PUELIC NOTICE roposed CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT NUMBER SIX ON THE BALLOT (SJR24)

LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: Section 1. Article 8, Consti-ntion of the State of Texas, s amended by adding a Sec-Section 1. Article 8, Consti-tution of the State of Texas,

is amended by adding a Sec-tion 2-a to read as follows: "Section 2-a. (a) The Legis-lature may, by General Law, exempt from ad valorem tax-ation by the state and its po-litical subdivisions all as a litical subdivisions all or a portion of any equipment, device or improvement installed or constructed on real property, which is designed to eliminate or abate the harmful effect of air emissions or water effluents on the air and water quality in this state, to the extent that the capital investment in such property is made to comply with or to exceed air or water quality standards established by law.

"(b) Legislation which may be enacted in anticipation of the adoption of this Section is not void because of its anticipatory nature."

Sec. 2. The foregoing Constitutional Amendment shall be submitted to a vote of the qualified electors of this state at an election to be held on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November

Legislature to exempt from ad valorem taxation by the State of Texas and its political subdivisions equipment installed on real property to eliminate or abate the harmful effect of air emissions and water efflu-ents, provided that the czpital investment in such equipment complies with the air and water quality stan-dards established by the State of Texas."

"AGAINST the Constitutional Amendment giving permissive authority to the Texas Legislature to exempt from ad valorém taxation by the State of Texas and its political subdivisions equip-ment installed on real property to eliminate or abate the harmful effect of air emissions and water effluents, provided that the capital investment in such equipment complies with the air and water quality standards established by the State of Texas."




