In the race for governor of the state John Connally was chosen as the Democratic candidate, and Preston Smith of Lubbock was chosen as Lt. Governor, while Waggoner Carr, also of Lubbock, was top man for Attorney General.

To say the least, but a token vote was cast in the county and the state — one hundred and fifty, out of a possible five hundred, voted in the Ropes box. The county, as a whole, cast less than three thousand votes out of a possible six thousand.

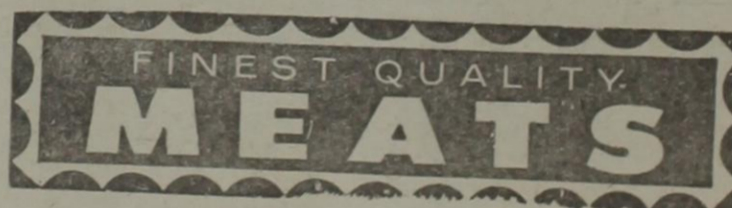
