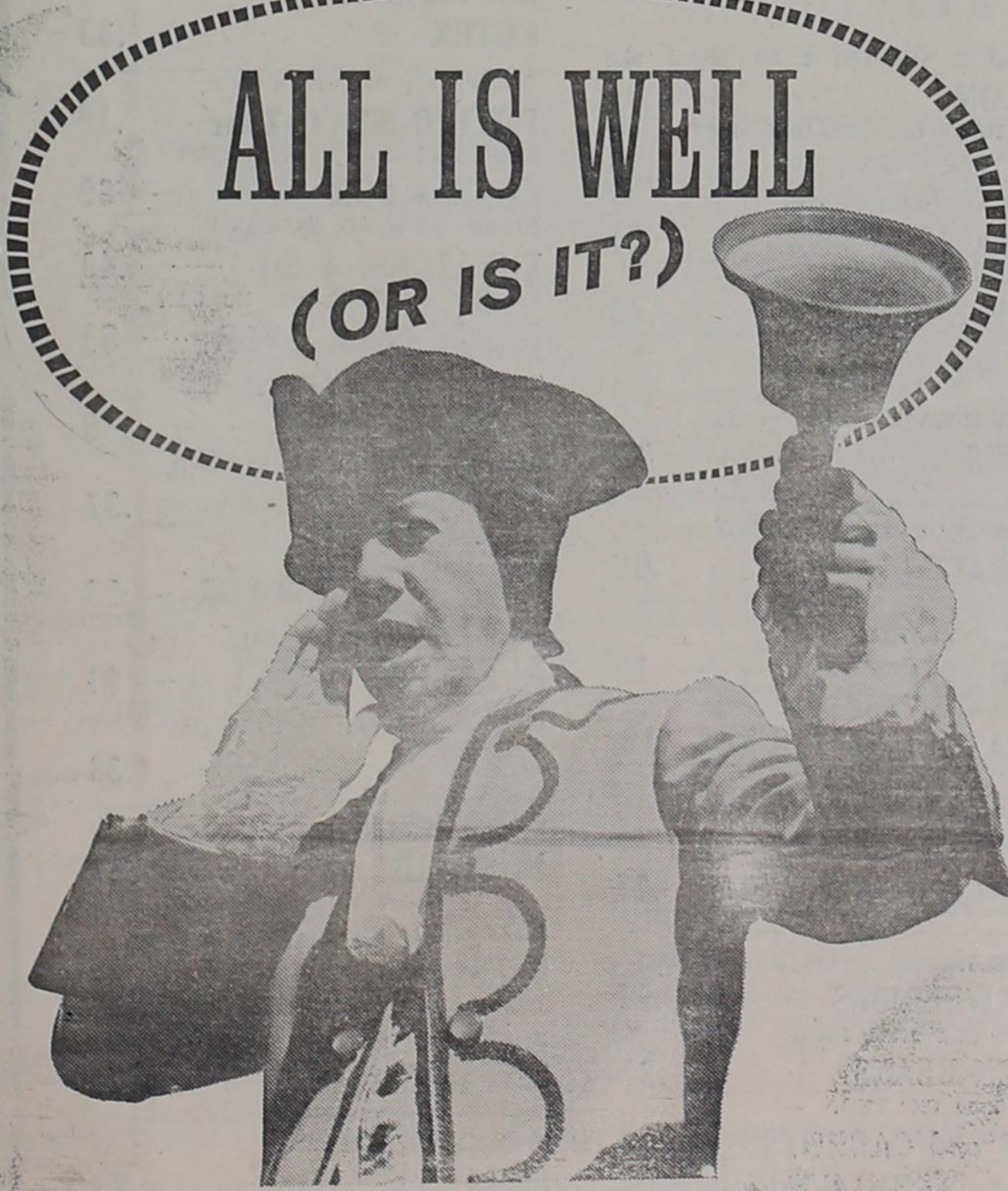

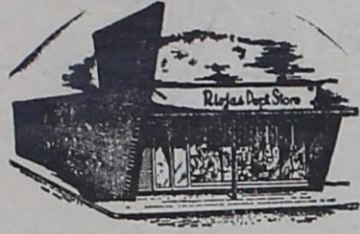
