Mr. and Mrs. Abb Russell, and Mr. and Mrs. P. L. Byrd left their homes June 25th for a trip which took them through several states.

Mrs. Russell reports, "Our first stop was at the Royal Gorge in Colorado which we took in, then on to Seven Falls at Colorado Springs. We visited the zoo and other places there, then on up in the Teton Mountains and Jackson Hole Lake. The temperature got down to 35 degrees and snowing.

We went to Yellowstone Park by West Thumb entrance. We stayed one night at Canyon Junction. The temperature was 24 degrees that night, and snowing. We continued on up to Mammoth Hat Springs where we went through a museum that was very interesting. We also visited a museum at Custer, South Dakota.

We went to Missoula, Mont., and Helena where we looked at the Capitol and went through another museum and saw lots there on states' boys paintings (Charles Russell). Then we went through the Lewis & Clark National Park to Billings, Mont., and spent two nights with an uncle and aunt, and did a little more sight-seeing there. We came back through the Black Hills of South Dakota, spending one night at Spearfish where we went to the Passion Play. But we didn't get to see it all because of rain. What we did see was very beautiful. We also saw Spearfish Canyon.

From there we went on to Lead and Deadwood, visiting a museum at Deadwood that had more in it than most museums. We then saw Mt. Rushmore and saw the four presidents' faces carved. It is a beautiful work of art. We saw many interesting things along the way.

We then headed for home. We saw quite a bit of cutting and baling hay, some wheat being combined. The driest place seemed to be in Colorado. We arrived home between 8 and 9 p.m. Friday, July 12th.

STATE TEXAS AMATEUR ATHLETIC FEDERATION MEN AND WOMEN'S TRACK MEET

The Texas Amateur Athletic Federation State Track Meet for men and women will be held in Lubbock July 20, 1963 at the Monterey High School Track. There will be four age divisions: 11 and under for boys and girls; 12 and 13 boys and girls; 14 and 15 boys and girls; 16 and over boys and girls. Events will be conducted for collegians if there are any interested in participating. The events are: Boys 11 and under: 50 yard dash, 75 yard dash, 8-man 440 relay, high jump, and broad jump; Boys 12 and 13: 75 yard dash, 100 yard dash, 440 yard relay, high jump, and broad jump; Boys 14 and 15: 100 yard dash, 440 yard dash, 880 yard run, 70 yard high hurdles, 120 yard low hurdles, high jump, broad jump, 8 lb. shot, and junior discus; Senior Boys: University Interscholastic League Events; Collegians: depending on entries; Girls 11 and under, 12 and 13, 14 and 15: 50 yard dash, 75 yard dash, 220 yard relay, high jump and broad jump; Senior Girls: 100 yard dash, 440 yard dash, 880 yard run, 120 yard low hurdles, 440 yard relay, high jump and broad jump.

Awards will be in the form of medals for the first three places and trophies to the winning team in each division. There will not be an entry fee and the only requirement for participation is a card in the T.A.A.F. which may be purchased from the local Recreation Department, or at the meet in Lubbock.

Preliminaries will begin at 10:00 A.M. for the younger boys and girls with the finals following that morning. The older classes will begin at 3:00 P.M. with the finals scheduled for 7:00 P.M.

Entries are expected from all over the State and several Southwest Conference schools.

Buford can be termed an early settler, since he came to Hockley County in 1926. He pointed out that farming in this country, until irrigation wells were drilled, was a big gamble, with the farmer on the losing end. The first year a big sandstorm blew the cotton out of the bolls and scattered it all over the fields. That was on Thanksgiving Day.

After the big wind passed they took rakes and pitchforks and tried to salvage the cotton, but getting the dirt out was an impossibility—the crop was a total loss.

The next year the worms ate the crops. When they finally did make a crop the depression hit and cotton sold for five cents a pound, or less than it cost to produce it. He stated that before irrigation you saved about one crop in five.

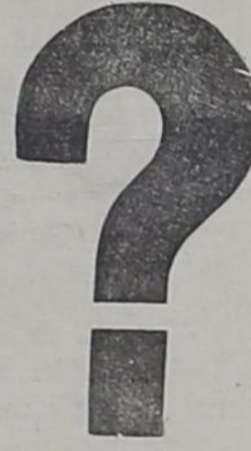
