Mother Shipton's Prophecy

MOTHER SHIPTON'S PROPHECY

(Mother Shipton was born in Yorkshire, England in July, 1488 and died about 1559. In books of information, she is described as a half-mythical prophetess, baptized Ursula Shipton, who later married Ursula Shipton, according to

the tradition, she was a child of Agatha Shipton and the Devil. The following extracts from her amazing prophecies lately taken from a scrapbook reputedly owned by a Rochester woman.)

Carriages without horses shall go,
Disaster fill the world with woe;

In London, Primrose Hill shall be

Its center hold a bishop's see.*

Around the world, men's thoughts shall fly

Quick as the twinkling of an eye.

And waters shall great wonders do —

How strange! Yet it shall come true.

That upside down the world shall be,

And gold be found at the foot of a tree.

Through towering hills men shall ride.

Nor horse nor ass move by their side.

Beneath the waters men shall walk,

Shall ride, sleep, and ever talk.

And in the air shall be seen, In white, in black, as well as green.

A great man shall come and go,
For prophecy declares it so.

In water iron then shall float

As easy as a wooden boat.

Gold shall be found in stream and stone.

In lands that are as yet unknown.

Water and fire shall wonders do.

And England shall admit a Jew.**

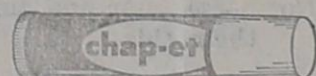
